Electricians were the last hold-outs in the long-standing jurisdictional dispute. They returned yesterday.

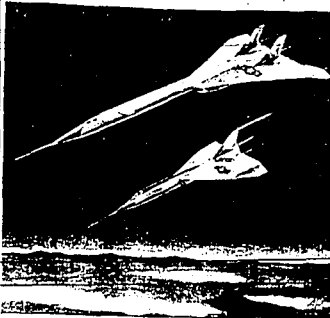
Members of most craft unions returned to work Monday, but ironworkers and electricians walked out again. Pipefitters returned to stay after a union meeting.

The craft unions apparently conceded to a recommendation by international leaders. The international leaders promised to study the work assignment dispute which arose.

Failure of international officers to keep a June date to study the problem was given as the official reason for the walkout. Local union officials expect the international leaders to set a date this week for a meeting, probably sometime in August.

Construction workers claim they should be given reactor installation jobs now being done by operating nuclear workers for major contractors.

Mother to Appeal Decision on Mine

LEWISTON, July 23 (U)—The mother of Mrs. George Wolfe, who lost her seven children in a mine explosion last year, said yesterday her client will appeal a government decision denying a placers retraining claim.

Attorney Henry Felton stated the government's decision "is a miscarriage of justice."

The government denied Mrs. Wolfe the claim on some 20 acres of New River forest land in the Salmon river canyon in a decision handed down Monday by the United States district court in Lewiston, bureau of land management, Salt Lake City.

Mrs. Wolfe had contended her mining claim would be on a limited scale. She sought to remove small amounts of gold to pay living costs for herself and her family.

Report Asks Long-Range Foreign Aid

WASHINGTON, July 23 (UPI)—President Eisenhower sent congress a report calling for continuing, long-range financing of the foreign aid program's development loan fund today.

The report was third in a series prepared by a Presidential committee of prominent foreign government officials headed by William H. Draper, Jr.

The committee also issued a similar proposal written into the new foreign aid bill, which does not take a position on the committee recommendations.

The report went to congress the day after the legislators finished work on a compromise bill authorizing \$2,550,000,000 in foreign aid spending during the current fiscal year. This is 10 percent below Eisenhower's original request.

Consideration Asks

Eisenhower, in submitting the Presidential committee's report, did not endorse its recommendations for continuing long-range financing of the development loan fund, but merely asked congress to consider it.

The proposal, among 14 included in the report, called for "continuing authorization and longer-term financing" of the development loan fund through which most economic aid now is channeled overseas.

The committee said the loan fund should be maintained at 700 million dollars as Eisenhower requested during the current fiscal year but stepped up to one billion a year starting next July.

IDAHO FALLS, July 23 (U)—The 10th annual National Potato Nutrition conference ended yesterday after delegates discussed potato diseases.

Richard L. Sawyer, Riverbend, N. Y., a specialist with Cornell University's Long Island research lab, said blackleg has been a serious problem in his area for 20 years but has only recently been reported as a major potato defect in most other areas.

J. W. Oswald, University of California, called blackleg the "single most important problem for the potato industry," in his state.

Red Foreign Aid Matches U.S. Plans Error for Error

WASHINGTON, July 23 (UPI)—The House appropriations committee published its annual foreign aid hearings today and the good news is that the Russians also have a foreign aid program and a certain number of towns among the people who run it.

They sent for the first of these (certainly) piled up in sacks on the dock. But Sunday before, they were the start of the 1953 season. (New Britain is in the shape of a ballast, and maybe it will give her some ships.

Under a very attractive credit arrangement, Indonesia was able to foot in a South Asian country just in time for a flood which nearly wiped out the place. Here was the chance, and they went into action. Well, what they did was phone Moscow for instructions. While the Koreans made up their minds for them, American aid people bailed the local folks out of the water. It was in fact, Leonard J. Saccio, our deputy director of foreign aid, and the Russian aid boys are making many of the same errors we have made, particularly in the early days of our programs.

The appropriations committee was delighted to hear this, especially the part about our mistakes being merely behind us. They asked Saccio for details, and he allowed he was mighty happy to give 'em. "Much nonsense has been written lately about foreign aid programs," he said. "None has been less accurate or more harmful than that which feeds the myth of the Soviet superman."

