Governor Finds New Scheme in Michigan Crisis

LANSING, Mich., Aug. 8 (AP)—Gov. G. Mennen Williams today asked state lawmakers to hear a new proposal for solving Michigan's cash crisis that left 26,000 state employees unpaid Thursday and threatened the state's public credit rating. His request to address a joint legislative session required house and senate approval. Neither chamber acted immediately. The Democratic governor's announcement came after house defeat of a senate-approved Republican bill for a one-cent increase in the sales tax, making it four cents.

The governor and legislature have been at loggerheads for months over rival plans for curbing state money woes, with Williams advocating a personal income tax and Republicans plugging for the sales tax increase.

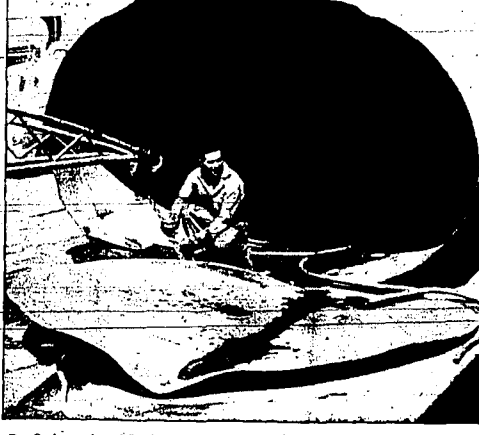
A bill which would provide an immediate 43 million dollars in emergency treasury funds is bound up in the deadlock. Williams repeatedly has demanded its passage. The Democratic governor's bill would come only on prior acceptance of the sales tax.

Michigan's financial dilemma stems from a drop in tax revenue during the 1958 recession and an increase in expenditures, mainly for unemployment compensation.

The governor would not give any more money to the legislature. He said it was obvious neither side could write a tax project without consent of the other and it's time reasonable men at the state level stepped back to end this disastrous situation.

"Michigan's paydays parties are political in nature," Sen. Lynn O. Johnston, Republican majority leader, said. "They are the result of a war between the two parties. The governor on Republicans in the legislature," he added.

U.S. Urges Soviet to Seek 'Honest' Results in Parley

WASHINGTON, May 8 (UPI)—The United States formally urged the Soviet Union today to seek honest, fruitful results at the East-West foreign ministers conference which gets under way in Geneva Monday. In a note to Moscow made public shortly before Secretary of State Christian A. Herter left for the conference, the United States also urged the Soviet Union to make every effort to bring the negotiations to a successful conclusion.

Herter took off at 2:15 p.m. EDT, after a plane-side statement that he was leaving in a "hopeful spirit." He said he had no expectation of success in Geneva and that negotiations with the Soviet Union were "not too high" and that the Soviet Union had a "tremendous amount of patience" is needed.

WASHINGTON (NPA)—An effort to get congress to pass special legislation restricting imports on foreign produced fluorine and setting basic quotas at \$100,000 a year has been made by the U. S. House of Representatives.

But if the bill introduced by Sen. Gordon Allott, R. Colo., should slip through, it is feared that it might open the gates to other restraints on tariff restrictions by act of congress. This was the way tariff rates were set before the Reciprocity Act of 1923. It would not mean that the U. S. would return to this long rolling might cause world-wide tariff chaos.

There's another angle on the Allott bill which is the fact that it would require the secretary of interior to fix the amount of production for mines that sell fluorine on the open market.
