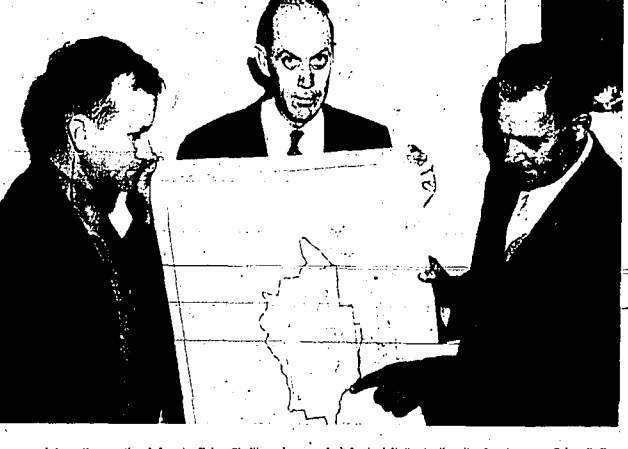

Man's Towers of Scrap Now Causing Feuds in California

LOS ANGELES, May 27 (AP)—The Los Angeles area is being hit by a new kind of scrap metal war. It is believed that the living in the northern California town of Martinez—far from the clamor of art-versus-safety—

That's the way they often explain why he spent 30 years building an aggregation of towers, walls, fountains and pediments—all from scrap material—in the Watts district of Los Angeles.

The Watts towers are they called. One is 100 feet high. Art critics and municipal authorities are squabbling over what to do with them.

Inspections show these structures are dangerous and should be torn down, said H. L. Manley, of the department of building and safety.

Beam's towers were constructed without preconceived design. He started in 1951 by building a framework of rods. He placed wire mesh around this and then applied his own special mixture of cement.

For decoration there are imprints of hands, tools and corn cobs along with 25,000 sea shells and thousands of pieces of bright crockery or tile. An estimated 7,000 sacks of cement and thousands of broken bottles were used in the project.

The property was purchased by film editor William Cartwright and actor Nicholas King with the idea of preserving a work of primitive art.

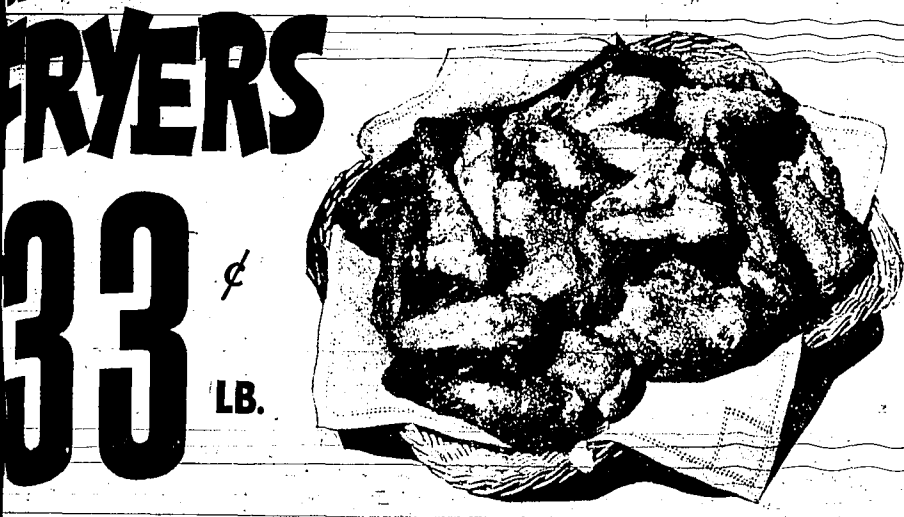

WASHINGTON, May 27 (UPI)—A trigger-happy fugitive with a weakness for crossword puzzles and crime was placed on the FBI's list of 10 most wanted criminals today.

Richard Allen Hunt, 45, is already known to police in the Pacific Northwest as extremely dangerous. He has shot one policeman, kidnapped another at gunpoint and in the past refused arrest by kidnapping a policeman. He boasts of being a cop-hater and has a violent temper.

