ROSEBURG, Ore., Aug. 7 (UPI)—A truck loaded with six tons of explosive chemicals and dynamite blew up here early today, devastating about eight full blocks and causing nearly every building in the downtown part of this city of 13,000.

Police Chief Vernon Murock said today that the explosion killed 50 persons and injured 150. He said that the truck, which was carrying 600 cases of ammonium nitrate fertilizer and two tons of dynamite, was traveling on the main highway when it blew up.

The satellite will reach a peak altitude of 20,000 miles at 3 p.m., directly over South Africa, the national aeronautics and space administration announced. It will reach its low point 140 miles above the Earth at 8:30 o'clock tonight.
