Space Flight Awaits Safer Escape Plan

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—The first warmup test flights into space by America's Mercury astronauts will be taken when their escape system is perfected and proven to be completely reliable.

This was the word scientists of the national aeronautics and space administration gave yesterday to the house space committee, studying NASA's budget for the fiscal year which starts July 1.

George M. Low, an NASA scientist working on Project Mercury, declined to say how long he expects the man-in-space tests to begin. He did say that unmanned test flights in the project are expected to begin early next year.

Escape Device Works Low told the committee about the first completely successful test of an escape mechanism conducted a week ago at NASA facilities at Wallops Island off the Virginia coast.

With this, he said, if something went wrong on the launching pad when a man was to be fired into rockets on the escape mechanism would yank the pilot free of the space vehicle, fling him 2,000 to 3,000 feet into the air and return him safely to the ground by means of parachutes.

Both the manned and unmanned preliminary tests of Project Mercury will be held at Wallops Island, although an air force Atlas will be used in the actual attempt at orbital flight. The manned test will be carried out at Cape Canaveral, Fla.

Tests to be 100 miles These suborbital flights will be sort of "toe-in-the-air" feelers into space. They will simulate actual flight of the eventual Mercury satellite, Low said, but they will be carried out over a distance of only 100 miles.

NASA said earlier this month that the test hops will carry the astronaut about 60 miles above Cape Canaveral. They will come down in their space capsule by parachute, and the astronaut will be where boats will pick them up.

Einstein Idea Of Relativity To Be Tested

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—U. S. space scientists reported yesterday they may be able to prove or contradict Einstein's theory of relativity within the next 18 months.

It all depends on how soon work can be completed on an atomic clock so accurate that it will lose less than one second in a century.

Dr. Homer E. Newell, Jr., assistant director for space science in the national aeronautics and space administration, gave this report to the house space committee.

To test the Einstein theory NASA scientists plan to synchronize two of the superaccurate clocks and then place one in a satellite and fire it into an orbit, 4,000 miles above the earth.

If Einstein's theory is correct, the clock in the satellite will run faster than the clock on the ground.

"This will prove the first accurate, controlled check of the theory of relativity," Newell said.

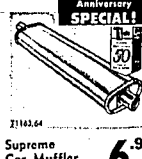

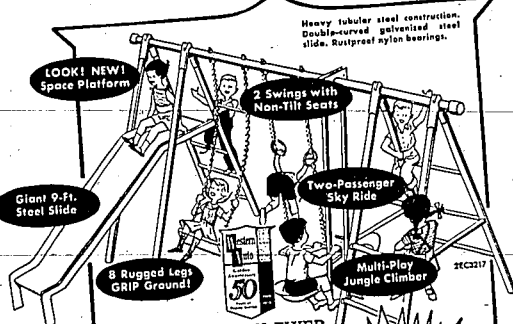

China to Be Part of Red Bloc Parley

MOSCOW, April 22 (AP)—Communist China joins the Soviet Union and seven European communist nations next week in Warsaw to discuss world communist objectives for the foreign ministers conference in Geneva.

The announcement yesterday by the official Soviet news agency Tass failed to make clear whether the communist Chinese will be present with the Warsaw pact nations as an observer, or as full participants.

Meet to Be April 27

The meeting is called for April 27, two days in advance of a western strategy meeting in Paris to examine positions with relation to the May 11 conference in Geneva.

The Tass announcement said the Warsaw pact meeting will review questions connected with the coming Geneva talks concerning Germany, including a peace treaty with Germany and the question of abolishing the occupation regime in Western Berlin.

Whether communist China is present as full participant or observer, its attendance indicates an intention to present a solid communist world front in defense and maintenance of Soviet positions in Europe.

2 Subjects Wanted

The communists' wording indicated the red bloc hopes to restrict the Geneva foreign ministers' conference to discussion of the twin Soviet demands—a proposal to make West Berlin a "free city" without occupation forces, and an insistence that the two sides in the cold war sign peace treaties with both West and Communist East Germany.

