WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—President Eisenhower called on Congress today for tightening of the senate's filibuster control at three points. 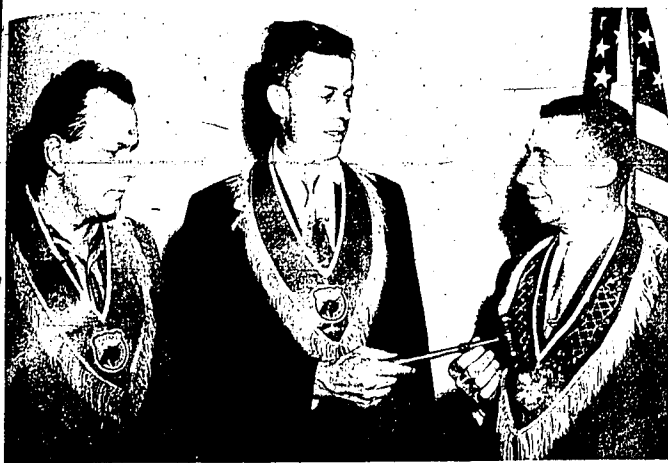

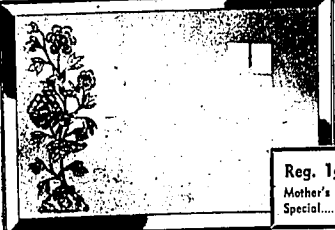

### High Altitude Blasts Urged In Small Size

WASHINGTON, April 22 (UPI)—The author of the Argus experiment called today for more high altitude atomic explosions but cautioned against contamination of space routes with hot bombs.

Nicholas C. Christofilos, who first proposed the tests carried out over the south Atlantic last summer, said more experiments are needed for scientific purposes. But he said such explosions must be kept small, like the Argus shot.

Christofilos, engaged in hydrogen power research at the University of California's Lawrence laboratory, participated in a symposium on Argus before members of the National Academy of Sciences. "The explosion of small bombs in outer space is completely harmless from the aspect of radiation hazards in outer space travel," he said. "However, explosions of megaton bombs equal to millions of tons of TNT in outer space can create a radiation hazard for the inter-space traveler.

In the Argus experiment three small atomic bombs, said to have been equal to about 1,000 tons of TNT, were exploded at an altitude of more than 300 miles.

### Big Blunder Seen in New Senate Office

WASHINGTON, April 22 (UPI)—Sen. Paul Douglas, D., Ill., mixed lead poetry with a lot of arithmetic today and charged that a colossal blunder has been made in construction of the new senate office building.

The new structure, like the old senate office building, will be connected with the capitol by a tunnel and a single-track underground railroad.

No Connection Made  
But, for reasons that are not clear, Douglas said the two tunnels will not connect, although the buildings are across the street from each other.

As a result, he told the senate, it is proposed to build another tunnel which will cover a little closer to the senate elevators and will cost four million dollars. 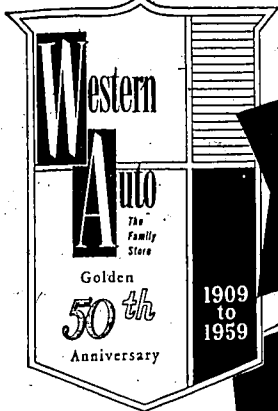

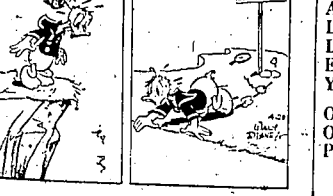
