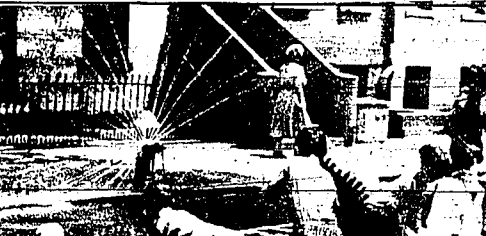

Two young brothers were electrocuted by their father in the basement of their home at Glen Burnie, Md. The victims were Daniel Doyle, 9, and his 7-year-old brother, Michael. They were the stepchildren of Chief Petty Officer Warren Doyle and his wife, Vera.

In Indianapolis, a bolt of lightning struck down Gary Kinser, 10, as he crouched at third base during a Little League baseball game. The bolt tipped off his clothing and he fell into a second hole where he stood. He also knickered down Gary's playmate, Robert Lottner, 11, and Robert's father, Earl.

Jerome Anthony Brown, 7, apparently climbed into an electric dryer at a self service laundry in Oklahoma City, Okla., because he wanted to ride in the drum, police said.

A neighbor saw the boy walking toward the laundry in his pajamas about 8 a. m. Tuesday. At 8 a. m. two housewives noticed the dryer vibrating and called a mechanic. The mechanic found the Negro boy's charred, mangled body. The boy's mother, Mrs. Dorothy Brown, charged that her son—a mentally retarded child—was the victim of a cruel prank by other children.

But police Homeless Inspector Y. B. Bena said there was no evidence that the boy was forced into the dryer. At New York City's Idlewild airport, a mystery gunshot Tuesday night wounded John Steinmetz, Jr., 17 months old, as he was held in his parents' arms.

The bullet grazed his scalp and nicked his left ear. Customs officials speculated that the bullet might have been accidentally discharged but found no gun in a search of hundreds of pieces of luggage.

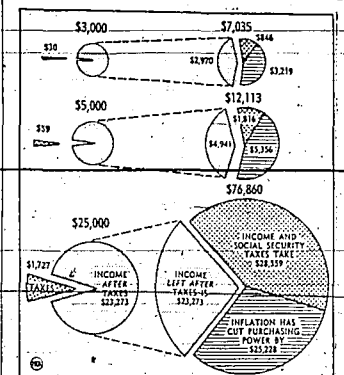

### New Highway Job Contracts To Be Given

BOISE, July 1 (UPI)—The Idaho highway department plans to let 11 million dollars worth of road projects in the next three weeks, including big interstate jobs near Caldwell and Mountain Home.

State Highway Engineer Bruce Bennett says today that a three-million dollar interstate project will be let in the Caldwell area. The 11-mile job will widen the interstate highway now under construction west of Caldwell toward Oregon line.

The other big job is a 14 1/2-mile contract to build 17 miles of interstate road to hook up with another project between Boise and Clear Lake Mountain Home.

Three projects and about \$300,000 worth of other state projects will bring to more than 14 million dollars the amount of roadwork contracted this year by the state highway department, Bennett said.

For the calendar year, the department plans to contract for record 30 million dollars worth of road construction, two-thirds of it on the interstate system.

The previous record of 29 million dollars for federal-aid highway construction in the state (exclusive of forest highways) was set last year.

### Franco Finds Controlling of Spaniards Is More Difficult

Generalissimo Francisco Franco is finding it increasingly difficult to control the restless Spaniards.

His government has disclosed that the Spanish parliament soon will be asked to pass a drastic new law dealing with crimes against the state or public order which on government command—abolish all liberties either in business or private life.

The sweeping law establishes penalties for crimes on a front ranging from an illegal rise in prices to possession of arms at public meetings and against police officers.

It also grants the government powers ranging from the right to enter private homes without a search warrant to seizure of factories.

There is no hint at the moment any organized attempt to oust Franco from the firm control he has exercised over Spain since the end of the bloody Spanish civil war 30 years ago.

The real reason which now grips the Spanish people arises from circumstances which put them present unsatisfactory and their future uncertain.

Internationally, Spain no longer is in the diplomatic deep freeze into which she was plunged after World War II as result of her connections with the German-Italian Japanese axis. She is a member of the United Nations and U. S. troops are also commanding bombers take off from bases on her soil.

She has received in the neighborhood of one billion dollars from the United States in dollar loans, good, raw materials, food and agricultural and power development.

But Spain is in the midst of a severe economic crisis. She has overreached herself in an attempt to speed industrialization. Her national budget is running into the red at the rate of 300 million dollars a year. An accompanying condition has been severe inflation which is the im-

LOUISVILLE, Ky., July 1.—(AP)—The Rev. John E. Weir's new church shocks the public, he'll be happy. It will include a swimming pool, tennis court, snack bar, an unloading ramp for motorcars, and the largest outdoor church building in the city.

