## U.N. Init Hears Plea to Unite for Space Problems

UNITED NATIONS, May 6 (UPI)—The United States called today for world cooperation to solve problems of outer space through the United Nations. U. S. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge gave the keynote speech at the first meeting of the U. N. committee on the peaceful uses of outer space.

The committee was established by the general assembly last Dec. 12 even though Russia had warned that it would boycott any such meeting. The committee was composed of representatives from 12 nations, including the United States, France, Great Britain, the Soviet Union, and the United Arab Republic which took the neutralist view that the committee should be a technical body to recommend technical solutions to the problems of outer space.

Lodge told the 13 member nations existing that the space age demanded immediate international cooperation. He said the committee could chart the way for the United Nations in this field.

"The field of endeavor is too vast for any nation to explore on its own," he said. "It is a field in which the nations must cooperate if they are to reap the benefits of exploring the universe the right way. The nations must work together to make the most of the space age."

## Steel Firms Make Share Profits if One Plant Struck

NEW YORK, May 6 (AP)—The chief negotiator for the steel industry said today the industry is considering a mutual assistance plan to share profits if one of its companies are shut down by a strike, instead of the entire industry being struck. R. Conrad Cooper, chief negotiator for U. S. Steel corporation and the steel industry, told newsmen steel producers are considering a mutual aid strike plan similar to one adopted last fall by major airlines when faced with a rash of separated strikes.

Cooper emphasized that the industry first was concentrating on reaching a new contract agreement before present pact expires June 30.

### China Blasts Nehru, Tells Plan in Tibet

TOYO, May 6 (UPI)—Communist China ended today any Tibetan hope of independence or even self-government within the communist empire. It predicted total domination over the Tibetan rebellion has ended.

Peiping admitted the anti-communist uprising had spread to three mainland provinces stretching almost to inner Mongolia but said in the main the rebellion has been quashed.

An official red Chinese assessment of the Tibetan situation, a 12,000-word editorial in the official Peiping's Peoples Daily, was broadcast today by Peiping.

Nehru Criticized  
It gave Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, India's—drawing down for his statements on Tibet, it proclaimed total communist authority over the Himalayan kingdom ruled for centuries by a Dalai Lama.

"It warned that no interference by any foreign country or by the United Nations under whatever pretext or in whatever form will be tolerated."

The Peoples Daily said "armed rebellion" occurred in the Tibetan-inhabited areas of Szechwan, Kansu and Tsinling provinces and said these rebellions were "directed and instigated precisely by the reactionaries in Tibet."

Most of China Herdals  
These three provinces cover nearly one-third of the entire area of the mainland. Together with vast Sinkiang, the sparsely populated westernmost region of China where other anti-communist flurries have been reported, they make up half of China's area.

The newspaper took Nehru to task for "illogical thinking" on Tibet and for "interfering" in red China's affairs.

### Disease End Within Sight, Expert States

MCCALL, May 6 (AP)—An expert suggested yesterday that the end of tuberculosis may be near "the threshold of eradication of tuberculosis." But he emphasized "this" "threshold" has not yet been reached.

Jack Gleason, New York city, assistant to the managing director of the National Tuberculosis Association, spoke at the annual convention of the Idaho Tuberculosis Association.

13,000 Killed  
Gleason said in 1937 there were 10,000 new active cases of tuberculosis reported in the United States, 13,000 deaths. More than 700 million dollars in federal, state and local tax money is being spent on tuberculosis treatment and control.

"For all the seriousness of the situation as indicated by these figures," Gleason added, "they represent such an improvement over the problem as it existed 10 or 15 years ago that we are tempted to ask if we are standing at the threshold of eradication of tuberculosis."

Problem to Last Awhile  
Gleason said that although, by projecting developments in recent years into the future, he "comes up with some figures which indicate that by 1955 with continuing improvement our situation will still be quite serious."

"But we do hope, indeed," he added, "that it will be possible to alter current rates of development of new infection and the occurrence of active disease."

He said his organization, in cooperation with the U. S. public health service, is planning a national conference in the late fall or early winter to study problems associated with the possible near eradication of disease.
