### Judge Speaks At Meeting of Demo Women

Probate Judge J. Dean Mosher was guest speaker at a meeting of the Twin Falls Democratic Women's Club Tuesday in the city hall auditorium.

Explaining a few changes made in the 1951 youth rehabilitation act by the 1956 state legislature, Judge Mosher said the change in law calls for treating juveniles more like adults.

He said that he personally enjoys dealing with young people and that in all cases brought before him he considers whether mischief or crime was involved. A youth problem is more serious than it could appear to be because it could affect the whole life and add an expense to the state, he pointed out.

PHOENIX, Ariz., April 2 (UPI)—A dog named Sugarfoot, who was killed and 1,200,000 were injured in automobile accidents, has become a major national objective. But little progress can be made in preventing accidents without a knowledge about when, where and why they occur.

The U.S. bureau of public roads has just completed a three-year study which was the most comprehensive attempt yet to substitute facts for opinions on highway safety. The findings, to be published soon, support some long-held popular ideas about accidents, but sharply contradict others.

Some of the most surprising discoveries concern the relationship between speed and safety. One conclusion stands out clearly—the desirability of enforcing minimum as well as maximum speed limits on main highways. A few states already have such laws. Others may be prompted by the bureau's findings to adopt them.

The bureau found that under good driving conditions—that is, on main open-country highways, in daytime and in fair weather—it is substantially safer to drive at a relatively high speed than to poke along at very slow speeds. ### Road Safety Study Tells too Slow or Fast Speeds Unsafe

WASHINGTON, April 2 (UPI)—Last year, 25,000 Americans were killed and 1,200,000 were injured in automobile accidents.

And what constitutes a safe speed on a main rural highway would definitely be too fast in a congested urban area, or on a narrow, winding road.

The study covered 3700,000,000 vehicle-miles of actual automobile travel by 200,000 drivers of both sexes and every age bracket, over typical stretches of main rural highway in 11 widely-scattered states.

By analyzing in an electronic computer the 10,000 accidents which occurred, the bureau came up with a mass of statistics on the "accident involvement rate" of various kinds of drivers under widely varying travel conditions.

The accident involvement rate for drivers traveling at speeds below 40 miles per hour proved to be several times higher than that of drivers traveling at somewhat higher speeds.

This does not mean that the faster you drive, the less likely you are to have an accident. Plotted on a graph, the accident involvement rate for daytimes travel on major highways drops steadily from 60 to 85 miles an hour, then gradually levels off until about

### Double Lesson

Here the findings are unequivocal—the faster you are going, the more likely you are to be seriously hurt if you are in a wreck. At 40 miles an hour, only a third of the accident result in substantial injuries. At 70 miles, nearly 90 per cent of the accidents involve injury.

Weighting together both considerations—the chances of having an accident, and its probable severity—the bureau found the overall injury rate is lowest at speeds between 45 and 70 miles an hour. It rises sharply below 40 and above 70.

All of the figures given above are for daytime travel.

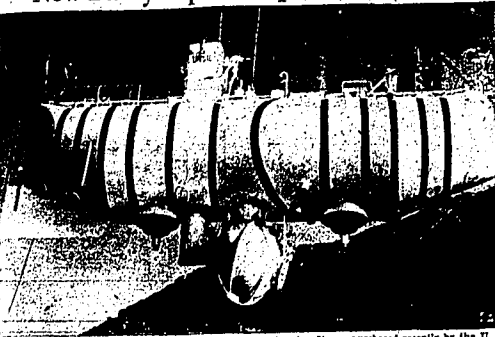

Normally the young cells mature under orders from cortisol and grow to health perfection to keep the body free from disease and infection.

But suppose that suddenly some of these cells become cancerous. Now they refuse to take orders from cortisol—in fact they multiply and begin multiplying—creating kind—cancer cells of their own kind.

Soon the body begins to clog with these useless juvenile cells, cells that never grow old and die, never work but hamper body functions.

This is one kind of acute leukemia.

### U.S. Surplus Investments At New High

**WASHINGTON, April 2 (UPI)—**The government's investment in price-supported wheat, corn, cotton and other surplus farm commodities jumped to a record 49,089,475,000 as of Feb. 28.

