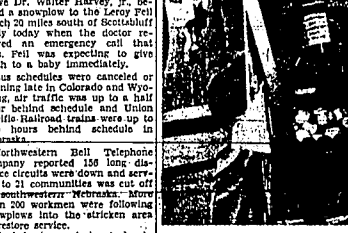

English Refuse To Let London Fight Patterson

LONDON, March 26 (AP)—Britain's boxing officials Wednesday refused Brian Brannan's request that Patterson be the heavy weight title fight for the year.

"I'd be glad to turn it down," said the former British heavyweight champion. He has been guaranteed \$15,000 more than he has made in his entire career — to tangle with Patterson, the world champion, at Las Vegas, Nev., April 21.

At a special meeting here, the British board of boxing control declined to issue a permit to London, declaring it was not in the best interest of the sport for him to fight Patterson, a top bookmaker's favorite.

The president of the U. S. National Boxing Association indicated approval of the fight.

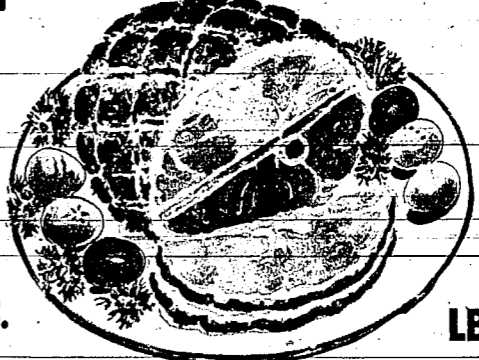

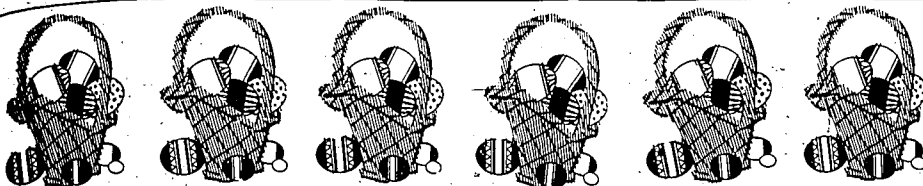



Library Gets Long List of New Volumes

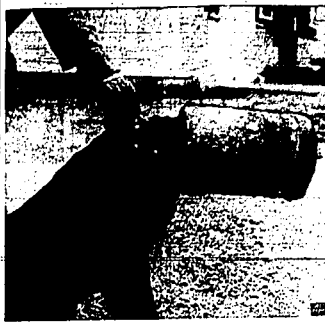

Future U.S. Space Rockets Described; Size Increased

NEW YORK, March 25 (AP)—Future U.S. space rockets, described yesterday in a leading rocket journal, Nova, the most powerful of the two, will weigh some 2,200 tons, reported Astronautics Journal of the American Rocket Society.

The five stages of Nova would churn up a total of 7,600,000 pounds of thrust, compared to only 370,000 for the intercontinental ballistic missile. Atlas, Saturn, called Juno V by the U.S. Army, will use eight current engines clustered in a first stage to turn out 1,200,000 pounds of thrust, the April issue of the journal said.

The second stage of Saturn would use the large engine from the Titan intercontinental ballistic missile. It creates 300,000 pounds of thrust. Smaller engines make up the latter two stages.

Nova's first stage is a cluster of four engines turning out a total of six million pounds of thrust. A single engine makes up the second stage of 1 1/2 million pounds of thrust. Smaller engines make up the later stages.

Both of these mammoth space vehicles are reportedly part of a ten-billion-dollar rocket program forecast by T. Keith Glennan, director of the national space and aeronautics administration.
