Blood Saved His Life, so Local Man Continues to Donate to Blood Bank

Unless something unusual happens to Frank Mogensen, 210 Jefferson street, between now and Monday, the "Red" Cross blood drive to be held at the American Legion hall is assured of receiving one pint of its 150-pint quota from Twin Falls area.

Mogensen, a state patrolman stationed at the Hollister post of entry, once lived on donated blood for almost two weeks in a New Guinea hospital after having received a head injury in the Philippines. That was in December, 1944, and even before that, Mogensen learned how blood can help an injured person.

Mogensen thinks that perhaps part of the complacent attitude toward giving blood is due to ill feelings about the Red Cross some servicemen—acquired during the recent war. He doesn't think it reasonable for such grudge against the organization to be carried so many years later. The ex-serviceman says he cer-

tainly never had any incidents in the service to "sour me on the Red Cross."

He states that his wife and mother visited him while he was in a hospital in California and the Red Cross provided everything for them, during their six-year stay there. He notes several other instances when the Red Cross has come to his aid during his various stays in military and veterans hospitals.

Mogensen asks of those ex-servicemen who do carry ill feelings toward the Red Cross, "What have

you done since getting out of the service to improve the organization?"

He has been active in Red Cross bloodmobile drives. At the Legion hall the present time, the patrolman is instructing his fifth class in first-aid classes as chairman. 

Titan Missiles at Mountain Home to Be Housed in Deep Pits Underground

WASHINGTON, March 20 (AP)—The intercontinental ballistic missile complex to be built at the Mountain Home Air Force Base will house advanced air force missiles in deep nearly-hemispherical, underground installations.

Cases of the base will run high. The Titans alone are estimated to cost 100 million dollars. Concrete for the bases is expected and cost 45 million dollars, the Pentagon estimates. Complex equipment for launching and guidance will run fifty million more.

No official cost estimate has been released, but the figure could reach more than 200 million dollars, including thermocouple warheads.

The Titan, to be based at Mountain Home, is the most advanced U.S. missile yet fired. Its first base is under construction at Lowry Air Force Base, Denver. Another air force base, at Ellsworth Air Force Base, Rapid City, S. D., in addition to the Titan, all in the northwest corner of the U.S. The Atlas is a slightly less highly developed predecessor of the Titan.

Only two Titans have been fired so far. Both were short-range tests launched from Cape Canaveral, Fla. Two missiles delivered the ball during from December to January.
