Sager caught up downtown. Keller pulled a knife and forced the young man to drive him to Pollock in the blue mountain 35 miles away.

"There the convict made Sager strip to his shorts and took his wallet containing \$200. But Sager, who's single, "blended no conviction."

Increase Seen in Building Activity

Construction activity in Twin Falls during August was substantially greater than that of August, 1958.

Of this amount, permits for residential dwelling units totaled \$132,000 and were up 12.8 per cent for the month. For the first eight months, construction activity in Twin Falls totaled \$1,120,000, up 10.5 per cent over the same period last year. During this period, 251 permits, valued at \$1,043,405, were issued. Permits for 103 new dwelling units totaled \$220,000, a drop of 2.9 per cent.