Take the matter of language. He said it's widely believed the Russians were more correct in their converse with the natives. Not so, he said. The fact is we do a lot better on this than they do. Saccio's chief, James W. Fiddler, who formerly was one of our multilateral, said even in Yagutavia, where the local language is related to Russian, he found more Americans able to speak it than Russians.

In running their aid program he said to know that the Russians can match us, error for error. But in talking about it they'll never compare. Today's volume of hearing covers 1,808 printed pages more than one million words. That's not counting all the words that were removed for security reasons.

Jellied-Fresh Fruit for Shortcake

MADE WITH M. C. P. "LOW SUGAR" PECTIN
Jellied Fresh Fruits Will Not Soak Into Shortcake
SAVE THIS!...One Recipe for All Fruits Without Cooking

PREPARATION OF FRUIT: Wash thoroughly. Hull and crush berries. Grind tree fruits.

1. Measure 2 cups crushed or ground fruit and 1 cup M.C.P. "Low Sugar" Liquid Pectin into kettle. Mix well.
2. Add 2 cups sugar; blend mixture thoroughly to dissolve sugar.

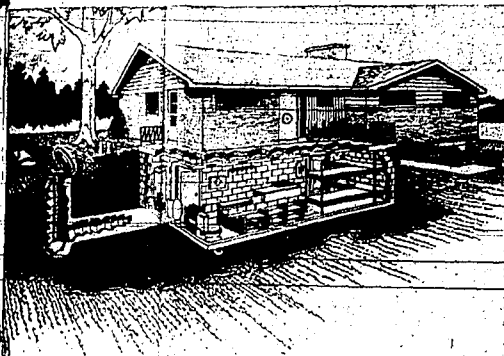

He Asks for Lower Debt, No Tax Cuts

WASHINGTON, July 23 (U) — President Eisenhower said yesterday, with great exactness, that he would start paying off something on the big debt of ours.

He also said he hopes this session of congress will buckle down and pass a labor regulation bill and a new farm program and a bill to finance the big federal highway program. Once again, he held out no hope for a tax cut in the next 18 months.

On taxes, the President added that "it would look to be the part of wisdom to start getting the debt down a little bit, thereby creating the kind of confidence that will make a tax cut more desirable."

Other points covered by Ike Steel—Secretary of Labor James Mitchell, in investigating the steel strike, is going to "look at all the facts that are pertinent to the dispute even though they go beyond the facts of profit, or labor costs and all the rest of it."

Gen. Eisenhower said "I have had some of my earlier hopes for really productive progress in the conference of foreign ministers in Geneva. He said, however, the road to a summit meeting is still open on the basis of "what a conference this conference."

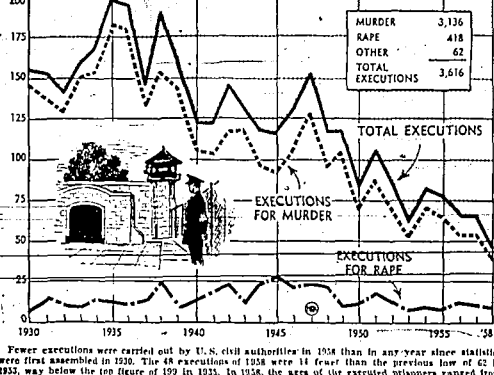

Unused Shot Is Poisoning Waterfowl

BOISE, July 23 (AP)—Lead poisoning is not the kind you get from the business end of a shotgun—it is causing concern among game waders. More and more ducks and other waterfowl die each year because of this growing problem, state game director Ross Leonard said today. The kind of lead poisoning caused by eating bird shot sprayed from hunting rifles into the water used by the waterfowl for feeding and resting, said Leonard, is causing the deaths. A recent study showed about one-fourth of wild North American mallards eat lead shot. In one survey, about 40 per cent died from lead poisoning and another one per cent died from lead poisoning. Leonard said that the problem is caused by the fact that lead shot is not biodegradable and it remains in the water for years.
