### Secrecy for Foreign Aid Is Protested

WASHINGTON, May 7 (UP)—Sen. Frank Church, D., Idaho, protested today to Secretary of Defense Paul McNamara's proposal to use secrecy labels to withhold details of foreign aid from the public.

Church objected specifically to what he called "the classification process" by which information of military aid is withheld from the public by country breakdowns of overseas military aid.

McNamara was testifying before the Senate foreign relations committee in support of President Eisenhower's "foreign aid program."

**Funds OK Asked**

He asked the committee to keep the strength of NATO forces by voting the full \$1,000,000,000 authorized for military activities.

Church said that the foreign ministers conference at Geneva next week would be important to give special emphasis to U. S. military aid to support the mutual defense of the free world.

Church's Church nor Gen. Wayne Morse, D., Ore., was satisfied in having to go into closed session to discuss military aid breakdowns of where military aid is going.

**Secrecy Voted**

Church, supported by Morse, said he is "disturbed over the use of so-called information." He said information which the public is entitled to know is being kept secret.

McNamara supplied, at the open session, figures on where the \$1,000,000,000 in military aid would be used by areas, but reserved the breakdown by countries to a closed session which followed the open meeting.

Those who are inclined to minimize this country's rapid increase in juvenile delinquency should take time out to read a recent report to the U. S. senate by a subcommittee assigned to investigate the problem.

Two million American youngsters in the 10 through 17 age bracket will soon have juvenile court records, according to the subcommittee's estimate.

**SOCIALISM BY INDIRECTION**  
There has never been so successful open-and-shore social movement in this country. Yet we have been subjected to massive doses of socialism. It has been done by indirect means. Many people didn't even know what was happening.

**But what has happened?** Today TVA is the largest producer of electric power in the nation. Some \$2.5 billion worth of new construction is devoted to the production of electric power. Leaving a mere 10 percent for the other purposes for which it was intended.

### Plot Is Familiar

We may be accused of undue levity or of supercilious ignorance, but there's something about this "invasion" of Panama that reminds us of the 19th century opera bouffe of the same name.

Eighty or 90 men land on the coast of the 28,000-square-mile republic and take possession of some unheard of little village — Nombre de Dios. They warn that 300 more revolutionaries are on the way to join them.

The American public is immediately brought up to date on the military capabilities of Panama — 3,000 militia, being reinforced by American arms — and the defenses of the Canal zone.

They are alerted at the canal-tanks to the air on reconnaissance. American troops and aircraft to the imperiled area.

All right, we know that governments have been tested before by such comic operas. We know that in all seriousness there could be dire consequences. Still, we can't restrain a reminiscent smile.

### Anticipatory Obituary

This may be premature, but it's the kind of news that just won't wait. The word is out that rock 'n' roll music is on the wane.

At a convention of the National Federation of Music Clubs, an outfit that must feel like a government in exile surrounded by the hostile nations of rock 'n' roll, the following reports came in from music publishers and recording companies. The craze is fading.

"The musical authorities were pretty much agreed before but they're getting tired, and even the kids are getting tired of the incessant pounding. Never in history did so much music sound so much the same.

"Of course rock 'n' roll isn't exactly dead yet. It can start performing the old tunes and they ought to make delightful reading.

The only worry now is to that what comes after rock 'n' roll might be worse.

### French Senate: Middleweights

Perhaps the best thing about elections to the new French senate is that they reflect a decline in the power of the circles that brought President Gaullist to power.

They do not necessarily register the same amount of decline in his personal prestige, however. They may in fact bring the French national legislature some of the same balance that President de Gaulle had hoped for. This suffered as a result of a disproportionate victory by ultrarightists, many of whom managed to get into the Gaullist cabinet in the parliamentary elections last fall.

The new senate is constitutionally more powerful than the Fourth Republic's. It will be an equalizer, with the power of both the self-styled Gaullist Union of the New Republic and the Communists, and at some point a marked reminder to the senate of the Fourth Republic, the new senate may not be too far out of line with President de Gaulle's intention to keep France away from the middle road that the lower house promoted — Christian Science Monitor.

## Rockefeller's Suit for Divorce Future Eyed

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—Gov. Nelson Rockefeller's agreement to let Capitol Hill Republicans honor his request today that he may be the first stringing of a presidential nomination bid.

Rep. Carroll Reece, R., Tenn., said the New York governor will be the honor guest at a luncheon picnic of the Capitol Hill club June 11. Rockefeller is one of the founders of the club, which Vice President Richard M. Nixon is a member. Reece now is club president.

The group, made up mostly of conservative Republicans, operates a club room with a bar, about a block from the Capitol. It has honored Nixon and other leading Republicans at similar affairs.

It was not so much the invitation but Rockefeller's acceptance of it that intrigued Republicans who have been speculating about the possibility that the New York governor might be Nixon's principal—and possibly sole—opponent for the 1960 GOP presidential nomination.

Previously Rockefeller has turned down all invitations for political gatherings outside of New York state.

Judges throughout the state will use their discretion in recommending to the commissioner the number of demerit points they assign to the records of individuals convicted of any of the violations.

Drivers who accumulate 100 points within a 12-month period will be notified in writing that the department is law enforcement agencies to suspend his license within 30 days of such notice, or the driver can request a hearing. If the revocation is held in the county where he resides.

### Firm Named To Construct New Rockets

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—The government yesterday hired General Dynamics corporation to supervise construction of powerful Vega space rockets to be used in explorations of the moon and the planets.

