U. S. Discoverer Be Made to Catch Jobs to Come From New Satellite

WASHINGTON, April 14 (UPI)—The government said today it will not attempt to recover a space capsule from the polar satellite Discoverer 11. Roy Johnson, director of the advanced research projects agency, said a malfunction of the timing apparatus made impossible the planned recovery of the capsule by airplanes or supporting naval vessels. Johnson said, however, that a test would be made of the separation components and possibly of the functioning of the retrorocket and parachute of the Discoverer 11. Johnson said a device has been placed in the vehicle during the satellite's 17th pass around the poles at about 7 p.m. (EST). He said if the separation is successful the capsule will be recovered by a fleet of planes and sent to Alaska. Johnson said the sequence of events will be followed by Discoverer 11 minus the ejected capsule.

New Skyhook Makes Public Appearances

STRATFORD, Conn., April 14 (AP)—The Sikorsky S-60 crane helicopter—a big "skyhook" crane—made its first public appearance today at its first public show.

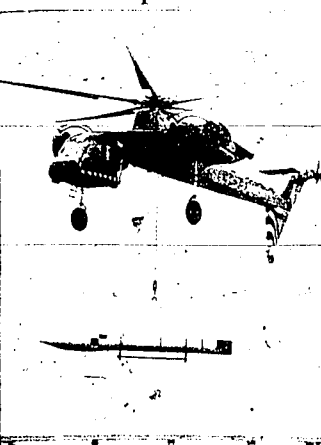

Stronger World Court Proposed

NEW YORK, April 14 (AP)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon proposed today to strengthen the World Court and to make it the center in disputes arising from any future East-West agreements.

At the same time, Nixon announced a forthcoming proposal by President Eisenhower to modify treaty language by which the United States reserves "the right to decide, without injury to the rights of any to that court."

He said last night in a speech prepared for the Academy of Political Science that it is not enough to preserve "the balance of terror" that he said now exists between the free and communist worlds.

"Even though our dedication to strengthen will reduce sharply the chances of war by deliberate acts, as long as the rule of force remains its paramount position as the final arbiter of international disputes, there will ever remain the possibility of war by miscalculation," he said.

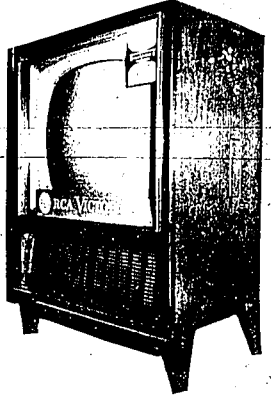

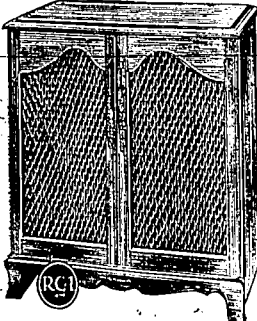

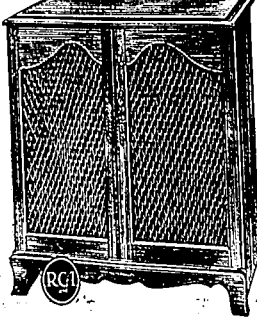

Senior Given Rotary Grant To Aid Study

BURLEY, April 14.—Lamont Smith Lyons, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ivan E. Lyons, 2677, has been selected as the winner of the newly-created Elsworth and Davis Rotary scholarship, announced James Roper, Burley Rotary club scholarship chairman.

The 18-year-old Burley high school senior, whose purpose is to become a registered pharmacist, stands 16th in a class of 137 graduating seniors.

Other contestants for the four-year Rotary scholarship—paying the recipient \$375 per school year—were Barbara Blinn, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William A. Blinn, who wishes to prepare for a teaching career, and Ann O'Bryan, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon C. O'Bryan, whose ambition is to become a registered nurse.

All three plans to enroll next fall at Idaho State college. Scholarship provisions specify the recipient must enroll and maintain attendance at an educational institution in Idaho, and must maintain a list of references. The winner was chosen on the basis of equal consideration of economic conditions, academic achievement and potential promise of completing provisions of the scholarship in four years.

The Rotarians considered the three applications. In addition to Roper they are Adonis Kleben, Perry Stephenson, Hermon King and Dr. Charles Terhune. Also present at the meeting were Mayor Saterstrom, club president Jack Snow, secretary, and the Rev. Richard H. M. Yost, club bulletin editor.

Two brothers, Elsworth and Darline Davis, former Burleyites who were graduated from Burley high school in 1924, set up the Rotary scholarship. Now in business in Florida, the two men were the sons of the late Mr. and Mrs. W. Milton Davis, who formerly operated the Davis Mercantile company here.

Kind memories of Burley and their high school days, "together with a desire to assist in developing outstanding citizens," was prompted the brothers to found the scholarship through the Burley Rotary club.

It pays \$375 annually for four years for a total of \$1,500 in a single grant. One such grant shall be granted each year for five years.

Red Support Is Banned in Catholic Rule

VATICAN CITY, April 14.—Pope Pius XXIII has signed a decree declaring that Roman Catholics, warned 10 years ago against supporting the Communist party, may not vote for fellow travelers of communism.

The decree, made public yesterday, has worldwide effect. It says Catholics cannot vote for parties or for candidates who, even if they do not profess principles in contrast to Catholic doctrines, or

the attributes of Christianity, may unite with communism or aid the Communists.

A 1943 decree, excommunicating militant members of the Communist party, explicitly warned Catholics not to join Communist parties. It said communism is materialistic and anti-Christian.

The new decree—approved by the congregation of the Holy Office March 25 and signed by the pope April 2—broadened that warning.

BICYCLER NEARS TRIP END
DAWSON CREEK, B. C., April 14 (AP)—Armin Honess, a 23-year-old Swiss student who has bicycled from the Equator to the outskirts of the Arctic, left here yesterday on the last stretch of a 16,000-mile trip from Rio De Janeiro to Fairbanks, Alaska.

Soldier's Death Caused by Fall

PT. BRAGO, N. C., April 14 (AP)—Womack Army hospital said yesterday Pfc. Gerald Lee Boren, 19, who was found dead Sunday in a shallow water-filled ditch, died of a fractured skull.

Pt. Brago officials said his body was found shortly after he had broken away from guards.

The autopsy report said Boren, whose address was listed as Ft. 1, Vale, Ore., apparently sustained the fracture in a fall.

He was lying face-down in a concrete drainage ditch in about six inches of water.
