Nehru Invites Red China Leaders to Visit Lama in India, Check on Freedom

WASHINGTON, April 24 (UPI)—Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru today published a statement inviting Chinese officials and their Panchen Lama to come to India to check on the freedom of the Panchen Lama. Nehru said he would be glad to receive them at a conference with the Panchen Lama. Then he went to Birha house, the home-office of the Tibetan leader, and they greeted each other with undisguised mutual admiration.

"How are you?" said the Indian premier in English to the Panchen Lama.

"Very nice," replied the Dalai Lama.

Nehru said his talks with the Panchen Lama were "full and helpful."

Nehru also told newsmen the Panchen Lama had told him he had written a letter to the Chinese military commanders in Lhasa, hoping that conditions would improve.

He quoted the Dalai Lama as saying that until 4 p.m. on March 17 he had not decided to leave Lhasa. But by 10 p.m. that night conditions had grown worse, so he and the others of his party decided to leave.

Asked if there was any talk of the Panchen Lama's return to Tibet, Nehru said he would not answer that question.

He added that he had forgotten to mention to the Dalai Lama the fact he had invited the Panchen Lama to come to India to meet with the Chinese government.

Nehru said he hoped his four-hour talk with the Dalai Lama would pave the way for an early solution to the Tibetan problem.

Informants said Nehru appeared displeased as he listened to the Panchen Lama's account of the Chinese communists in Tibet and recite specific instances of Chinese oppression.

FRANKFURT, Ky., April 24 (UPI)—Gov. A. B. Chandler today ordered 2,000 Kentucky national guard troops into the eastern Kentucky coal fields to deal with disorders in the 47-day-old coal strike. Chandler said the strike was reaching sixth year in its history.

The governor said the decision to send in the national guard was forced by "the unruly and rowdy activities of pickets in Perry and Reiter counties last night and this morning."

TOKYO, April 24 (UPI)—Communist-leaning left-wing parties absorbed major defeat yesterday in the nation-wide elections of government and prefectural legislators. The results were considered a victory for the government of Premier Nobusuke Kishi whose policies were attacked by his opposition as too pro-western.

WASHINGTON, April 24 (UPI)—Roger M. Blough, chairman of the board of the U. S. Steel corporation, defended the steel industry's price increases on Monday, saying they were necessary to meet the demand for steel in the automobile and other industries.

GENEVA, April 24 (UPI)—The United States told the Soviet Union today that less extensive control arrangements would be required by an agreement on a phased suspension of nuclear weapons tests. The U.S. said it would be established and there would be less need for automatic on-site inspection by mobile teams, the chief American delegate, James J. Wadsworth, explained. It is an agreement to stop surface, atmospheric and underwater tests.

LONDON, April 24 (UPI)—Experts of the western big four nations today agreed to meet in London for a meeting on the subject of the foreign ministers conference next month. It was understood to include a phased arm control and inspection system for central Europe, the British, French, United States and West German governments.

Labor Bill Hits Snag On Pickets

WASHINGTON, April 24 (UPI)—The senate defeated a move by Sen. John J. McClellan, D. Ark., today to ban unions from picketing in order to grant workers or force employers to bargain with unions.

The Eisenhower administration contends an effective law to regulate picketing would require organizational picketing and secondary boycotts. Administration-backed proposals would be amendments of the basic Taft-Hartley labor law.

McClellan, chairman of the senate labor-management investigating committee, introduced a bill that would be called a "bill of rights" for rank-and-file union members. It would require that the AFL-CIO and by Sen. John F. Kennedy, D. Mass., principal sponsor of the pending bill in the House.

Some supporters of McClellan were reported today, however, to be in a "hot" mood. They are going to picket him unless he puts his employees in a union but will settle for a payoff.

High Casualty List Expected In Atom Blast

WASHINGTON, April 24 (AP)—Civil defense Mobilizer Leo Hoch estimated Thursday that the blast would be killed if hydrogen bombs were dropped on 15 major cities in this country.

There would be killed by blast, immediate radiation and heat, Hoch estimated an additional 10 to 15 million people would be killed from fallout in such an attack.

The estimates were based on supposed nuclear attack in which an average of three megatons was dropped over each of the 150 major metropolitan, military and population centers. A megaton is the equivalent of one million tons of TNT.

Hoch appeared on a recorded radio program with Dr. William Libby, an atomic energy consultant, and Dr. Charles Dunningham, an ABC scientist, Libby gave Hoch a scientific energy estimate.

"On the basis of these estimates," Dunningham said, "the effects of fallout from weapons testing to date on the average life span of individuals in this country would at the most be a matter of curtailing of a few days. This does not mean that every individual might not have a considerable curtailing of life span."

A new Hound Dog air-to-ground missile, a rocket designed to test equipment for the project aimed at putting a man into space, and a Thor ICBM were fired Thursday off the east and northwest coasts of Florida.

The Hound Dog, a 500-mile missile capable of carrying a nuclear warhead, was launched successfully from a B-52 bomber.

Officials said the debut of the 43-foot supersonic weapon was far enough out to sea so that it passed by virtually unnoticed at Cape Canaveral.

The air force reported a Thor ICBM hit the target after a highly successful flight from Cape Canaveral.

Good instrumentation was received during all stages of the 1,200-mile test aimed at improving accuracy and reliability of the Thor. The air force said a data capsule was recovered after it popped out of the nose cone at the end of the journey.

The air force said the firing was to test a deceleration parachute in support of the national aeronautics and space administration's "Project Mercury." The project is aimed at putting a man into space.

It was estimated the rocket reached an altitude of more than 13 miles.

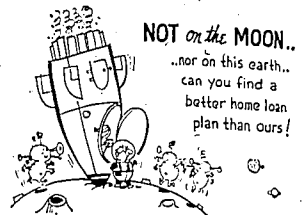