The agriculture department reported yesterday this was 162,374,000 greater than the previous record set on Jan. 31. It was 47,171,000 more than the investment a year ago when Uncle Sam had 47,119,000 tied up in crop supports.

The big jump was due to heavy price support operations on the 1958 record crop.

The Feb. 28 investment was made up of \$5,111,027,000 in commodities owned outright by the Government-owned and had loans on 1,286,954,172 bushels of wheat, representing a total outlay of \$1,192,019,262. Wheat in inventory totaled 753,609,370 bushels worth \$2,144,139,573 loans covering \$2,144,139,573 totaling \$778,879,700.

Corn was a close second to wheat, whatever. The total corn investment of \$2,238,472,020 covered 114,121,938 bushels in inventory worth \$204,663,193 and loans on 427,211,826 bushels worth \$529,819,846.

# Steel Firms, Workers Ready Arguments for Talks in May

WASHINGTON, April 2.—Every time the steel industry and the Steelworkers union disagree over a new labor contract—as they will again in May—the script is about the same.

First come the carefully prepared arguments from both sides—arguments they hope will be persuasive.

The negotiations then generally fall into deadlock, amid govern-

ment appeals to avoid an impending "paralyzing strike."

Finally the opponents, sometimes after a strike, put aside most of their earlier economic demands and reach a compromise settlement.

Beldonia is all this accomplished without somebody getting hurt. The economic consequences usually include higher prices and higher wages all along the line.

Let's take a look at some of the cards each side is holding in the poker game soon to begin:

For industry—(1) A mounting inventory. (2) An official government hold-down on inflationary wage and price increases. (3) Considerable distance for a strike on the part of the public, including steelworkers now enjoying full pay envelopes after a bad year in 1958. (4) High wages already paid in 1958.

For the union—(1) Rising steel productivity. (2) An expected better industry profit year in 1959. (3) An uncertain, now supported, even among government economists, that steel prices have been

too high for some time. (4) A militant union that has staunchly followed its leadership in the past.

Right now the industry is projecting more steel than ever before in history. By the time present steel wage contracts run out in June 30 there will be an estimated 60-to-80-day inventory.

This obviously will be to the industry's advantage. It will have enough steel on hand so a strike of moderate length won't hurt its customers.

David J. McDonald, the union's president, can be expected to argue the opposite. That record production will mean record profits, out of which he contends a share should go to the workers.

The 1958 annual report of the United States Steel corporation, last issued, shows this top industry producer operated at less than 60 per cent of capacity last year.

Production now is nearing 100 million tons annual capacity, compared with less than 100 million a decade ago. Steelmen say more profits are needed to assure continued growth.

Both sides in the coming steel war are expected to be urged by the government to avoid a wage increase so expensive it will cause 100 another steel price boost. This might put a limit on the poker game.

Steelworkers already are among America's highest paid industrial workers. In fact, even if there is no strike, a laydown may occur later in the year. But 1959 production employer they average \$3 an hour, plus a bonus of \$1.00 an hour, plus a profit share.

The industry says profits should be higher. It now has nearly 150 million tons annual capacity, compared with less than 100 million a decade ago. Steelmen say more profits are needed to assure continued growth.

# Library Board Sets Opening Of Youth Room, Gets Report

Members of the Youth Room, which is being organized by the library board, received attention from the board at its monthly meeting at the library Wednesday.

Arthur L. DeVolder, librarian, reported that the Youth Room is being organized in the area and within the next three months it is expected that 1,200 books will be available for youngsters.

DeVolder also reported that the "California listening corner" had been received and head-phones

had been ordered for the record player. All operational equipment should be ready for use by dedication day on April 15. Reports on gifts for the room were also read. Records were donated by the Claude Brown Music and Furniture company, Heit's Record Shop and Warner's Music Store. The California listening corner by the Twin Falls Music club; an occasional chair by the J. C. Preiner company; four chairs by the Twin Falls Bank and Trust company; two chairs by the Twin Falls Lodge.

