Certain Jobs Found Cause For Cancers

MINNESOTA SPRINGS, Mo., April 7.—A new study by a California scientist indicates that certain jobs are possible danger points in the construction of public buildings.

The study, conducted by Dr. Lester Breslow, of the California department of public health, is the final report of the National Cancer society's research on the incidence of cancer among workers in a number of occupations.

The study shows that the highest incidence of cancer is among men in the following occupations: asbestos workers; lead, zinc and copper miners; and workers in the following three groups: (1) men who have sometimes worked extra pay for hazardous occupations such as those involving exposure to ionizing radiation; (2) men who have worked in occupations which require wearing gas masks; (3) men who have worked in occupations which require wearing gas masks.

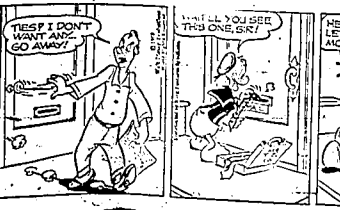

Farm Bureau Backs Labor Reform Plan

WASHINGTON, April 7 (UPI)—The American Farm Bureau federation today threw its support behind labor reform legislation it said was needed to protect the public and farmers against abuse of power by union leaders.

The Farm Bureau committee at a house labor committee hearing, also called for language in the bill to prohibit union expenditures for election purposes.

"It is our position that any organization whose membership is other than voluntary should be prohibited from expending money for political purposes," testified Herbert W. Voorhes, president of the New Jersey Farm Bureau and a member of the federation's executive committee.

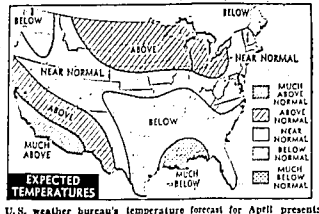
Voorhes said poultry farm-ers' cooperative marketing association in New Jersey was picketed for nearly six months last year and operated to "boycott" with a union. Secondary boycotts were instituted by "forcing" market agents to a number of markets in which the cooperative marketed eggs, he testified.

Voorhes also said the "truck unloading fee racket" was another example of need for legislation to protect farmers. He said truckers hauling farm products to most middle Atlantic cities are charged \$1 to \$2.25 per truckload for unloading.

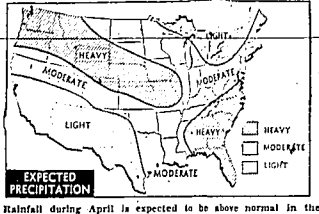
"If the trucker refuses to pay this charge and tries to unload himself, the warehouse employs will not fork out any of the pellets on which the packages are stacked, except the driver has a alternative but to pay the fee," he said. "We submit this is not a legitimate labor labor union activity. It is pure and simple extortion."

WASHINGTON, April 7 (UPI)—Conservative Republicans here were urging Postmaster General Arthur C. Summerfield today to seek the GOP national chairmanship.

The party's National committee meeting here Friday and Saturday will name an successor to Meade Adams, who is resigning to return to his private law practice.

The committee also may vote to hold the GOP presidential nominating convention in Chicago, Ohio, next here tomorrow. It is understood to have such a recommendation in mind.
