Holiday Death Toll Near New High as 430 Die; All Mishaps Claim 658-Lives

Traffic accidents during the three-day Labor day holiday cost the nation a near record in human lives. More than 4700 died during the holiday. The all-time record for persons was killed during a Labor day week-end is 461—set in 1951. A total of 668 York persons was killed during that holiday, including traffic, drownings and miscellaneous accidents. The National Safety Council has estimated 450 traffic deaths occurred this year from 6 p.m. Friday to last midnight, local time. Last year 420 traffic deaths occurred during the holiday observance. The council said this year's heavy toll again here.

The Associated Press surveyed 100 cities last week-end to compare holiday period, for comparative purposes. Teller Family Rescued From Remote Spot

TIMBERLINE LODGE, Ore.—Sept. 8 (UPI)—Dr. Edward Teller, University of California physicist, and his son and daughter were found safe last night after they became lost in fog during a hike on Mt. Hood, Oregon's highest peak.

A search party including two ski patrol members located the Tellers and returned them to the lodge where they have been vacationing since Aug. 27.

Mrs. Teller did not go on the hike. With Dr. Teller were his son Paul and daughter Wendy.

Paul Lambert, night clerk at the lodge, said the Tellers left the lodge Monday and hiked to Cloud in the abandoned lodge site about 11 miles east from Timberline at the 8,000-foot level.

On the return trip the Tellers apparently lost their way in fog when they did not show up, a search party was formed. The three were located safely in White river canyon, about three miles from Timberline.

"They apparently suffered no ill effects," Hamburg said. "They were just wet," he said.

94 Per Cent Of Strontium Said Removed

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 (UPI)—Scientists have been able to remove up to 94 per cent of radioactive strontium from atomized milk without altering basic content, the atomic energy commission revealed today.

Methods for removal of radioactive strontium from milk would be vitally important, it was said, because contamination were to occur, for instance from nuclear accidents in the event of nuclear warfare, the report said.

The announcement was contained in the AEC's first quarterly report on fallout. It also showed that concentrations of radioactivity in surface air over the eastern United States declined during this early summer months.

Preliminary experiments in removal of strontium in milk were conducted in the atomic energy agricultural research laboratory at the University of Tennessee. Further research will be conducted to establish the practicality of large scale removal and to estimate cost of carrying it out at the commercial dairy level, the AEC said.

Removal is carried out through an ion exchange technique similar to home methods of softening water by eliminating certain chemicals, the report said. This was accomplished without reduction in the calcium content.

WASHINGTON—The more responsible northern legislators and politicians are looking for a carrier of an extreme civil rights bill as a result of racial clashes, riot and violence on their part.

THE CLOAK IS OFF So far no sign exists that the Communist Chinese plan big-scale aggression against India.

A separate concern is how Peking's timing of these assaults, like the new bombings in Laos, is affected by its relations with Moscow and the West.

In more immediate focus is the fact that India's 10 years of professed friendship and attempted coexistence with Red China have in the end come to naught.

Prime Minister Nehru, still insisting he wants no quarrel with Peking, has been compelled to dispatch troops to the border area in an effort to regain Red-captured border zones at various points.

The whole sequence of events must be something of a shock to him. Red China's ruthless stamping out of the Tibetan revolt certainly upset him, but he plainly did not imagine that the Communists would push into territory under Indian control.

When the Reds want something, they will take it if they can get it. They will continue to blame the victim, as they have done in this instance. And they will be vindicated by the memory of post-kind words, whether uttered by Nehru or anybody else.

That Peking, for perhaps a variety of reasons, chose to drive into Indian-controlled soil at this time suggests that the Communist is now more indifferent to both Asian and world opinion.

They know the bad reaction their Tibetan adventure produced in both neutral and Western-oriented Asian countries. Rather than to meet the criticism, they have chosen to chop them down. Free Asian response to these Red forays on the Indian border can only be to further downgrade Peking and communist generally.

Peking may think the stakes it is playing in the greater Far East are worth the squander in a delicate one to strike. But from here the loss looks heavy.

The cloak is off. The brutal murderer is seen who he is. He is not a hero, even though he professes to be anything else.

EAST LANSING, Mich., Sept. 8—A Detroit ex-convict who finally broke down after refusing for three days to tell the fate of a missing trooper, faced a first-degree murder charge today.

Theory of Souden's body eliminated 33 hours of intensive police interrogation. The questioning was highlighted by a dramatic personal appeal from Souden's wife, Clara, 33, who pleaded: "I'll pray for you and forgive you; but please tell me where my husband is."

State police said Mrs. Souden's plea, some nine hours before Knight led officers to the body and admitted the slaying, was an important factor in persuading the man to talk.

State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs said a warrant charging Knight with first-degree murder in the trooper's slaying last Thursday would be issued.

State Police Detective Howard Whaley, after a night's sleep, admitted the slaying.

Knight was seized in a collision about 100 miles from the murder scene. Souden's empty squad car was found Friday, his body was found about four miles southwest of the village of Argentine in southern Michigan.

Record Is Set By Length of Steel Walkout

NEW YORK, Sept. 8 (AP)—The nation-wide steel strike became the longest of its kind in the country's history today—without the faintest glimmer of hope for a settlement soon.

The walkout of 800,000 steelworkers ransacked members shutting down mills producing for 87 percent of the nation's basic steel production, entered its 50th day at 12:01 a.m.

A similar strike totaled 89 days in 1922 but its continuity was interrupted by government intervention. The longest segment was 25 days. In other years there have been longer walkouts against individual firms.

The current shutdown of 12 major steel producing firms is estimated to have cost billions of dollars in lost wages and business.

Another meeting today was scheduled between federal negotiators and industry and union representatives. Informed sources said, however, they anticipated no break in the stalemate.

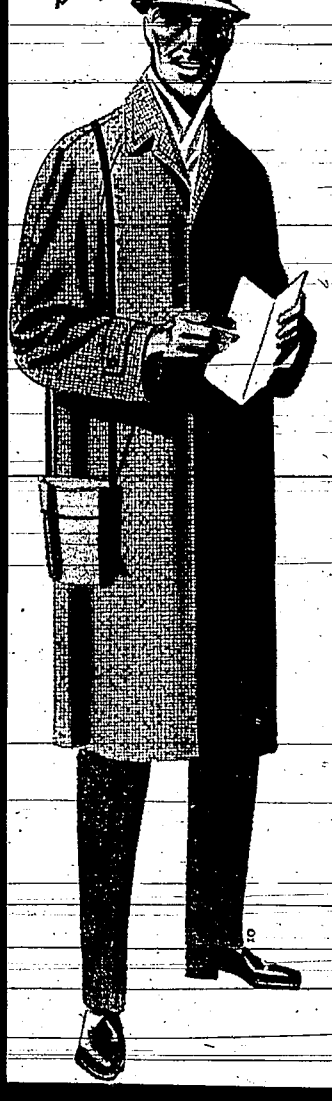
