House Passes Labor Bill Record-Breaking Crowd Expected for Third Day Of T.F. Fair and Kedeo

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4 (AP)—The house today completed congressional action on the labor controls bill and sent it to the White House. President Eisenhower is expected to sign it. The roll call vote was 352-52. The measure had passed the senate 56-2 Thursday night. Today's house action dramatically capped the President's biggest legislative victory of the session. It handed Eisenhower a bill patterned closely after his recommendations for legislation to cope with corruption and racketeering in labor-management relations. The bill, containing unprecedented controls over the internal affairs of unions, is by far the most substantial rewriting of the nation's labor laws since the 1947 Taft-Hartley act.

Two Projects in Idaho, Utah Restored to Public Works Act

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4 (AP)—Two projects in Utah and Idaho, which were among 67 scrapped by the house appropriations subcommittee yesterday, were reinstated in a new public works appropriation bill. The action came when the house appropriations committee directed another presidential veto and approved a shavied-down bill including all the 67 projects which President Eisenhower had objected to. But the committee trimmed every project two and one-half per cent. Most noteworthy delegation and reinstatement—from the intermountain standpoint was a nearly half-million dollar item for bureau of reclamation—construction of east Idaho's Burns Creek dam and power plant.

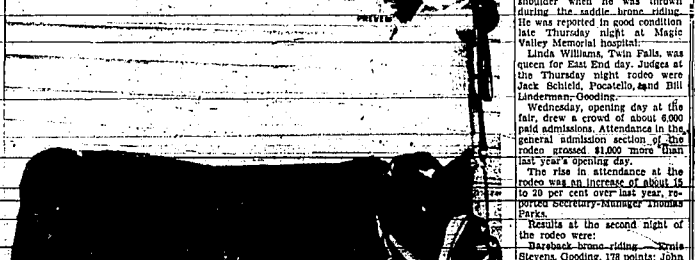

Polygamy Will Be Fought in Utah Counties

PARMINGTON, Utah, Sept. 4.—A grand jury voted yesterday to stamp out the practice of plural marriages in Davis county, between Salt Lake City and Ogden in Utah.

—Herald. Fredrickson called polygamy unwise, deplorable and depraving.

—There is a large movement which has become widespread from Bonanza in Salt Lake suburbs to Salt Lake force-hate near Ogden, Fredrickson said.

—There are many evils attached to this thing and most deplorable are the living conditions under which some of these people are living.

—We have barely scratched the surface. All indications are that it is growing.

—Fredrickson said the jury heard from eight subpoenaed witnesses from areas who testified about polygamy. He said their appearances did not mean they are in any way connected with polygamy.

—We have subpoenaed eight more witnesses to testify on polygamy at our session next Wednesday," he added.

—Regardless of what the religious aspect of this practice is, it is against the state and federal laws," he said.

A number of investigations and prosecutions have been made in recent years to stop plural marriages in Utah and Arizona—most among members of a sect commonly known as Fundamentalists. The growth of this sect in Utah is the true teachings of God in respect to polygamy. They claim the church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, which once sanctioned plural marriage, erred when it officially outlawed the practice before the turn of the century.

The Mormon church now excommunicates any members found to be practicing plural marriage. Fredrickson said the grand jury is helping in its probe from the Utah attorney general and other officials.

So, of course, did his late secretary of state, John Foster Dulles. This was so even when Western nations held firm.

Yet 1958 saw both Dulles and the President lifted to higher levels of esteem. The conviction grew that they were struggling earnestly and possibly with more effectiveness than had been realized with the problem of holding the peace while not yielding vital ground to the Communist world.

The President's roaring welcome abroad reflects his new status. It is also a compliment to him as an acknowledged man of peace who will do anything to keep the American President, and the great country, the peace.

Reds Asked to Tell Views of U. S. Officials

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4 (AP)—The United States yesterday called for a Soviet magazine to publish the foreign affairs views of some prominent U. S. officials, just as Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's views have been published here.

Lincoln White, state department press officer, said "we expect" the Russians will be prepared to do this before President Eisenhower visits the Soviet Union.

White declined to say which American official might sign his name to such an article. He did not rule out the possibility that it might be Eisenhower himself.

White's statement was in comment on publication in the magazine Foreign Affairs of an article by Khrushchev outlining his views on international matters.

Foreign Affairs is published by the Council on Foreign Relations, a private organization of prominent Americans.

The Kremlin chief, who is to visit the United States later this month, resisted in the article views he has expressed before. He called for peaceful coexistence between the United States and the Soviet Union and renewed Moscow's demands regarding Germany and other questions.

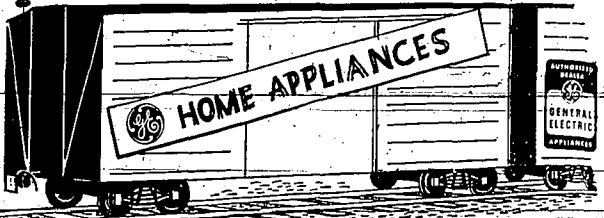

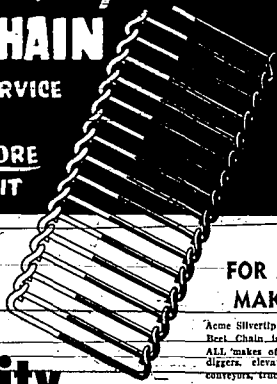