Hunt, a native of Salem, Ore., is a man of varied talents with a will-to-the-wisp ability to evade arrest. He is described as an industrious worker who is "quiet, shy and intelligent."

The fugitive is skilled at outdoor living and is able to travel through desolate and wooded areas with little difficulty. Hunt frequently hitchhikes at night and sleeps during the day in the open or in barns and abandoned buildings.

Hunt is a camera and gun enthusiast who has worked in camera shops. Although his experience as

Regulation in Idaho Mental Centers Told

BOISE, May 27 (AP)—Alcoholics were served notice yesterday they may not consider Idaho mental institutions a haven.

This policy was given general agreement by heads of State Hospital North, Orofino; State Hospital South, Blackfoot, and Nampa State school, said state Health Administrator Terrell O. Carver.

The 1952 legislature revised admission procedure to provide that patients are committed not directly to the institution itself, but to the state board of health, he said.

The board may discharge the patient, such as an alcoholic, immediately if it believes its institutions are not prepared to handle treatment for him.

Under the agreed policy, which has yet to be formally adopted, Carver said, "acute alcoholic episodes are considered to be medical emergencies and not psychiatric emergencies." Patients admitted on an emergency basis will be discharged as promptly as possible.

Persons addicted to alcohol who seek mental treatment must agree to remain for a stated period of time, long enough to complete the treatment, he added.

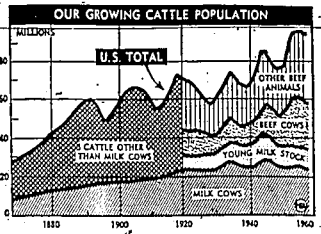

Speaker Cites Vast Changes In Agriculture in 40 Years

Vertical integration has slipped through the many, and rapid technological changes of the past 40 years, Dr. Kenneth Hood, director of commodity division, U.S. Agricultural Bureau, told a group of Twin Falls farmers at a recent meeting.

"It is not a question of whether it is good or bad. Vertical integration is here, and it is the sheer force of numbers to believe it is a curse to American agriculture," Dr. Hood declared. He said it is the sheer force of power, it is here, good or bad, and the question is, who controls it? What are we going to do about it?

The speaker said vertical integration is only one of the many commodity problems in Idaho and the future of agriculture. The future of agriculture, Dr. Hood pointed out, largely on what we can do in this commodity field. It is 250 million agricultural commodities present some problems of their own.

Vertical integration is one example of what has grown out of the agricultural revolution, Dr. Hood pointed out. "The revolution has brought about more changes in the past 40 years than in all the previous 300 years."

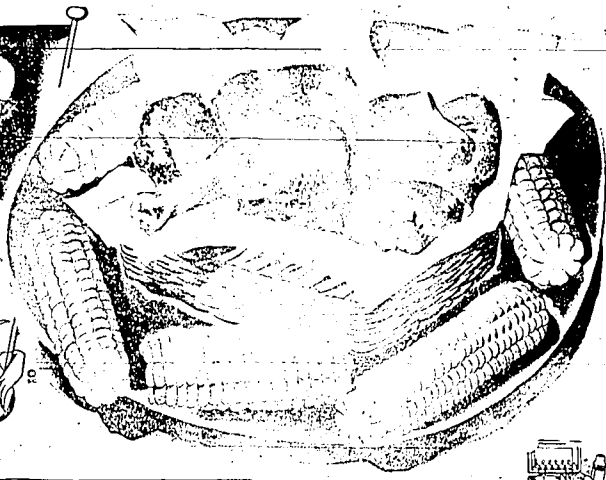

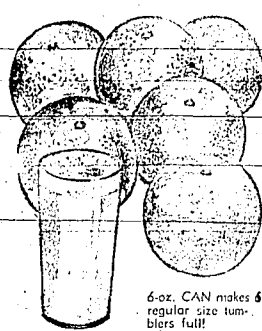

Merger Plan Reported for Mining Firms

WASHINGTON, May 27 — A plan was announced yesterday to liquidate and drop the Libson corporation from a proposed merger of mining firms operating in the Rocky Mountain area.