The national aeronautics and space administration announced the award of a 33½-million dollar contract to General Dynamics' Convair Division.

Convair is to build eight of the Vegas by the end of 1961.

NASA said Vega should be able to push itself a two-tone speed laboratory that could carry several men in a 300-mile orbit around the Earth for several weeks.

The Atlas talking satellite this country sent up last December had a total weight of about 8,000 pounds including the rocket carrier, but only 150 pounds of instruments.

Vega represents the first of our

more advanced boosters," NASA Administrator T. Keith Glennan said in a statement. "The practical job will be lunar and planetary investigations."

General Electric company received a \$4,120,000 contract to make liquid-fueled, 34,000-pound thrust engines for Vega's second stage.

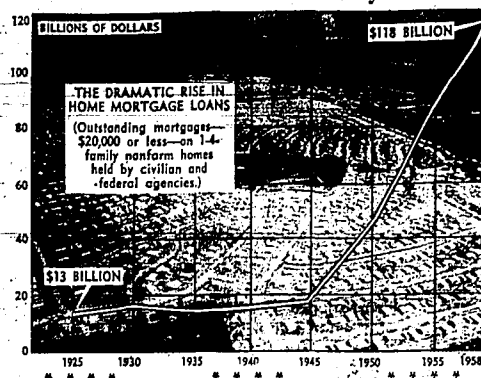

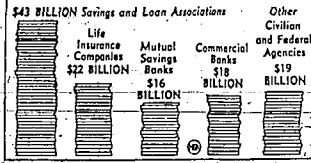

### Definition of U.S. Farm in Act Changing

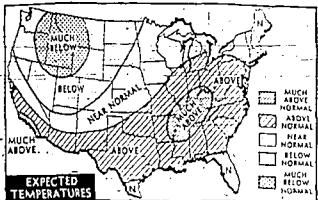
A new definition of a farm, one that will apply to the entire country, is being set by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in a new law. The act, which will take effect this year, is designed to bring the definition of a farm in line with that of the other countries of the world.

The new law will define a farm as a place where at least one acre of land is used for the production of crops, or where the land is used for the production of livestock, or where the land is used for the production of both crops and livestock.

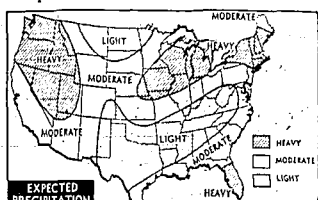
The new law also will define a farm as a place where the owner or operator of the farm is engaged in the business of farming, or where the owner or operator of the farm is engaged in the business of both farming and other business.

### Frenchman Says British Get Jokes Before Americans Do

NEW YORK, May 7 (AP)—As the world's news already lags, the Frenchman who says the British can see the point of a joke quicker than Americans can, says he has found a difference between the two nations.

"The French are a gag country," he says. "They laugh quicker, louder, and shorter than here. They give a hearty laugh, then quit, and you have to have another one ready."

"The American laugh is slower and longer," he says. "They take more time to see the point of a joke, but when they do, they laugh heartily and for a long time."

Hoyle, who is a Frenchman, is the author of a book called "The Frenchman's Point of View." He is also a humorist and a writer for the French press.

"Few revues in Paris last as long as six months," he said. "And people there look their tickets up a few days ahead of time."

"Here a man and his wife may buy their tickets as much as four months ahead. Then on the night of the show their seats are empty."

"When I see this it makes me mad," he said. "I can only suppose they have different standards of humor."

One American theatrical customer which both Hoyle and Collette, his blonde wife and costar, find an utter abomination is the matinee audience.

"I like it here because the audience comes to the theater ready to have fun and enjoy itself," he said. "In France they go to see whether they can make their money. There is a difference."

Asked what impressed them most about America, Collette said: "On matinee days she has to change her clothes 24 times. If she did that in France they would say she was a prostitute."

Hoyle, the slender middle-aged man of a Chadwick malar has been in the U.S. for 20 years. He is also one of the busiest revue directors in France, Paris.

**Fruit Listed**  
Fruit bins will offer apples, oranges, grapefruit and lemons at excellent buys, while some markets will feature bananas and strawberries.

Fish counters will have good supplies of shrimp, fish and canned tuna for week-end shoppers.

These are the week-end's best food buys for the country as a whole. Here is more detailed information for this area.

Eggs, particularly the medium and small sizes, are in excessive supply and prices have declined a cent or two a dozen in some markets.

Fryer chickens are plentiful and are being featured in some markets. Among the red meats, pork is in the best supply, and prices are steady to slightly lower in some markets. Beef is in moderate supply and prices are steady to slightly higher.

**Butter Supply Ample**  
Butter supplies are ample for the demand in all markets, and prices are one cent a pound lower this week.

Shoppers will find increasing supplies of cantaloupes and cherries from California production areas, and plentiful supplies of apples, grapefruit, lemons, oranges, strawberries, asparagus, artichokes, cauliflower, celery, carrots, lettuce, onions, sweet potatoes, turnips and tomatoes.

Among best fish buys are rockfish, halibut, salmon and dungeness crabs.

Now grown old, he has started denouncing all his old colleagues in it, and giving advice to the whole, wide world in it.

Let us not criticize Monty for his intemperate outbursts, be they by book or TV.

He is not to blame—the beret is. It has long been known that steady wearing of a beret affected the wearer's head. The beret owes its popularity to its snugness.