Commitments for additional equipment have been made by the

Exchange club, Kiwanis club which is donating a table and Scorpionist club which is also donating a table as well as serving the 25th anniversary tea.

Gratitude was expressed by the board for the wonderful support the community has given the project. It is hoped that other interested groups will visit the library and contribute to this extension of service for the youth of the community. DeVolder said.

In other reports it was brought out that 28 adult and 15 juvenile books had been purchased and 74 books donated for a total addition of 107 titles. Books withdrawn were 29 adult and 6 juvenile for a total of 35; while 106 adult and 4 juvenile titles were rebound for a total of 104. Books and magazines repaired in the library were 300.

Paragraph records added were 12 adult and 11 juvenile while only three juvenile records were withdrawn. Circulation of phono-

graph records were 42 adult and 50 juvenile for a total of 92. New readers received were 171 adult and 81 juvenile. Withdrawals were 69 adult and 34 juvenile; the gain for the month being 129 readers.

Adult books issued for the month were 2,147 fiction, 1,260 non-fiction, 544 magazines and 95 pamphlets. Juvenile books issued were 2,915 fiction, 872 non-fiction, 6 story hour attendance totaled 102 magazines and 16 pamphlets. Adult circulation total 5,747 and juvenile circulation total 3,216 for a grand total of 9,563.

In the 26 days the library was open the average daily circulation

was 368. Largest daily circulation, 627, and smallest, 236. Percentage of non-fiction circulated was 37. Receipts were \$2,760 from appropriations; \$208.41 from book collections and gifts; \$61 from the pay ahead and \$52.90 for cards from non-residents. Magazine sales of book issues totaled \$27.50.

One library orientation lecture was given to 34 students, while story hour attendance totaled 102 for the month.

Mrs. Frank DeLuca, secretary of the board gave a brief report on the workshop for library trustees which she attended in Boise on March 10 and 11.

### Cost Reports Do Little Good Month Late, Henry Suggests

 You didn't know it, and neither did I, but we all could have saved a considerable amount of money last month had we eaten nothing but fried eggs and pork chops, and washed them down with great draughts of coffee.

This golden opportunity for thrift, if not health, was revealed in the release of the labor department's cost-of-living index for February.

The index showed that overall food prices declined seven-tenths of one per cent last month, due chiefly to a drop in prices for eggs, pork and coffee. If you strayed away from these items, however, you blew your chance to save, for most other foods were up, especially vegetables.

Most of us, I am sure, would have eaten eggs and pork, and saved coffee until it came out of our ears, had we but known what was going on.

I'm not much at mathematics, especially when fractions are involved, but I figured out what my family could have saved in February. Had we been able to put away \$1,000 worth of eggs, pork and coffee, we'd be \$3 ahead of the game.

We would have had to eat pre-

steadily, with little time for frivolous things, but it's amazing what a family can do when it has a worthwhile goal and every member puts his shoulder to the wheel. In this case, the fork is in his mouth.

My guess is that had we eaten \$1,000 worth of eggs, pork and coffee we would have saved even more than \$1, for surely we would have been able to coast empty for at least the first week in March.

The main trouble with the labor department's figures, as I see it, is that they come a month late. February's cheap prices weren't released until late March, and there just isn't any way to eat backwards, so to speak.

The department's findings are like racing results—they come too late to do any good. What they need is a food forecaster, or, at the very least, a man who would tell you in advance what he thought were the best bets for the coming month. Something like this:

Round steak: Could be the best buy of the month, but wouldn't risk it.

Leg of Lamb: Worth a flyer.

Carrots: Looks like a winner for the housewife.

Steering meat: Always a good bet.

Onions: Not to be overlooked.

7-hour steaks: Always in the money.

The handicapper would be wrong now and then, of course.

National Taxpayers Conference

Organized taxpayers across the nation are using the Easter recess of congress to buttonhole members of congress on the need for economy in federal spending, according to the National Taxpayers conference. State taxpayer groups in the NTC are taking the lead in the Economy-at-Easter campaign. As part of a direct message from President Eisenhower that "if the government is to follow the course of fiscal responsibility in the conduct of its business, the informed citizens of our nation must speak up to congress without delay."

