The survey also shows that 70.1 per cent of the voters support the budget and economy program of the Eisenhower administration. Typical Work Of Air Force Is Expensive

WASHINGTON, July 2 (UPI)—The air force says its job there is not to build the new air force bases, but to take care of the old ones. In fact, the general program is to take care of the old ones, but the new ones are being built just like air force work everywhere.

That, apparently, was just what the contractors feared.

Take, for example, the new hospital in the county of Normandy, France.

Rep. Melvin R. Laird, R., Wis., said in 1955 this 1,000-bed hospital turned up among top priority projects for the state.

Contractors had to do the necessary masonry and about a year ago the hospital was finished. They built nurses' home, barracks and other buildings. They brought in the latest surgical gear, X-ray machines and other fancy equipment.

Weeks Grow Tall

So Laird, on a tour of overseas bases a few weeks ago, stopped by to see how it worked out. He could hardly see the place for the weeds. "Do you mean the weeds are growing so tall that you can't see the building?" he asked Rep. Charles R. McNair, R., Ky.

Both Laird and McNair replied. There was nobody there but a few fellows maintaining a fire tower and a few others who had been opened.

Rep. Gen. John K. Cullen, explaining things for the air force, said the trouble was, troops stationed in France "has been markedly reduced" since the hospital plans were made.

Now "U.S. Would Be Nice If We Ever Finish Building It"

NEW YORK, July 2 (UPI)—The labor and commerce department says it would be nice if the U.S. ever finishes building its new steel plants. Construction for the United States is a whole lot proceeding slowly at present here.

It is likely that the entire year will be a new peak. "The thing that is most important is that the production of steel is one of the industries that are being cut out of mortgage funds. But the construction industry is confident for the long run. After all, the backbone of needs for homes, schools, highways, schools, hospitals and various public buildings is to go on. That whether or not buildings can be put into operation into

The labor and commerce department reports that the value of construction put in place in June is a record for the month. The spending is put at 25 billion dollars, the first six months of 1959, a record year.

Much of the increase over last year has been in home building. It is 10 billion dollars, the year's record. The construction industry analysts expect this pace to slow. One of them, George Cline Smith, secretary of the F. W. Dodge corporation, however, says, "I don't expect the decline to be very sharp."

The doctors said the chances that the baby will have the disease are very increased by the fact that both parents have it.

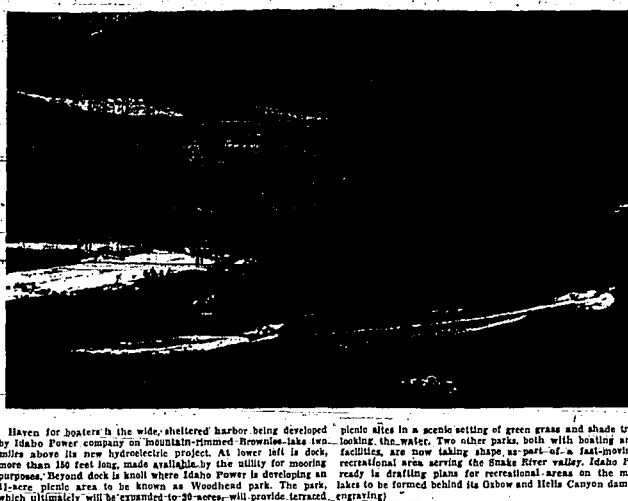