Floyd B. Odium, president of Atlas Corporation of New York, said Libson will be dropped from the proposal to merge it with the Hidden Splendor, the De Oro, the Elmer King and Mountain Atlas uranium mining companies. Atlas owns Hidden Splendor.

Made at Hearing
Odium's announcement was made at a securities and exchange commission hearing on the Atlas application.

The announcement was made after a series of conferences between officials of Atlas and attorneys for minority stockholders groups of the firms to be merged. A group of Rio De Oro stockholders has withdrawn its opposition to the merger, but Atlas was unable to persuade the Libson group to follow suit.

Offered Increase
Odium said the minority groups were offered a five per cent increase in stock in exchange for their stock in Libson.

Atlas Libson holders still will be given an opportunity to get preferred stock in exchange for their Libson shares. If the Libson stock is dropped from the merger plan, Odium said.

The Hidden Splendor and Elmer King officials own more than 80 per cent of the outstanding Libson stock, and they will be in a position to liquidate Libson after the other firms are consolidated.

Most Interested
He said he has received a belief that about 93 per cent of the Libson holders will be interested in exchanging their stock for preferred stock of the merged Hidden Splendor company.

The hearing has been running intermittently since November. Odium said speed is an important factor in his company's plan, and that Atlas would rather drop Libson than go through several more months of hearings.

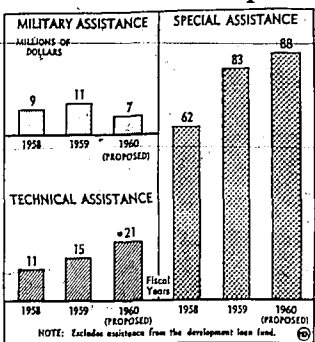

By accepting every time somebody asked me to make a speech," he said. "Every time you make a talk, it throws that old trouble back just a little further."

Solons From Montana Get OK'd Projects

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—Montanans in congress have been calling for resource conservation and development programs affecting most of the nation but particularly the West. Some results are being obtained.

The Montana delegation claims several firsts, such as a million-dollar forest fire research laboratory soon to be built at Missoula and a comprehensive program of steps necessary to make full use of the state's timber resources.

Lipshitz study set.

Researchers at the laboratory will study the cause and behavior of timber fires, and look for ways to take the sting out of lightning—which starts 70 per cent of the forest fire in the Rocky mountain area.

The survey, made by Regional Forester Charles L. Tabor, is being considered as a model for similar studies proposed for other states.

Montana congressmen, along with other westerners, have sought for years to have the department of agriculture come up with a long range conservation-development plan for federal forests.

Such a program, which would cost an estimated \$3,000,000 over a 10-year period, has been submitted to the forest service.

Proposed forest service.

Westerners have uniformly praised the proposal, which calls for stepped up timber cutting, tree planting, flood control, and other work in the forests.

Cost of the program eventually would be repaid by revenue from timber sales.

Sen. James E. Murray, D., Mont., says interior department officials have agreed to prepare and submit a comparable program for public lands administered by the interior's bureau of land management.

Earlier this month the senate passed a Mansfield-Murray bill creating a special senate committee on national water resources. The group will make a two-year study of water resource needs and development possibilities.

Surgery Plan Reported for Mental Cases

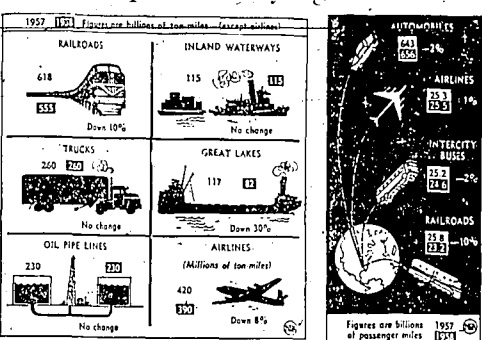
