# Steel Talks Are Set Again After Meets With Ke

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 (UPI)—Negotiations in the 72-day-old steel strike resumed today at the prodding of President Eisenhower who said he would like to see some progress by Oct. 8. David J. McDonald, president of the United Steelworkers union, arrived two minutes late at 10:22 p.m. (EDT) at the hotel suite of Roger Golberg, board chairman of U. S. Steel, to begin the talks. He was accompanied only by J. Goldberg, the union's general counsel.

McDonald is to be in the suite in the morning to meet with executives of five leading steel companies. It was the first time they had met since the strike began. Both sides in the deadlocked dispute agreed yesterday morning to meet this morning to discuss the settlement.

The president promptly issued a statement expressing hope that an agreement can be initiated "before the start of the vacation. Union leaders said they hoped they could reach a settlement to the President's satisfaction.

# 250-Mile Area Hit By Big Snowstorm

DENVER, Colo., Sept. 30 (AP)—Warming temperatures were expected today to bring relief from the damaging snowstorms in the Rocky Mountain region. The massive storm crippled a 250-mile area extending from Cheyenne, Wyo., to Pueblo, Colo. Shattered trees, many made a shambles of hundreds of streets. Power in large sections of metropolitan areas was disrupted. Highways between the mountains and the Kansas border were closed. So were many schools. At least two deaths were attributed to the storm in Denver.

Robert E. Barry, 32, died while lifting a fallen limb. Denver received 10 to 15 inches of snow. Power failures in some Denver schools caused about 10,000 children to be sent home. Denver's maximum of 35 degrees yesterday was a record low for the city since 1900.

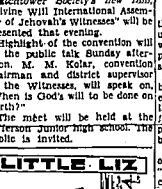

**PHOENIX, Sept. 30**—American military forces yesterday joined Japanese rescue workers in the typhoon-stricken disaster areas in central Japan.

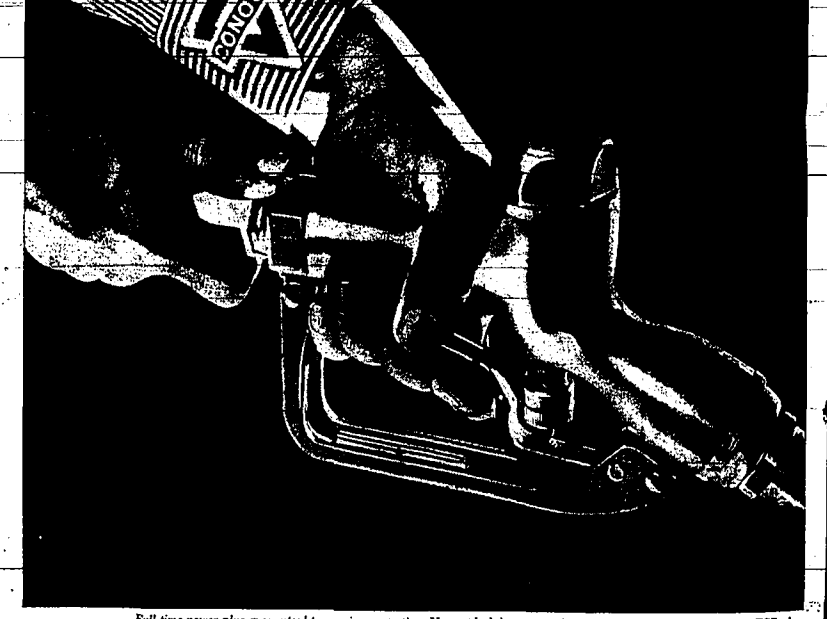

HAVANA, Sept. 10 (UPI)—Premier Fidel Castro was under an unprecedented heavy attack from major independent Havana newspapers today for his denunciations of the Cuban press and newsmen who criticized his regime.

One, it said, is the public figures saying one thing publicly and another thing privately because of "fear and submission."

### Dr. J. E. Salk Given Fund For Studies

PITTSBURGH, Sept. 30 (UPI)—Dr. Jonas E. Salk, who developed the Salk anti-polio vaccine, has received a new grant of \$419,439 from the National Foundation for the Study of Paralysis to continue his studies of viruses and cells at the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Salk will use the grant to pursue work in the following three lines of research:  
1. Attempt to discover a cell-substitute for monkey-kidney tissue used in production of the vaccine.  
2. Observation of persistence of immunity from the vaccine.  
3. Search for ways of preventing invasion of the central nervous system by the virus.

### Study of Sun Might Help to Tame H-Bomb

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 (UPI)—Scientists today reported new discoveries about the sun, which they said may help man to harness H-bomb fusion forces for peacetime power.

They called for long-term satellite experiments to extend the data on the sun's surface, which they said may help man to harness H-bomb fusion forces for peacetime power.

The discoveries, made by naval research scientists with high-altitude rockets, include:  
—Temperatures in the thin solar corona 50,000 to 60,000 miles from the sun's surface sometimes go as high as 180 million degrees Fahrenheit. This is five times as hot as the solar center where hydrogen fusion reactions occur.

Apparently as a result, the corona sometimes emits X-rays of energies up to 80,000 electron volts which penetrate to within 30 miles of the earth's surface. They are about a dozen times more energetic than the most potent solar X-rays found previously.

Knowledge of how the sun manufactures nuclear energy put man on the track of the H-bomb. Now, scientists say, new knowledge of solar surface and atmospheric processes, might put man on the track of H-power and a virtually inexhaustible supply of energy for homes, cities and factories.

The new sun data was obtained by naval research scientists under Dr. Herbert Friedman during a recently completed rocket project called Sunfire II. The rockets, with 50 pounds of instruments, were fired from Point Arguillo, Calif., on the Pacific missile range.

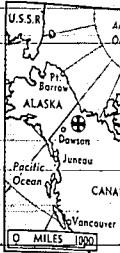

A long list of safety features, many introduced for the first time to the motoring public, includes an emergency flasher system which is available on all 1960 Chrysler corporation passenger cars and trucks.

Front and rear turn signals can be made to flash automatically when the driver wishes to warn approaching traffic of an unusual hazard. If necessary the system can be operated with the ignition key removed.