### "Economy at Easter" Campaign Aimed At Extravagance in U.S. Government

BOISE, April 2—An "Economy-at-Easter" campaign to stress to vacationing congressmen the need for a holiday from federal extravagance and threats of deficit spending and inflation was kicked off by the organized-taxpayers of the nation this week.

Far from satisfied that congress to "take the mood" of "moderate" spending record, representatives of 37 non-partisan state taxpayer groups are buttonholing their lawmakers to urge them to greater economy.

"From what we learned during our annual conference March 18 at Washington from leaders in the executive and legislative branches," said Max Yost, executive manager of the Associated Taxpayers of Idaho, "we are deeply and seriously concerned about our country's future."

"The organized-taxpayers went on record at their meeting in support of the fiscal 1939 balanced federal budget, declared their opposition to pending proposals which go beyond budget recommendations, urged further cuts in spending where possible, a reduction of the huge federal debt, and proposed when possible a program of prudent tax reduction." Yost continued. "And we're going to lay it on the line for our legislators while they are at home."

Yost pointed out that now, more than ever before, taxpayers must exert every effort to preserve the nation's solvency; that they must prevail on their lawmakers to exercise restraint in spending commitments which will invite greater deficits and inflation.

"Contrary to general understanding," said Yost, "recent great increases in federal spending have

### Khrushchev Isn't Genius but Is Unpredictable, Dangerous

Long before anyone dreamed of Nikita Khrushchev as a future czar, a Western diplomat sized him up shrewdly as "that brilliant bonhead."

The man can bluster and guffaw his way with a terrifying air of carelessness toward the edge of global disaster. But he is no genius. His career has been dotted with bonheaded plays.

In a meeting at the summit, nonetheless, western statesmen would face a formidable antagonist, dynamic bundle of realities, energy and dazzling paradoxes, far less predictable, potentially far more dangerous than the mighty Stalin.

One of his success secrets seems to be an astonishing knack for blaming his own mistakes on others—and getting away with it. Another has been an Olympian scorn of weakness and what he would regard as bourgeois morality.

Khrushchev knows only one truth. In a sense he is a misanthrope. He has referred proudly to his "communist faith." In propagating this faith, he has shown himself a true disciple of Lenin.

World communism as developed under Soviet control has one basic aim: to impose its political philosophy on the whole world. To accomplish this, any subterfuge, any lie, any deceit, any tactic is justified in communist eyes.

Through a combination of this faith and his political agility, Khrushchev has survived revolution, civil war, bloodbath, purges and dark intrigues. Heating a durable 65 in April, he sometimes seems like an amiable hippo on a lightning.

The Khrushchev era in the USSR is now about five years old. In that brief historical period, five foot 5 inch, 220 pound former coal miner has zoomed like a Soviet hero.

Perhaps he went too far too fast. He is not yet the sole inheritor of Stalin's awesome power. "Those commissars," then first party secretary in the Ukraine. Kaganovich

had Khrushchev sent to Moscow's Industrial academy in 1929 for four studies.

Under such important auspices, Khrushchev became a member of the communist party committee in the academy. Once again he chose a winning horse. He led an attack against those in the academy who sided with Trotsky and other enemies of Stalin.

In 1934 Khrushchev was just a Kaganovich man, and his boss got him finally on the powerful central committee. He now had a firm grasp on the first rung of his ladder to power.

For Nikita Berystyach Khrushchev, life began at 40.

### Solon Protests Labor Counsel

WASHINGTON, April 2 (UPI)—Sen. Harry Goldwater has written to President Eisenhower formally protesting his nomination of Stuart Rothman as general counsel of the national labor relations board.

Goldwater, ranking Republican member of the senate labor committee, expressed objections to Rothman, now labor department solicitor, in a letter delivered to the White House last Thursday.

Goldwater told the President he could not support Rothman because he did not believe him competent to hold the post.

It was understood Goldwater said he felt only a lawyer with the highest legal qualifications should hold such a sensitive post in the labor field. He said he did not believe Rothman, a 44-year-old veteran government lawyer, so qualified.