U. S., Russia Race to Make New Zig-zag Ballistic Missile

WASHINGTON (NEA) — U. S. and Soviet scientists are racing to develop a revolutionary intercontinental ballistic missile one that will zig and zag in the sky at 15,000 miles an hour—so fast that it will be virtually impossible to shoot down. These more complicated missiles will even anticipate Minuteman and other advanced missiles now on U. S. drawing boards. It will also make the vaunted billion-dollar Nike-Zeus anti-missile system obsolete before it is ever in continent-wide operation. That's the real reason the defense department is dragging its heels on Nike-Zeus production plans in the face of heavy congressional pressure to get ahead with the program. It is the reason Defense Secretary McNamara doesn't want to build a big stockpile of present day ICBM's just in time for the new Russian missile to make them all antiquated. It's also the reason McNamara doesn't think the Russians are going to make the big number of ICBM's that a lot of people are predicting. Says one Pentagon missile man: "They don't want to get caught with a lot of out-of-date missiles on their hands any more than we do." Present-day ballistic missiles are designed to fly straight and true. They go on a known arc directly to their target. It is possible for an enemy to check a missile's speed and path early in flight—to figure out exactly where it's going to go and change its course. Once you've developed the right kind of observing and tracking system, says one missile man, it's a 15,000-mile-an-hour stinging duck. It's a stinging duck that means that within less than a decade it will be fairly simple to defend against the present-type ballistic missile. The new missile, however, will zig and zag like an open field football runner. It will carry one or several small charges one for each side or rear. Some time during flight—perhaps several times—the small charges will fire and change the course of the missile to a new course impossible for the enemy to predict. Only the men who planned the zig-zag course would know it. It would thus be possible to have this type of ballistic missile head straight for one target, then, at the last minute, zig to another target too late for defending missiles to get at it. All-missile missile defense systems based on predictions of where the missile was going to be would fire at where the missile was supposed to be, but it wouldn't be there. It would be out on another course to target. Eventually it will be possible, say the experts, to put all sorts of weapons into the ballistic missile's path. It will be virtually impossible to shoot down at 15,000 miles an hour, at least by present concepts. "But don't worry," says one defense department missile man. "By the time someone will have thought up some new defense sim-

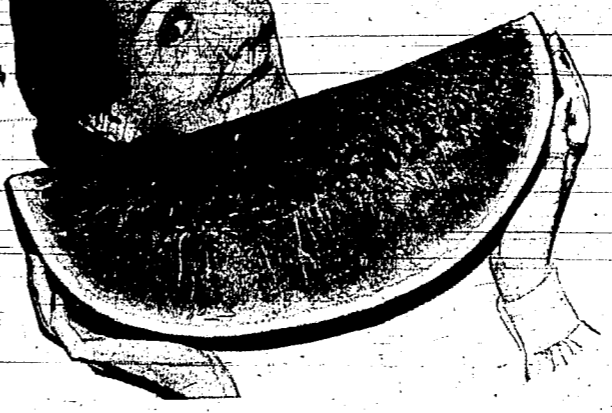

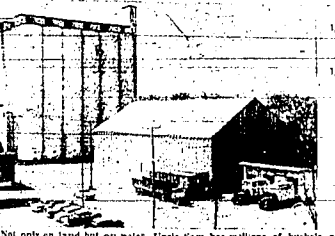

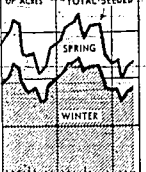

Surplus Grain Is Stored Here and There

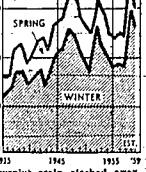

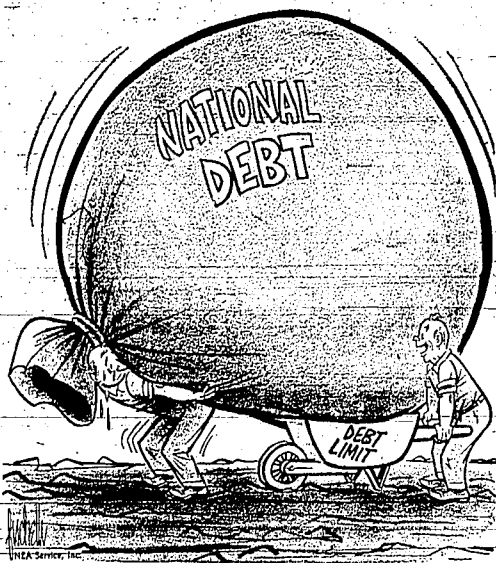
**Pork Is Still Low**
