Eisenhower Signs Bill to Regulate Internal Affairs of Unions, Limit Activity

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14 (AP)—President Eisenhower today signed into law the bill regulating internal affairs of labor unions and limiting their boycott and picketing activities. The enactment is a landmark of the 1959 congressional session, representing one of Eisenhower's most important legislative triumphs. It contains Taft-Hartley law amendments he insisted were essential to any effective bill. The new law is designed to curb racketeering and other abuses in some unions and spotlight in congressional investigations.

The act also puts new restrictions on organizational picketing by unions and on secondary boycotts. A secondary boycott is one directed at an employer—usually a supplier or contractor—rather than the primary employer.

The AFL-CIO contends these amendments change with respect to labor's legitimate economic power, but says the Taft-Hartley law amendments are necessary to curb racketeering and other abuses in some unions and spotlight in congressional investigations.

The act contains the most far-reaching of the nation's labor-management relations law since the Taft-Hartley law was passed in 1947.

Eisenhower signed the bill without any special ceremony. But he was present on the signing steps with Robert P. Griffin, R-Mich., and Wm. L. Dickinson, R-Calif., authors of the late-session bill. He was also present at the White House to express his thanks.

"The President's wonderful support certainly was the thing which made the difference in obtaining this constructive labor law," Griffin told newsmen afterward.

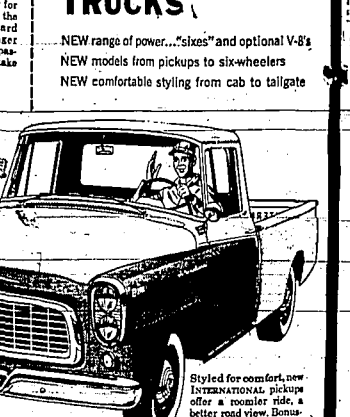

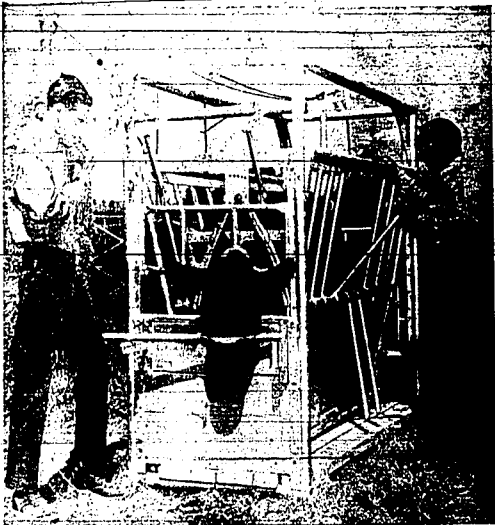

The chute was built as a shop project at Minidoka county high school where Hollinger is a senior. The school also will receive \$500 from the foundation to be used for the improvement of the shop mechanics course. Melvin DeWitt was Hollinger's shop teacher. Hollinger chose his particular project because, he said, "for many years there has been a need for some easy means of branding and dehorning steers. We needed a method which was fast and which required only one or two persons to operate. I had no plan for his chute, working out the details from two enlarged snapshots of what he considered a "good workable chute." All the flat metal used was salvaged from worn-out machinery and the pipe was purchased from a salvage yard. Total cost of the project was \$395. He estimates that a new chute of like materials and proportions would cost about \$500.
