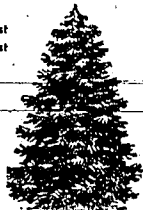

WASHINGTON - Vice President Nixon's presidential bid is being miffed because President Eisenhower failed to ask him to attend the White House conference on the Berlin crisis.

The California participation in the Berlin crisis has enhanced his chances for the 1960 nomination over Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller.

Mr. Nixon's friends also note that the only other major candidate to sit in on the Eisenhower-Macmillan meeting was Christian A. Herzig, former governor of Massachusetts and acting secretary of state.

Major J. B. H. 1960-Nixon went further building up his reputation as a backer of the issue of prospective Democratic rival current status. As the vice president's board of political advisers, he will review the situation here.

MISGIVINGS PRESENT Will all American officials on the Berlin situation, it has been a fact that misgivings have been felt in both West Germany and France as to what we would really do in a showdown.

Bohn and Paris, and the two militant Berliners themselves, therefore may feel more reassured now that President Eisenhower has taken to television to declare in grave tones that we will do nothing to jeopardize Berlin's freedom.

But doubts seem certain to linger on the issue of how we propose to carry out our military plans, if they should ever be tested militarily.

And there is continuing concern, too, over just how—without presiding over the liquidation of Berlin's freedom—our proposition for the summit conference will be put to a referendum in a way the Soviet Union can accept.

The unanswered questions still wait replies.

VIEW OF OTHERS

Two youngsters in Phoenix have been attributed to affliction by this material. "Such a horrible combination as a child playing with a dangerous material results in death as quickly as the face with a diabolical tenacity," warns Dr. Paul B. Davis, director of the Bureau of Child Health and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

An "electrostatic charge similar to that induced by rubbing the comb on the hair to make small pieces of paper cling to the comb, is generated on the very plastic by friction from handling," says Dr. Davis. "It is this charge which attracts the material in a plastic to have it literally grab him through electrical attraction to his face. If this happens, the mother's intervention of an adult will prevent tragedy."

From throughout the nation have come reports of the alarming incidence of deaths of this type among children. The stories are varied; the ending is the same. "Some mothers use the material as sheet covers; others allow their children to play with this plastic film as if it were a toy," explains Dr. Jarrett. "In many instances, the death of children who have died as a result of pulling the plastic bags over their heads. A short time after this is accomplished they are found in a stupor with a high concentration of carbon dioxide from their exhaled breath. Dismissed, inability to think, spasms of the muscles and convulsions are the final stages of asphyxiation with inhalation of undigested food puts a finish to the terrible tragedy."

Dr. Jarrett says a death of this type as much more tragic than one resulting from disease. "If disease causes a child's death, it is something beyond our power. But here, perfectly well, happy child is taken by this dangerous material that won't tear when a child tugs it."

# Services, Prayers, Fashion Parades Mark 1959 Easter

Christians over lunch-of-the-world celebrated Easter Sunday with services and prayers for peace. Outside American churches were the usual fashion parades.

Rome John XXIII, in the first Easter mass of his pontificate, pleaded for peace. But he decried the "good Christian" who does not yield and is way of compromise.

Despite an all-day downpour, 100,000 persons were in St. Peter's for the pontiff's blessing.

Among them were 30 contest-winning newspapers from 38 U. S. newspapers. Afterward, the boys presented an Easter egg to Italian queen Gina Lollobrigida.

In West Berlin, a record 100,000 persons celebrated the city 110 miles inside communist East Germany.

Members of numerous denominations hailed the Resurrection in the Jordan-occupied old city of Jerusalem.

Coptic bishops held services at the far end of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, while Greek Orthodox and Armenian Christians conducted services in other parts of the bustling city.

Among those attending a later Pontifical High mass in the basilica were Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt and her 16-year-old granddaughter Nina. Jordanian newspapers had protested Mrs. Roosevelt's visit because of her friendship for Israel, but there were no incidents.

Lutherans held sunrise services at the Garden tomb outside the walls of Jerusalem and mid-morning services in the Church of the Redeemer.

Anglicans worshipped in St. George's cathedral, and Protestants of other denominations met at the Garden tomb for inter-denominational services.

Rain dampened the day in parts of the United States. The sun broke through over New York, but cool temperatures kept Fifth avenue Easter paraders down to an estimated 800,000, compared to the record 1,200,000 who strolled in 1957.

A parade stopper in the avenue's chapel department were two live chicks on a hat designed as a basket covered with pink lace. It was worn by Judith Aronson, 16, of the Bronx.

In Gettysburg, Pa., a crowd of 300 watched the arrival of President and Mrs. Eisenhower, with the couple's son, daughter-in-law and four grandchildren, at the Presbyterian church.

