Manufactured by the International Business Machine company, the typewriter is equipped with a special key guard, allowing students to operate the machine even though they are unable to use their hands.

Mrs. Clinch Haglitter, a teacher at the school, explains that by clenching a dowel or stick between her teeth, a student unable to use his hands can type accurately and fairly fast.

To prove her point, Mrs. Haglitter points to a notebook kept by one of her students. She notes that the student types neatly and accurately. "A student who is incapable of writing or printing is able to do regular school work by using an electric typewriter," she says.

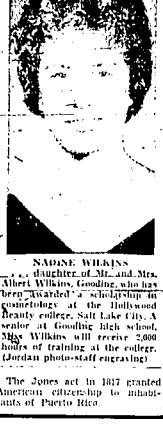

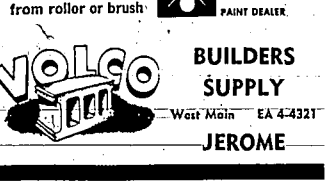
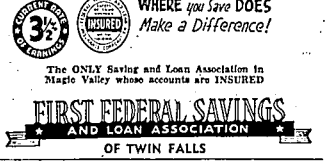

Firm Shows Speedier Jet Boat Engine

AGUA, Calif. April 10 — A jet water jet engine designed to drive boats and ships at almost 100 miles per hour was introduced today by scientists at Aerojet-General corporation.

The new engine can increase the speed of hydroplanes by at least 25 per cent, said Calvin Conroy, chief of Aerojet's anti-submarine warfare division.

It is called Hydrocket. The revolutionary device, called a hydrorocket, has no propeller. Instead, an impeller, consisting of a large, speaker whirling at terrific speed, draws the water into the water sprays water into the air behind it.

A low-horsepower version has been successfully tested in a small boat. The company plans to install a high-speed hydrorocket in a racing boat for time trials this summer.

Hydrojets is expected to have military applications, but they are not. A commercial model for boating enthusiasts is expected to be ready in two years. No estimate on cost is available.

The hydrojet was developed to overcome water drag on propellers.

Impeller Out of Water "I have reduced this to a minimum," Conroy said. "The hydrojet's impeller is completely out of the water."

The impeller, a metal disk pierced with slanting holes, is attached to the engine's drive shaft. As it spins, the impeller pumps water up from a scoop below the hull and forces it through vanes which deflect the water jet.

Tests, a 25-horsepower speed engine has achieved a speed of 25 miles an hour, "increasing the horsepower developed by the efficiency," Conroy said.

Young Mother of Four Wins Round in Attempt to Get 13

CHICAGO, April 10—A young mother of four children won an important round yesterday in her fight for the right to take care of 13 others—her brothers and sisters.

Mrs. Marie Smith, 22, received encouraging news from Judge Maurice J. Schultz in family court. "It is not our purpose to separate families," the judge said. "If the home is clean, there will be no problem."

He ordered an investigation and set a hearing for May 19.

Mrs. Smith, a willowy girl who looks like a teen-ager, is hopeful. For her, the custody case is a matter of love and honor.

She promised her mother, Mrs. Alberta Williams she would keep the Williams children together. That was last fall. Mrs. Williams, on her death bed at the time, died Nov. 8.

Mrs. Smith took her own youngsters with her. Then she anonymously telephoned police, notifying them the Williams children were uncared for. They picked up the Williams children, ranging in age from 6 months to 13 years. Two days later the Smiths made up and Mrs. Smith again sought custody.
