Turnover for Labor Supply Boosts Costs

NEW YORK, June 15 (UPI)—Labor turnover is costly in many industries, especially those competing with cheap labor from abroad.

The rate of turnover varies widely among industries and is particularly prevalent among those that produce goods that are perishable or that require a high degree of skill.

It is particularly true of older industries who often will remain idle for weeks at a time rather than hire new workers. They'd rather wait for the chance to be called back to work than to start in a new industry at the bottom of the market.

Parents Still Aren't Aware of Fire Was Set

JACKSON, Mich., June 15 (UPI)—Dorren Baker and his wife, Alice, knew they were burned extensively in a fire that started in their home last night when their five-year-old son set the house on fire. But they don't know that their daughter, Dorren, 14, and their son, Bruce, 13, had admitted to pouring gasoline on the bed in which their parents lay sleeping Friday.

Mr. Baker's Fair

Physicians said that knowledge of the children's admission might have given them a better chance of recovery. Baker, 62, was burned on the face, arms and abdomen. Mrs. Baker, 58, was reported in fair condition.

"We just didn't think about it," Dorren told police. "We were just all mixed up, I guess."

"I didn't realize it would be so terrible," Bruce sobbed. "I wish now we hadn't done it."

Parents Said too Silly

"The brother and sister told officers they set the fire because they felt their parents were too strict. We thought if we got rid of them, we could have some things we wanted to," police quoted Dorren as saying.

Bruce had been thinking about it for a week," Dorren told officers. "At first we thought of beating them to death with hammers, but we thought that would be too risky."

Mr. Baker was running around the house screaming with his hair afire when neighbors came to the house last night. Police pulled Baker from the burning bedroom.

Stevenson Is Still Possible '60 Candidate

WASHINGTON, June 15 (UPI)—Don't count Adlai Stevenson or Hubert H. Humphrey as likely candidates for the 1960 Democratic presidential election, says Sen. Mike Mansfield.

But the assistant senate Democratic leader said he thinks as of today and that Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey, D-Minn., and Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Mo., have increased their activities.

Nixon Win Seen

On the other side of the political fence, Sen. Hugh Scott, R. Pa., predicted Vice President Richard M. Nixon will win the Republican nomination.

Sen. G. W. Nelson, R. Rockefeller, will lead the ticket chosen from some 100 names.

When Stevenson arrived here to attend week-end meetings of the Democratic advisory council, he brought along a scintillating answer for what has become to him the unending question: "Are you in?"

"I am not a candidate for the nomination and will not be nominated," Stevenson said.

He said he had no intention of being nominated for the office.

Michigan's Gov. G. Mennen Williams told a television audience yesterday Stevenson "is a real possibility."

Mansfield made it clear he is not discounting senate Democratic leader Johnson as a contender, either, despite Johnson's frequent statements that he isn't running and doesn't expect to be nominated.

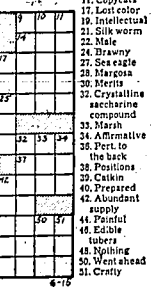

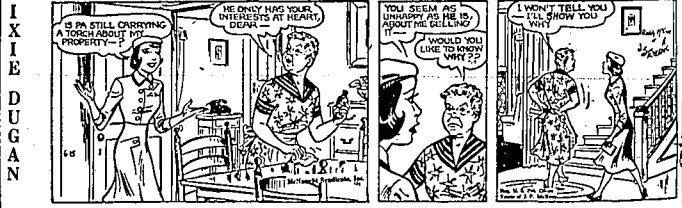

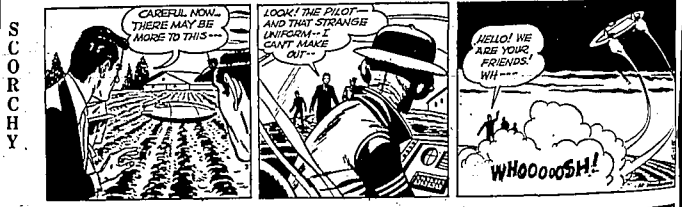
