Police Chief Quits Job on Gaming Raid

PIERMONT, N. Y., March 27 (AP)—The police chief of this Hudson river town resigned yesterday after the seizure of 40 well-heeled men in a state and county raiders in a gambling parlor.

Police Chief John P. Smith, who was notified of the raid in advance, quit after being questioned by officials of the state commission of investigation. He was supposed to testify before a commission Tuesday.

The raiders arrested before the raid in a former coal company office that had been "fixed" to "quit" comfortably. The raiders had some men carrying \$2,000 each in cash, Cadillac and a Rolls Royce.

They were served steaks and chops from portable stoves. While some men were handcuffed, others were in easy chairs.

The 40 men, all from New York and New Jersey, were rounded up and taken to the Pierrmont Police station John O'Neil.

Thirty-six were fined from \$150 to \$250 on charges of gambling or carrying cash.

Four were placed under lock and key for 30 days. The amount is about 20 miles north of Times Square.

None of those nabbed were known to be prominent in the underworld.

350-Pint Blood Bank Refrigerator Is Memorial at Hospital to Late Doctor

A 350-pint capacity blood bank refrigerator, presented to Magic Valley Memorial hospital to keep adequate supplies of blood in storage, is equipped with an alarm system that alerts hospital personnel when the temperature in the refrigerator rises or falls, the machine is manufactured by the Jewett Refrigerator company, Inc., Buffalo, N. Y.

A measuring device on the refrigerator records the temperatures maintained within the machine. Hospital officials explain that, if the refrigerator were to stop running because of a power failure or other trouble, the temperature records could enable a pathologist to gauge the extent to which the stored blood was damaged by any temperature fluctuation and decide whether it was safe to use the blood or if the entire stock should be disposed of.

Mrs. Oldham viewed the machine Thursday afternoon with John Breckenridge, chairman of the hospital board's building and grounds committee, and Mrs. Irene Oliver, hospital administrator.

Mrs. Oldham is now in use in the hospital laboratory.

Funds for the \$750 refrigerator were donated in memory of Dr. Oldham, who died March 6, 1958, in the LDS hospital, Salt Lake City, by colleagues and other friends in Magic Valley and Idaho and other states.

The new refrigerator replaces an older machine that had been in use at the hospital for several years. Approximately 1,150 transfusions are given yearly at the hospital, making it necessary for the hospital to have a ready supply of blood.

Bonneville's Rate Studied

PORTLAND, Ore., March 27 (AP)—Bonneville power administration's annual report issued yesterday said the deadline is approaching for a decision on possible power rate increases.

As first under the administration, the marketing agent for federally produced Columbia river power, says money for the district...

This was announced last November and even greater losses were forecast for the next two years if the rate of \$17.50 per kilowatt year stays unchanged.

Administrator William A. Peck said a decision has to be made before July 1 if rate alterations are to be made by Dec. 31, the adjustment date in Bonneville contracts.

This does not necessarily mean there will be an increase. Since the first Columbia river power was produced 20 years ago the wholesale rate has not changed.

There are pressures to maintain this despite a loss of \$240,000,000 last year on a gross of \$40,750,110, and forecast of losses of \$14 million this fiscal year and \$6 million next.

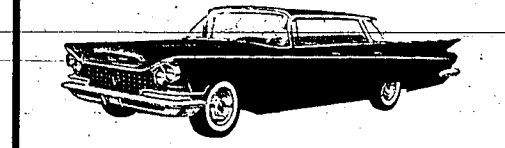

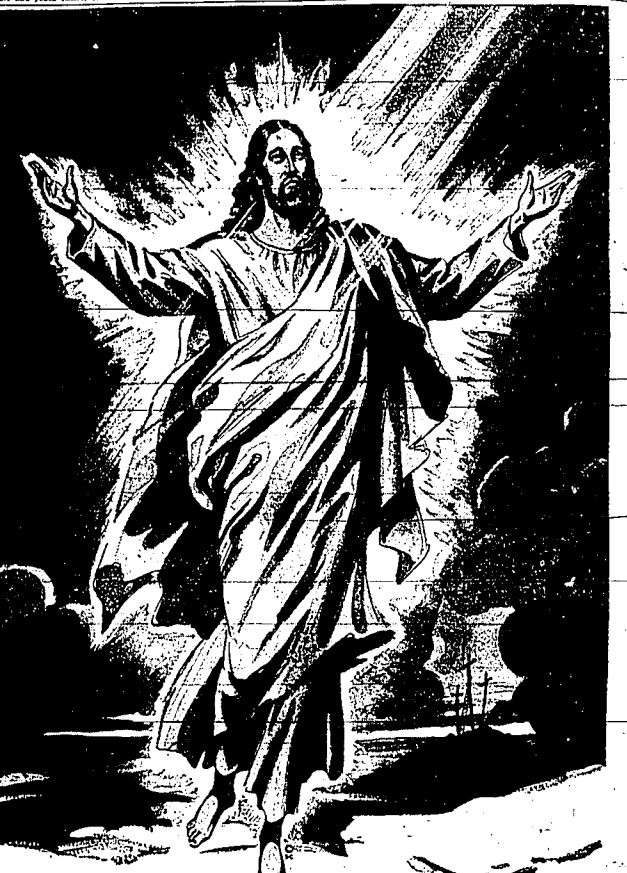

Public Health Chief Urging 3 Polio Shots

WASHINGTON, March 27 (AP)—A call for 90 million Americans to get inoculated against polio was sounded today by Surgeon Gen. Leroy E. Burney of the public health service.

He said that many persons under 40 years of age lack the recommended minimum of three shots.

Burney urged block-by-block and person-to-person inoculation drives in the nation to avoid a repetition of last summer when he said paralytic polio crippled more than 2,000 persons and killed almost 200.

At a news conference Burney also formally announced licensing of the manufacture of a new multiple vaccine combining polio vaccine with those of diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus for use on children under 18 years of age, primarily for those under 5.

He could not estimate when the new vaccine would be available for use. The vaccine would be administered by private physicians or by public health doctors where vaccines are normally supplied to hospitals. The vaccine would be provided through normal commercial channels.

Burney added that Salk polio vaccine now gives up to 90 per cent protection to persons who have three injections.

Chief of Grange Raps Props Cost

CHICAGO, March 27 (AP)—Present farm price support programs are unequitable, expensive and unworkable, the head of the National Grange, the nation's second largest farmers' organization, said today.

Herschel D. Newsum, master of the Grange, predicted that if the supports are continued they will cost the government an additional \$1 to \$1 1/2 billion dollars yearly starting next year.

The National Grange has a membership of 830,000 farmers. The largest farm organization is the National Farm Bureau federation.

Newsum said the government should abolish farm programs based on government price fixing and substitute commodity programs similar to those now in operation for wool and sugar.
