Two week-end traffic fatalities and the death of a man injured in a March accident raised Magic Valley's death toll to 29 for the year as compared to 23 at this time last year. The two week-end victims were Lloyd James Daniell, 57, Jerome, killed in a one-car accident north of Hailey, and Alton Rutherford, 20, Kimberly, killed when he was struck by another car after his car had overturned on highway 25 about four and one-half miles east of Jerome.

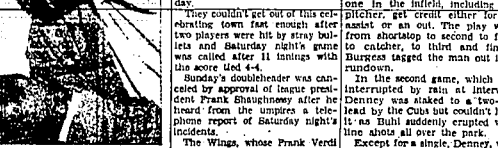
