Nine delegates will represent Twin Falls American Legion post No. 1 at the annual state Legion convention to be held here next week.

Lella recently was elected commander of the post for the forthcoming year and will be installed by the fifth district commander after the state convention.

Francis J. Moore, Stillwater, Okla., national Legion commander will arrive at the Twin Falls airport by airplane at 4 p. m. Friday and will speak at the banquet that night. Other high national leaders will be on hand.

The convention parade, which will begin at 2 p. m. Friday, is expected to last for at least two hours. Robert Richards, state convention parade chairman, reports the parade will march down Main avenue with the fourth Legion district leading. The fourth district includes posts from Gooding, Wendou, Fairfield, Bliss and Hagerman.

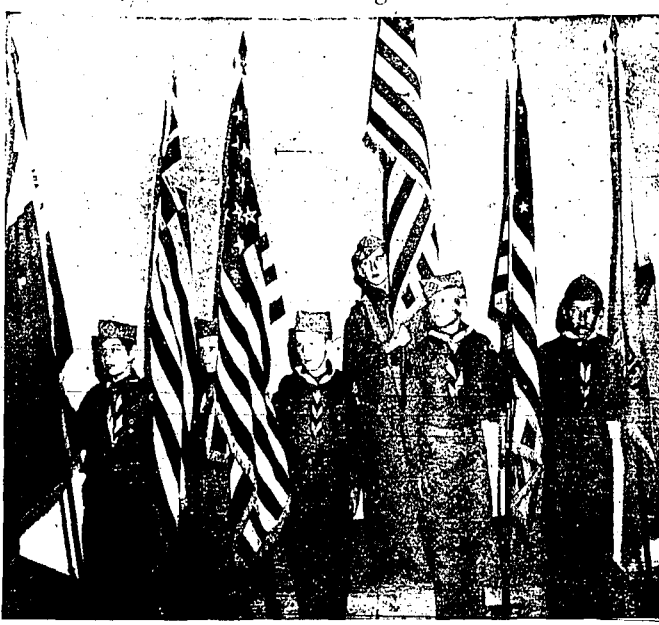
Arrangement of the parade will be made by firing several cannon shots at count-down intervals prior to the start and three rounds to start the parade movement.

Three projects of aerial spraying by airplane have been completed in area forest lands, reports J. H. Peterson, administrative officer of the Sawtooth national forest.

Two were located near Fairfield and the third near Oakley. Spray used on the neighborhood was a mixture of diesel fuel and 2, 4-D. It was used at a rate of three gallons of mix to one acre. Peterson remarked that the spray is effective in killing sawtooth spruce although final results won't be visible until next spring. The purpose is to encourage grass to grow, thereby making the land better for grazing purposes.

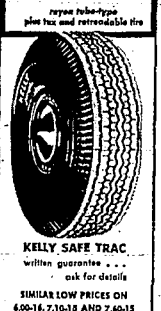

### Rules to 'Bar' Officials Are Proposed

**BOISE, June 19**—A rule which would bar lawyers elected to public office from appearing as counsel in certain cases will be proposed to the Idaho State Bar at its convention in Sun Valley next month.

W. H. Hanley, Boise, president of the Third District Bar association, said Thursday the proposition has been circulated among lawyers in this area.

He said it is the outgrowth of a controversy in the senate of the 1959 legislature. The senate approved a rule which specified that no member or associate of a law firm where one member or associate of such firm is a member of either house of the legislature, shall be permitted to appear before any committee of the senate.

The rule was adopted in a motion of Sen. Vernon Daniel, R., Puyallup, a lawyer, who said that some lawyers members of the legislature introduced bills to give an associate an opportunity to lobby.

Hanley said the proposed rule, which would forbid a lawyer from appearing before a committee of the legislature, could be effective, especially if any lawyer elected to any public office, including the legislature, is considered as a lobbyist.

Hanley said he is not sure whether it is actively or passively proposed or pending before the public body of which he is a member or by which he is employed.