The Warsaw pact is a military alliance of the Soviet Union with the communist-ruled states of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Bulgaria, Rumania, Albania and East Germany.

Refugees Report Red China Turns Tibet Into Vast Prison

KATHMANDU, Nepal, April 22 (UPI)—Communist Chinese troops have turned Tibet into a vast prison with thousands of Tibetans being whipped each day in the streets and Buddhist nuns sent to army camps for the pleasure of the troops, refugees fleeing to Nepal reported today.

They said nearly 2,500 Tibetan monasteries were damaged or destroyed by communist artillery in the past month and nearly 8,000 monks killed, 12,000 arrested and about 800,000 Lamas forced to live homeless and hungry into the mountains.

At the Nepal-Tibet border a few

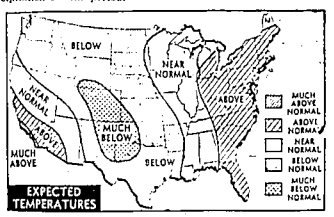

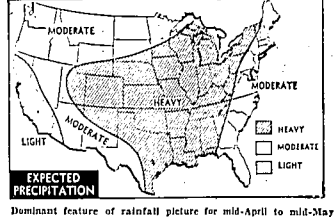

New Light on Uncle Sam's Fat Larder Revealed by Copper Market gyrations

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—This week's gyrations in the copper market threw some light into another corner of Uncle Sam's larder, revealing, as usual, more than anyone can ever use.

Word of a routine review of U. S. copper holdings leaked out as a rumor that the federal government planned to sell 100,000 tons of the red metal as "surplus" immediately, world copper prices tumbled two cents a pound. A hue and cry arose from mining companies, miners and mining-state lawmakers.

At the week's end, the office of civil and defense mobilization was saying that it had no plans to sell any copper, adding though, that it was "common knowledge" that the U. S. had millions of pounds more copper than it needed.

The OGDMA might have added that other little-known U. S. surpluses include 16 million carats of industrial diamonds and 10 million pounds of cobalt.

The farm surplus, now worth 9 billion dollars, has been around for a long time. In wheat alone, 13 billion surplus bushels have overflowed into fleets of motobattled victory ships, each of scores of bushels holding enough wheat to make two slices of bread for every man, woman and child in the 50 states.

War surplus has been a booming business since 1945. There are 24 billion dollars worth of defense

materials in the excess category today, and another 60 billion dollars worth of combat equipment that is becoming obsolete.

The 4,194 million pounds of copper—and 117 other so-called strategic commodities the U. S. has amassed—just add to Uncle Sam's reputation as the world's greatest squirrel.

Secret OGDMA reports show there are 544 billion dollars worth of lead, copper, box, bitumens, asphalt, oil, jacked watch bearings, tritium and 108 other commodities in the national attic.

Designed to carry the U. S. through another major war if foreign sources were cut off, the defense stocks have grown and grown. Non-classified reports show inventories 13 billion dollars above maximum needs for a repeat run of World War II, even if all overseas shipments were cut off.

Not all "critical" items are overstocked in federal warehouses, but 51 of 52 classes are listed as such.

Highly hush-hush detailed reports show excess stocks of 400,000 and 800 per cent of needs. For one zinc commodity, credible estimates, the U. S. admits it has hoarded an even 12,000 per cent of expected war requirements (13 short tons).

Seven typical items are in heavy oversupply. We have 380 million pounds of nickel, 115 per cent of needs; 775,000 short tons of fluor spar, 280 per cent of requirements; 184 per cent of our needs in industrial diamonds; 24 billion pounds of lead, 422 per cent of objectives, and 1,600,000 tons, 544 per cent of needs, of aluminum.

As for that were not enough, stockpiling purchase contracts for nearly 100 million dollars more are still being filled as a result of Korean war orders.