The President's wife wore a pink velvet suit with a small hat of white violets with green trim. But the crowd was most pleased by her three young granddaughters in matching white-trimmed red dresses, light blue or gray coats, and red-trimmed white Boston sailor hats on the two oldest girls and a flowered bonnet on 2-year-old Mary Jean.

# Church Plans to Urge End to A-Tests in Air if Parley Fails

WASHINGTON, March 30—Sen. Frank Church, D-Ida., today said he would continue to press for agreement on suspension of nuclear weapons tests in the earth's atmosphere if conferees at Geneva fail to achieve the present impasse.

Church said testimony by Ambassador James J. Wadsworth before the senate subcommittee on disarmament last week, however, was "reassuring."

Wadsworth, chairman of the U. S. delegation at Geneva, under the auspices of Church, told the subcommittee that such alternatives would be sought only after the negotiators "have exhausted every possible avenue of approach and exploration in attempt to get the entire job done in one package."

"I have been fearful," Church said, "that the Russians will never agree to the kind of inspection system that reasonable men would require to police the suspension of all types of nuclear tests."

—If this proves to be so— he added, "then we ought to seek a lesser objective that would end the testing of nuclear weapons in the atmosphere, an international control system that would give us a start toward a bigger objective in the years to come."

The Geneva conference has been recessed until April 12. Sessions began last Oct. 31. Church pointed out, but the conferees have been deadlocked with those of the Soviet Union in seeking suspension of all nuclear tests. Since early in their deliberations.

Church recently suggested to the state department that if complete failure appears likely, U. S. negotiators should seek an agreement limited to the atmosphere, where nuclear explosions spread fallout.

Quietening by Church's statement that a ban on atmospheric tests alone would eliminate the problem of on-site inspections and roving inspection teams to which the Russians have objected.

Wadsworth also told the Idaho senator that he thought it would be "thoroughly appropriate" to the agenda of any summit conference.

Meanwhile, Church pointed out, chairman John A. McCone of the atomic energy commission testified last week that atmospheric tests could be suspended under a simple detection system that would be "very good."

He cited McCone's testimony before the committee that it has been the Russian insistence on veto power over the detection system that has so far proved the major stumbling block in the negotiations.

### Bulgaria Is Not Ruled by 'Titoist' Reds

VIENNA, March 30 (UPI)—Old-line communists still run Bulgaria despite the brief "relaxation" which followed the death of Soviet Dictator Joseph Stalin, east European experts here said today.

The "Titoists" who were restored to favor before the Hungarian revolt in 1956, when the Kremlin was seeking Yugoslav President Tito, were purged less than a year later.

Communist censorship makes it difficult to assess the feelings of the Bulgarian people, but the news which has leaked out indicates the existence of strong anti-communist sentiment in the satellite country.

Police had to use tanks and armored cars to break up an anti-communist demonstration early in 1957, apparently inspired by the Hungarian revolt.

The Bulgarian news, under heavy pressure from Moscow, agreed reluctantly in 1956 to "rehabilitate" Vice Premier Traicho Kostov, who had been executed as a "Titoist" seven years earlier.

The beneficiaries of this gesture were a number of surviving associates of Kostov, who had been purged when he was executed. They were readmitted to the party, and some achieved high positions.

Reliable reports say they were all purged again in July, 1957. The party announced in that month that three men had been ousted from the party's high command—Vice Premier Georgi Chankov, Labor Minister Dobri Terpecher and Yanko Panov.

Chankov was denounced for "systematically undermining party unity," and Terpecher and Panov were cited for "not having discontinued anti-party activities despite strong reprimands."

One of the first major tokens of anti-Russian sentiment in Bulgaria was the imprisonment in 1955 of 50 army officers who favored closer ties with Yugoslavia, which still stood high on Moscow's "black parade" at the time.

### U.S. Military Leaders Find Nation Has Plenty of Power

WASHINGTON, March 30 (AP)—The nation's military leaders have assured congress the united states would be invincible this year in an all-out war—and more power is in sight.

Adm. Arleigh Burke, chief of naval operations, said bluntly that if the Soviet Union starts an all-out war "we would break her back."

In a series of versions released today of the military leaders' testimony last January and February to the house defense appropriations subcommittee, Burke and Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor said they think America already has too much atomic retaliatory power.

Burke, whose navy will pack a growing atomic wallop, said he thought the United States has "too much retaliatory power." He urged a bigger share of defense spending for small wars in which the USSR might not be a direct participant.

Taylor said U.S. atomic retaliation power is overwhelming. He said the nation has thousands of vehicles which could rain nuclear destruction on the Soviets, whereas, he added, the job could be done with hundreds.

The testimony shows the air force is confident it knows the location of major Soviet strategic targets. It also says it can deliver nuclear bombs by manned aircraft with accuracy measured in feet, compared to the miles expected from long range missiles.
