GENEVA, July 17 (AP)—The foreign ministers of the Soviet Union and the Western bloc today failed to make any progress in narrowing their differences over a possible Berlin traffic agreement. U. S. Secretary of State Christian A. Hoffer, British Foreign Minister Maurice Coussage, De Gaulle of France and Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko debated the terms of a Berlin stillstand deal in a three-hour luncheon meeting at Couve de Murville's villa. The session was covered by a secret agreement and Western officials would say afterward—only that no progress was achieved.

### Timetable of America's Space Exploration Activity Revealed

ALAMOGORDO, N. M., July 17 (AP)—The Alamogordo Daily News published Thursday a detailed breakdown of the means and timing the United States will use to put man into space and on the moon. The News, in a copyrighted story by reporter Hal Witt, outlined the U. S. space program. The next step, the paper said, will be the firing of one or more chimpanzees into orbit this fall. The program as outlined by the paper called for the firing of the first moon rocket by late 1961 or early 1962. If that firing is successful, the United States in 1965 or 1966 will fire the Nova—zero-stage space ship designed to land on the moon for surface exploration, and return.

### Farm Income Said Dropped In Six Months

WASHINGTON, July 17 (UPI)—The agriculture department report that net farm income dropped at an annual rate of one billion dollars, or about 10 percent, during the first six months of this year.

The department estimated that net farm income in 1959 was running at an average annual rate of about 12 billion dollars during the first half of the year.

It said in the farm income situation "less than the last 10 years" because of crop marketings were down only slightly from the first half of 1958. Average prices of farm products declined but the volume of sales.

The department predicted that this year will be 25 per cent more than last year.

In August and September there is the same period a year ago.

The department said cattle feeders reported that out of 4,044,000 head of cattle and calves on feed July 1 they expected to market 1,455,000 head by the end of September.

If these intentions are carried out, the department said, the total would be 25 per cent above the 1,123,000 head marketed in the same time last year. This would leave 1,529,000 head to be marketed after Sept. 30—12 per cent less than last year.

### Naval Officer Denies Claim He Is Retired

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, July 17 (UPI)—Vice Adm. Anstee Etevez had a half hour talk with President Arturo Frondizi last night and then denied "retirement" that he had received as secretary of the navy.

The denial came in the face of persistent reports by a number of informed sources that Etevez would be out within 48 hours.

Rebellious navy officers have been seeking his resignation or dismissal on grounds he does not respect their viewpoint and is too lenient toward officers who supported ousted Director Juan D. Peron.

Buenos Aires newspapers speculated that Etevez would resign the naval department and the navy secretary finally found a compromise solution.

The compromise said the navy will keep its discipline. It retained some reports as untrustworthy and asked the press to cooperate for a better solution of the problems of the navy.

Since Argentina is under a technical state of siege, the 12 year admiral who has refused to resign until after Etevez gets out would have to get prior approval from the president. It was understood President Frondizi had rejected a resignation application from Vice Admiral Alberto Vaca.
