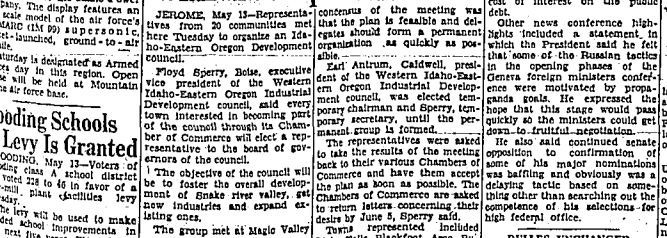
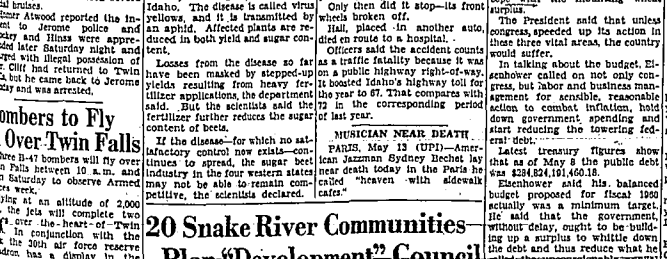
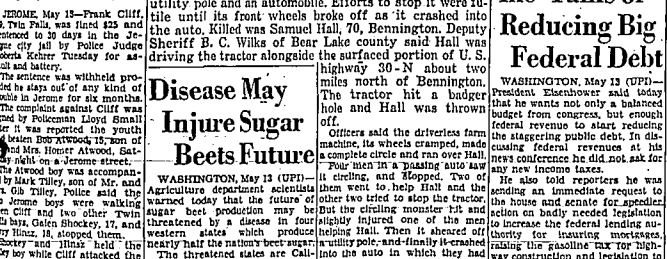

High frequency radio, used in wireless communications, is particularly affected.

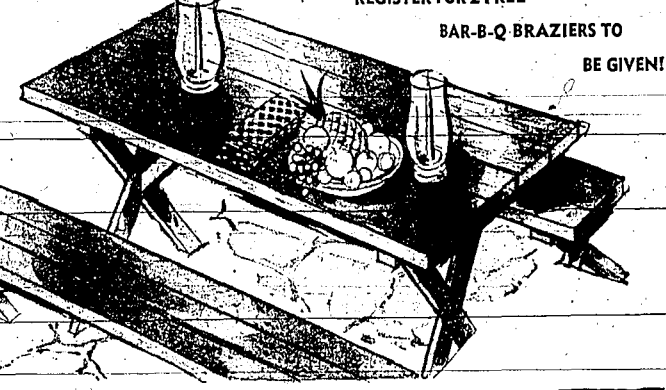

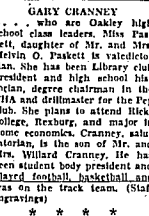

### 'Brain Trust' Is Needed to Counter Russ

WASHINGTON, May 13 (UPI)—The state department today set up a "brain trust" whose sole duty would be to master-mind global political and economic warfare against the communists.

The plan was disclosed today when a house appropriations subcommittee made public testimony given last February by state department officials.

It is an offensive figurehead under Secretary of State C. Douglas Dillon, deputy undersecretary Loy W. Henderson and others warned that the communist offensive had picked up to such an extent that the United States had to move fast to counteract it.

"They urged that congress provide enough money to create a special staff that would devote full-time to analyzing the situation and move to combat them."

The plan drew a cool reaction from subcommittee chairman Rooney, D. N. Y., who said he thought the state department had been doing just that for the past 15 years.

Henderson explained that the Soviet economic offensive has grown in strength by about 30 times during the last two years. Never have the communists acted so sure a broad systematic scale, he said.

The Better Business bureau finds complaints about home improvement and remodeling jobs leads all others.

Most contractors are honest and reliable—but they are a little tricky. They don't decrease the designation "contractors" who are very artists, the bureau warns.

Here are some tips from the Better Business bureau collected from several of its pamphlets and published and distributed by the Bureau of National Affairs, a private Washington organization.

Watch out for the fact talker, the smoothie who promises you nearly everything for practically nothing. In fact, he has a "receipt" in his pocket ready for your signature even though he's making his first bid to your house.

That "receipt" may well be a contract which obligates you to sell storm doors, adding porch enclosures, paint jobs, new roofs or most anything else.

Watch out for the lines of your house. That's why it's been selected as a model home for our low-cost aiding job," the salesman says.

Or: "We've been checking around. You folks are looking up on this street. People like you...

That's why we want our new... with the \$25 you get for every... we bring around, it won't cost you a cent. You may even make money."

It sounds good. You start to... man turns the contract over... a regular construction contract... and bills you. As for those... who are worth \$25 apiece... you, forget it. You won't see them... or the man who promised them...

To avoid getting stuck when... remodel or repair, you can... Consult an architect. He'll... you what would be best... and what it would cost... Check with a lawyer, especially... if you're going to sign a... contract, guarantee or other... fully and make sure it says... you think it says.

Don't patronize a contractor... know something about him. Get... his price against someone else... When a job is completed... you be sure your receipt... you have paid in full.
