U.S. Scientists Will Try To Pilot Space Package Into Orbit Around Moon

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23 (UPI)—U. S. scientists will try early next month to pilot a 375-pound space package into orbit around the moon with radio commands from Earth. Apparently it will be the first use of so-called midcourse and terminal guidance in space history. All other space vehicles, including Russia's Lunik II, have relied solely on "initial guidance" to reach their destination. According to radio Moscow, Lunik II was put on a course which operated only as long as its rockets were firing. Then, like an intercontinental ballistic missile, it coasted on a long trajectory to its target.

One purpose of the moon package is to test radio guidance systems designed to correct the trajectory from the time of launch and, at the right moment, to send it into a lunar orbit.

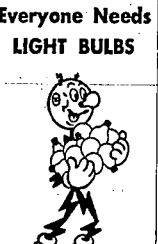

LET'S QUIT WINKING AT INFLATION

The general public got the bit in its teeth a few months back and let congress know how it felt about government spending. Hundreds of thousands of people poured into Washington, demanding that the lawmakers be stung because of the fear that more federal deficits would cause further inflation.

The letters worked, to a large extent, and congress gave up some of its more lavish spending schemes for the moment. Now there is a danger that the public will go back to sleep, will ignore other inflationary factors, and that we'll be in for another round of inflation after all.

Of the biggest dangers is that the government is going to have to borrow \$45,000,000 this fiscal year. Seven billion of that is to pay current bills while waiting for the tax money to come in. And \$78,000,000,000 will be to pay off bonds matured or called in.

Further, the trade unions are insisting on big wage increases, contending that the way to prevent inflation is to put more money into circulation by raising wages. But higher wages mean higher costs, and then higher prices to cover the costs, which means that anyone whose income doesn't rise will buy less.

How far this process already has gone is shown by the fact that the average American family, in 1953, a certain pump cost \$244.98 to make in their American plant, and \$148.98 in their foreign plant. Report Made Of American Russ Exhibit

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23 (UPI)—President Eisenhower has received a final report on the American exhibition in Moscow and how the Russians know a good real estate deal when they see one.

Harold McClellan, general manager of the American exhibit and just back from Moscow, gave the President a detailed report on the American show which attracted an estimated 2,700,000 people in six weeks.

McClellan said he thought the exhibit accomplished its three principal objectives of providing a good show, operating on schedule and remaining within the \$4,000,000 budget.

The two main exhibit buildings were supposed to cost \$700,000 but the final cost was over \$1,000,000. McClellan said the Russians had agreed to buy the buildings for 50 percent of the constructive cost or \$375,000, whichever was lower.

The \$375,000 figure was agreed on last week and the Russian check is expected within a week or two.

McClellan said that although attendance was in the neighborhood of 2,700,000, only 210,000 tickets were sold.

"There was no restraining them," he said. Many Russians climbed the fence when they found tickets lines too long.

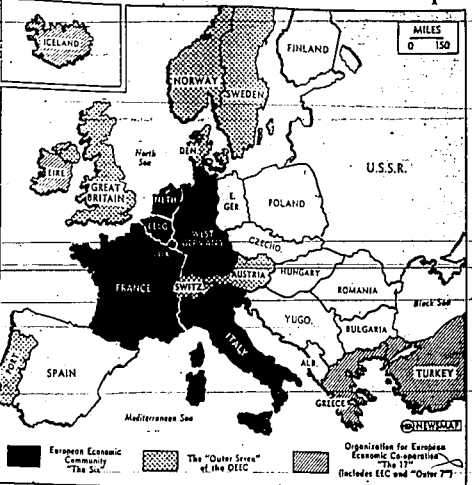

2 Groups Seek Unified Economic Europe



Two years ago six European nations, shown in black on map above, signed a treaty forming the European Economic Community (EEC). Its object was to create a free trade area and common market by the gradual lowering of tariffs and other barriers over the next 10 years. They are part of the broader 17-nation Organisation for European Economic Co-operation (OEEC), which was set up after World War II to plan for and use Marshall plan aid. Now seven OEEC countries, outside the common market, are moving to establish their own free trade area. They have been dubbed the "Outer Seven" (see map). Final goal of these plans is the complete economic unification of all Europe.

Tight Money Is Everyday Fact of Life

NEW YORK, Sept. 23 (UPI)—Tight money is moving off the debating platform. It's getting to be an everyday fact of life.

If you want to buy a new home, you know about it. If you're looking for a new car on time payments, you're likely to find carrying charges a bit higher. If you're looking for a new car on time payments, you're likely to find carrying charges a bit higher.

Bankers and other lenders say too many persons—including many who are wanting to borrow more money just now, Americans aren't saving as much as their incomes are rising. So the lenders don't have enough funds to meet the increased demand. This money is tight and interest rates are rising.

About the only things now going for less than five per cent interest are the short-term Treasury securities. They are commanding about five per cent, higher than they were the bank holiday in 1953.

Tightening of money comes at this time of the year because banks are called upon to finance movement of crops from farms and through processing plants, and because manufacturers borrow to produce fall and winter goods and merchants borrow to buy and carry these goods until the Christmas trade—they hope—empties their shelves again.

The federal reserve board has eased up on credit just enough to give banks lendable funds for what it considers necessary for these seasonal needs, but no more, holding that more than that would only set off a speculative boom, breeding price for higher prices.

Macmillan Party Men Run Scared

LONDON, Sept. 23 (UPI)—Prime Minister Harold Macmillan's conservative party appeared today to be losing ground with the approach of the Oct. 8 general election. Many Tory candidates were reported "running scared."

Public opinion polls as well as party-workers reports to conservative headquarters observed a sharp drop in conservative popularity, although only weeks ago the Tories were heavily favored.

Macmillan and his labor party opponents took off their gentlemen's kid gloves last night and started slinging verbal barbs at one another. Previously, both sides had promised a "clean" campaign.
