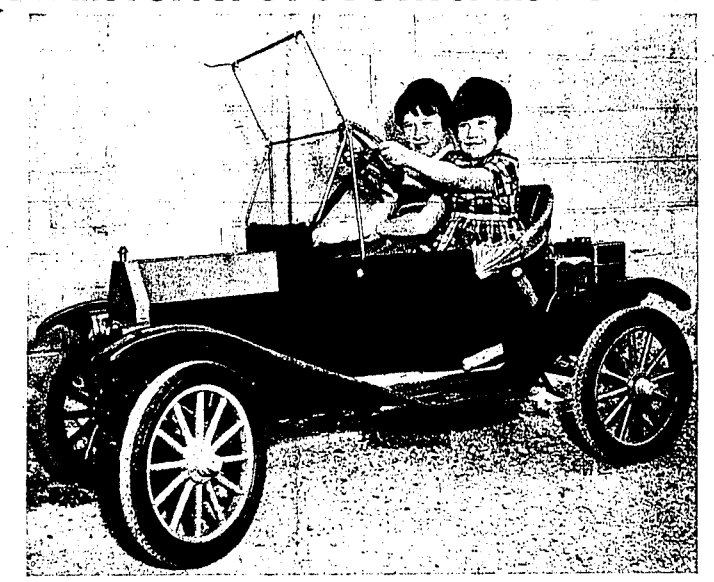

TIFFINVILLE, Pa., Aug. 28 (UP)—The second great oil rush was on today in Tiffinville—only this time it was for oil and the sentiment of the people was different.

It was the 100th birthday of the oil of America. A week-long celebration had swelled the population of Tiffinville from 8,000 to 25,000.

A century ago a youngster strolling through a 60-foot deep ravine to the ground to Edin L. L. about "oil, oil, oil." In the present and vernacular of the time it meant "oil, oil."

Idaho Farmer Goes to India To Supervise Wheat Exhibit

LEWISTON, Aug. 28—Herman Zollinger, a wheat farmer from Rexburg, left San Francisco yesterday for Madras, India, to supervise the wheat exhibit during the U.S. Trade Fair during September.

Zollinger was appointed as a special consultant by the foreign agricultural service, U. S. department of agriculture, to fill this assignment.

The government has been sponsoring a series of solo exhibits in India to demonstrate the applicability of U. S. small scale industries to the Indian economy. These exhibits have so far been held in New Delhi and Calcutta. It opens in Madras Tuesday and in Bombay on Feb. 1, 1950.

The fair has been in two sections, a large industrial dome with exhibits sponsored by the Soybean Council of America, Dairy Society International, and the wheat producers of the U. S. The exhibit is open eight hours daily for thirty days. Some 400,000 visitors passed through the New Delhi fair with a Calcutta attendance of almost 500,000.

The wheat exhibit has been planned by Wayne Gentry, director of the New Delhi office of Western Wheat associates, and George Patton, a food machinery technician from the Millers National federation. In keeping with the "small scale industry" theme of the exhibit, the wheat section utilizes an American imported Krispy-Kreme Doughnut machine. This machine was undoubtedly the show-stopper of the entire exhibit. People stood fascinated by the machine, and once the word spread of "free doughnuts," they were deluged. In addition, comment was often heard from the ladies visiting the site about the "model kitchen."

At the fair opening in Madras, a fourth segment to the wheat booth has been added; a bread bakery turning out 23 one pound loaves of bread every hour in quarter-pound loaves for easy distribution. This oven and proofer, designed by an American food processing technician, will be con-

British Believe That Ike Has Started Great Move of Peace

LONDON, Aug. 28 (UP)—The British believe that President Eisenhower will come out in their talk about the state of the North Atlantic of the great peace initiatives, lance and De Gaulle's demands undertaken by any American president.

Leaders of Prime Minister Har-old Macmillan's government view the President's meetings with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev as a chance for Eisenhower to lay the basis for a concrete treaty of peace and to have arrangements with the Soviet Union in the 11-bomb era.

This is a tremendous event and may prove the beginning of a new era in the history of mankind, declared one widely read newspaper. "His object is nothing less than to save mankind."

"His mission reminds me of a crusader," one veteran British diplomat said. "It is the sort of thing any British prime minister would give his life to do yet knows he cannot because modern Britain is not strong enough."

Macmillan is expected to tell Eisenhower how he thinks Khrushchev can best be handled, talking on the basis of his own experience in Moscow six months ago. And Eisenhower will tell him what Vice President Richard Nixon concluded after his visit to the Soviet capital.

The two then will try to work out a strategy which Eisenhower will use in his own conversations with the quick-witted Russian.

A wide-ranging survey of the mounting challenge of Soviet communism is stated by the two western leaders.

The West's ability to meet the communist challenge depends largely on the state of allied unity in the next few years.

For that reason—although American and British spokesmen would never admit it publicly—Eisenhower and Macmillan will devote much time to two of their colleagues whose personalities and policies have aroused controversy among the allies. They are French President Charles de Gaulle and West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

"You say a boy needs a dog as a playmate and I agree with you. You can tell me at what age it is best to give the boy a dog?"

In my experience, the usual boy of 10 years of age can be trusted with a dog. Unless the dog's owner is happy to feed, groom, care for his dog day by day it is not going to be a successful association. The dog will turn to the one who cares for him, talks to him, gives him his meals, his fresh water to drink, combs and brushes him daily, takes him out for his walk. He is just like us in his loyalty, only more so; for we all turn affectionately toward those who love us enough to serve us.

Small children cannot care for a dog and are likely to mistreat him. While the dog will guard him as the command of his adult owner, his first loyalty will be to his caretaker, not the little one. There must be some understanding between the dog and his child owner and very young children cannot establish this relationship.

They are more likely to poke fingers in the animal's eye, take a handful of his hair and tug, pull his tail. When the dog resents this treatment and snaps at the child or nips him, he is looked out. Little ones, those too young to know how wrong it is to inflict pain on a creature, should wait for a while before being allowed such a pet.

Car Trouble Foils Try at Speed Record

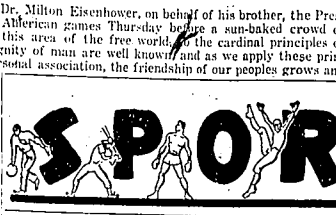

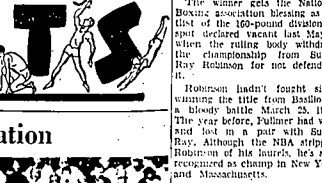

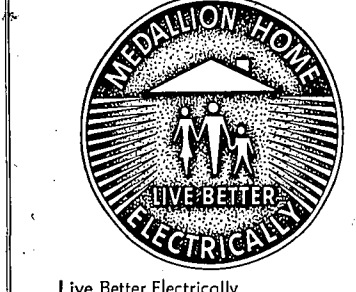
