India's Cabinet May Be Altered Officials Resign

NEW DELHI, India, Sept. 1 (AP)—Indian sources said tonight Prime Minister Nehru may shake up his cabinet to solve a reported clash between Defense Minister V. K. Krishna Menon and his three military service chiefs over promotions. The nation, beset by red Chinese aggressive moves, was thrown into crisis by reports that Menon, controversial one-time Indian delegate to the United Nations, has offered to quit and that the army may arrest four staff officers are resigning. Informants close to President Rajendra Prasad said Nehru may announce the resignation of his full cabinet to parliament tomorrow.

Germany Awoke 20 Years Ago To Tune of Marches and War

Berlin, Sept. 1, 1959.—On the morning of Sept. 1, 1939, the air was filled with the sound of marching bands playing "Die Wacht am Rhein" and "Die Soldaten" by Franz Schubert. The music was a stark contrast to the somber mood of the city as it prepared for war.

Without a formal declaration of war, a collective "W.T.U." walked out into the streets to cheer on the marching bands. The music was a stark contrast to the somber mood of the city as it prepared for war.

Hitler's brown-clad deputies, summoned from their beds in the wee hours of the night, packed the hall. There was an empty seat in the diplomatic gallery where the Polish ambassador usually sat. Hitler's eyes, fixed on the crowd, seemed to encourage courage behind him.

It was a familiar sight—with one small exception: demonstration of the detail to which Hitler had gone in planning the war. For the first time, he and his adjutants appeared in well-insulated outfits made of the finest, downy, wool. The army uniforms were instead of a soldier's uniform.

Hitler declared in a strong voice: "By putting on the uniform and I shall take it off only in victory or death."

His rousing cry to his feet, a roar of "yes, yes," and "yes, yes," echoed through the hall.

Fresh Efforts For Algerian Peace-Hunted

PARIS, Sept. 1 (UPI)—All the political indicators point to a fresh effort by Gen. Charles de Gaulle for peace in Algeria.

Some predict De Gaulle may give Algeria self-government with close ties to France and certain guarantees for the minority of one million Frenchmen in Algeria.

Algeria's majority of 3,000,000 who think immediate outright independence is the only answer.

De Gaulle's man who keeps his own counsel, may not so limit far.

But the time is ripe for a peace initiative of some kind, and some previously unmovable forces seem ready to step forward to meet it.

De Gaulle Modified Approach

De Gaulle has modified his public approach by announcing that he will accept 15 months ago. At that time he was referring to Algeria as "French soil, now and forever."

Later he indicated that France and Algeria were not one and the same thing. "The future of Algeria will be decided by the double battle of personality and its close solidarity with metropolitan France."

In taking office as president last January he put it more strongly speaking of "the Algerians" as "Frenchmen," pacified and transformed, developing their own personality and responsibility.

De Gaulle's prime minister, Michel Debre, admits more uncertainty than his chief.

De Gaulle's approach has been slightly more than two weeks ago. In the middle of a long speech he hit upon the words, "I do not know France and the Algerians."

He then said, "I do not know the Algerians and I do not know France."

His speech indicated that Algerians and France are not one and the same thing. "The future of Algeria will be decided by the double battle of personality and its close solidarity with metropolitan France."

The rebels for their part, have been successful in their efforts.

Furth Abbas, premier of the Algerian rebel government, said in an interview with the "German weekly 'Der Spiegel'" that he was ready to negotiate "without posing any prior conditions."

There was a marked change from the anti-line rebel insistence that the French must concede Algeria's right to independence before the rebels would talk to them.

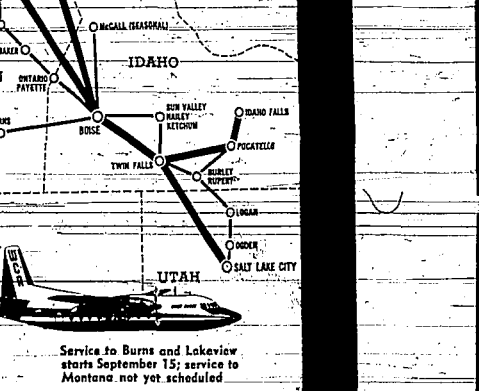
