House Okeys Cent Increase In Gas Taxes

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9 (UPI)—The house gave final congressional approval today to a one-cent boost in gasoline taxes starting Oct. 1. The bill now goes to the White House. Lawmakers of both parties are pleased with the increase. The measure temporarily raises the tax on gasoline from 3.6 cents a gallon federal tax on gasoline and diesel fuel. The higher tax would remain in force 21 months until July 1, 1961, and bring in almost one billion dollars in additional revenues.

The legislation helps out the federal superhighway construction program. The house unanimously approved the bill which provides for a four-year program to be started in 1961. The bill also provides for a 20 percent increase in the maximum amount of federal aid to states for highway construction.
