SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 25 (UPI)—Police said today they may give a lie detector test to Ferenc Iszak, leader of the local Hungarian freedom fighter contingent who was reported to have been viciously beaten.

Iszak, 31, was found in a dazed condition in Golden Gate park Wednesday—three days after he bitterly denounced the American aid to Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev.

Iszak's attractive wife, Enese, claimed her husband was beaten by communists. There were also reports that the attack was the result of a "dispute" among the ranks of the freedom fighters.

However, police—Lieut. Donald Scott said last night that Iszak may be asked to take a lie detector test because Iszak reported "no injuries were sustained."

"We doubt if he was beaten by communists—or by anybody else," Scott said.

### Tax Loophole Is Closed by Federal Rule

BOISE, Sept. 25—An act of Congress closing a loophole of which Idaho has been taking advantage means a filing of \$400,000, says the state of Idaho.

Robert Boyle said yesterday that the new federal rule will affect those who have higher interest rates on U. S. savings bonds, prohibit them from taking such bonds as a deduction.

"I would expect," Boyle said, "that this makes a \$200,000 annual limit in our returns. This may be high or low, depending on a study that will have to be made."

"But it will effectively close" from state taxation some income tax payers who have received paid taxes under the state income tax law."

The federal law does not apply to the state of Idaho. But the treasury department official said it is the only state which has been taking directly or indirectly interest on government securities.

"The new law," Boyle said, "is the state's original income tax law passed in 1921. Enforcement of the law is relating to the state's federal securities, however, did not begin until 1950, Boyle said.

As that time when the attorney general, Boyle said, the state undertook actions which suited in the state and the taxability of such income and the Idaho supreme court upheld that law.

### Free Access Signs Urged Over Ranges

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25—(AP)—Landscape men who maintain fences around the public domain would be required to post signs informing the public the lands are open to proper and lawful uses under regulations proposed yesterday by the interior department.

Assistant Secretary Roger Ernst said they would insure that fences on the public domain, either publicly or privately financed, are not designed to prevent access for lawful hunting, fishing or recreational purposes.

"Fencing of the public domain was used in protecting restricted areas and in assisting land control projects," Ernst said. "Signs along the fences should clearly indicate that they are not designed to cut off access to public lands."

Under the proposal, standard signs would be designed by the bureau of land management. The signs would be placed at intervals and their maintenance would be up to those who have the responsibility of maintaining the fences.

### Standards of Spud Grades And Size Set

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25—(AP)—Minimum standards of grade, size, quality and maturity for imported potatoes were adopted yesterday by the agriculture department.

Similar regulations have been in effect each season since 1953.

"Round varieties are required to be of U.S. No. 1 grade or better, two and one-fourth inches minimum diameter and four inches maximum diameter, and 90 per cent minimum maturity."

For long varieties, requirements call for U.S. grade No. 2 or better, two inches minimum diameter or four ounces minimum weight, at least 90 per cent fully cleaned and not more than slightly chipped.

Certified seed potatoes are exempt from the requirements and are small quantities under 500 pounds.

The department said the regulations for round varieties are based on potatoes of varieties grown in Idaho and other western states.

### Red Rocket's Findings Will Help Science

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25 (UPI)—An astronomer said today that reports appear to be of "tremendous importance" in understanding the moon's structure as well as the moon.

Other scientists said the data also appear to prove that the moon does possess an atmosphere, albeit a thin one.

The astronomer, Dr. Oerter of the National Science Administration, said he has not yet seen the report.

Dr. Oerter said that the report, which he said is being prepared by a group of scientists, is based on data obtained from the lunar probe launched by the Red Rocket in July 1958.

Dr. Oerter said that the probe apparently confirms belief that the moon has a strong magnetic field, but that it is not as strong as that of the earth.

According to Soviet scientists, the moon, believed to have a solid rock core, has no magnetic field approximately as strong as that of the earth.

Dr. Oerter said that a fairly strong magnetic field around the moon would have a significant effect on the formation of the earth's atmosphere.

Dr. Oerter also reported that the probe had increased the concentration of ionized (charged) particles within about 4,000 miles of the moon.

Dr. Oerter said this appears to establish that the moon possesses an atmosphere of sorts.

Dr. Oerter said that the probe also found "most definitely" that the moon is "very valuable" but said he expected more complete data from the probe.

### Report Given On Wool Pay

Payments to wool producers in Twin Falls county under the wool incentive program for the 1958 marketing year had reached a total of \$342,352.68 at the end of August, according to Carl Boyd, chairman of the county agricultural stabilization and conservation office.

This represents substantially the total amount of incentive payments to be received by local growers for wool and washburn lambs marketed between "shear months" of March 1, 1959, and March 31, 1959. About 173 applications for wool payments and 218 applications for washburn payments were filed before the deadline last week.

Shorn wool payments for the 1958 marketing year amount to 79.2 per cent of the dollar returns each producer received from the sale of shorn wool during the marketing year. The payment rate on wool for the wool on them is \$1.02 per hundredweight of live animals shorn.

The national wool program is designed to increase production of shorn wool through incentive payments to producers. The program is now in its fifth year.

A fire crash truck purchased through surplus sales for civil defense purposes was brought to Twin Falls this week from Mountain Home air force base by Jack Farrar, manager of Joslin field. The six-wheeled drive truck will be stationed at the field after some repairs are made at the city shops. Coating \$38,000 originally, the city purchased it for \$50,000 through the Civil Defense program.

### Odds Increase That Mitchell Will Be Asked to Eat His Hat

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24 (UPI)—The odds are increasing that Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell will be called upon to eat his hat.

Labor department economists yesterday announced that unemployment in October will fall below the three-million mark.

Mitchell, predicting that it would decline below this level, predicted that the unemployment rate in April that he would eat his hat if his forecast did not come true.

The secretary has been silent on the five-month-old promise recently, but it's a topic of lively interest among the statisticians who work on the monthly job report.

Unemployment was estimated at 2,900,000 in August, the latest figure available. Normally it would decline in September and his already low in October.

Caterpillar Tractor, for example, announced it will close its plants and lay off 11,000 workers Oct. 3 unless the strike ends before then.

Aide from the strike, one labor department economist said, Mitchell's prediction undoubtedly would have been correct. Even now, he added, it will be "tough and go to hell" for the jobs figure is above or below the three-million mark.

More accurate estimates of October joblessness will be available early next year, after the September unemployment figures are announced. An exact count for October will be released about Nov. 1.
