### VIEWERS OF OTHERS

Many proposals have been made for improving wheat raising and production. One that has particularly appealed to us would control production by bushels instead of acreage. Seems to us that an increase in acreage and agricultural production, this is the only sound way to control wheat production.

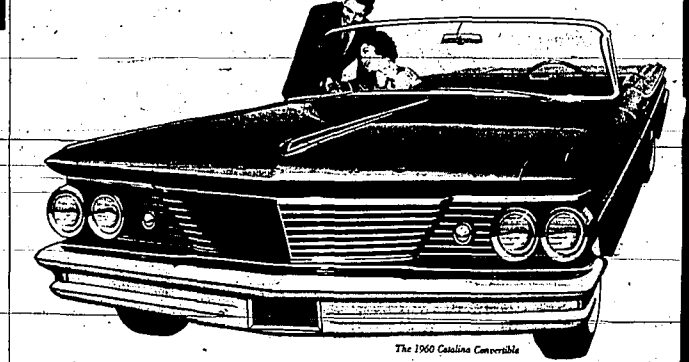

# 7 Candidates Vie Here for 4 Open Posts

 question that was taken up again.  
 Larson stated the present setup "is a possibility of an epidemic." He said a city without a sewage disposal plant has a "runaway situation."  
 Bennett and Larson agreed an improved program of public health will be necessary. Jewell and Hahn agreed that an epidemic means must be found before it can be considered and Jewell added a new "way to limit" must be sought to reduce the program.  
 Hoops approach to the question as that it is up to the individual voter to approve or disapprove. He said it is the commission's job to present the facts and let the voters decide.  
 Burkhardt said it should be done as soon as possible and the facts should be presented plain and simple.

Continued growth of Twin Falls is imminent according to all seven candidates, but not all hopefuls agreed on the industry picture for Twin Falls.  
 Jewell said finally, "I doubt if industry will be the main source of growth of the city in the future."  
 Talking a different opinion was Hahn, Reynolds and Larson who said in essence that heavy industry is not probable although the area is capable of handling "light" industry.

Reynolds stated "We should take advantage of our water supply to pull research industry into the city. Other areas in northern and southern Idaho have this type of industry and are not capable of handling this type of industry because of a lack of water."  
 Reynolds cited agricultural products as possible industries. He stated that southern Idaho should seek industry rather than let it go to northern Utah.

Larson emphasized that Twin Falls has a good labor market and a favorable tax structure and is not "hampered by labor unions." Larson quickly added he is not opposed to unions, but felt they offer no hindrance to industry interested in this area.  
 Hoops admitted the possibility of heavy industry for Twin Falls and added that such a plant would be a possibility. Burkhardt said he would welcome any industry to the area.

The effectiveness of the planning and zoning commission met with some differences of opinion among the candidates.  
 "I think too much time and effort has been spent on zoning recently," Hahn stated.

Other candidates were not as blunt as Hahn and to the contrary Larson and Burkhardt stated the commission has done a commendable job. Both members of the present commission have been advocates of zoning although Burkhardt has been a big dissenter to spot zoning.

"The success of the zoning commission is one of the reasons I would like to run for reelection," Larson commented.  
 Bennett sees the commission question as having reached a climax and is now "cooling down" on the other side." He said the city will always need a zoning and planning commission and it must remain purely advisory.

"I do not believe in spot zoning but zoning is something that must be alive and progressive," Reynolds said. "The zoning commission tried to level but was subjected to pressures that should not have been."  
 Reynolds said that in the past the zoning commission has taken all the responsibility in many instances.

Jewell said persons appointed to such a body should be qualified and should have the ability to qualify them for the commission. He said person has to be liberal to agree with zoning and they must "face reality."

A growing traffic problem in Twin Falls goes hand in hand with a growing population, most candidates agreed. Jewell said all could supply an answer to the problem.  
 The expanded police force as the population expands is advocated by Burkhardt, but he emphasizes, "I don't have the income to pay for these things."

Burkhardt claims the number of parking lots is under control and study of one-way streets is under way.  
 Reynolds said, "It is a matter of providing a means of control and better streets and parking lots along with arterial streets are needed."

Larson offered one-way streets as a major part of the solution and said that the proposed one-way streets that will be necessary when the new U.S. Highway 30 is completed through Twin Falls will spread to other parts of the city.

"I see no need for one-way streets," Jewell said. He added that the parking problem is not great and the present lot of parking lots would handle the problem for some time.

All candidates agreed that the city manager type of government was worked well and should remain. Jewell went further to say he believed "the town should be divided so that the commissioner is elected from a ward, thus giving more representation."

Reynolds, Burkhardt, Bennett and Jewell issued statements with their declaration of candidacy.  
 Reynolds said: "Because of the varied services performed by a modern municipality, it is my conviction that the city commission should be composed of men with a wide variety of experience and training."

 Bennett said: "Because I am retired I can give the job the attention it needs and won't be obligated to anyone for my decisions."

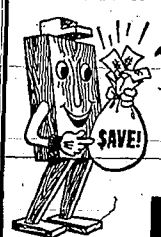

### Reuther Says Unions Must Avoid 'Wars'

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Oct. 9 (AP)—Walter P. Reuther, president of the United Auto Workers, says some way must be found to avoid a war between workers and management.

Such wars he said last night on the eve of the UAW convention, weaken the nation's economy at a time the Soviet Union is growing stronger.

Reuther's 368-page program for the 3,000 delegates includes a call for greater militancy by labor in bargaining, organizing and legislating.

Saving big business dominated the national scene, Reuther added: "It is no more coincidental that the longest steel strike in the nation's history has come during the administration of a Republican President who has endeavored the big business viewpoint in the White House, surrounded himself with big business and rolling companions from big business and adopted industry propaganda on every major question of the day as his personal goal."

At a news conference, Reuther said profit-sharing is still one of the UAW's bargaining goals although it got nowhere in the last contract talks with the auto makers. He suggested it might be a good thing for the steel industry.

 program is the biggest reason Thompson and his employees will not have room to separate particular plates.

Thompson said in the process of assessing trailer houses that a major item will be evaluated as early as possible to the "11 per cent" rule while larger homes must be assessed more.

Idaho law states specifically, "in addition to said license fee of 17.50 and as a prerequisite to licensing, there shall be an assessment levied on each trailer house for every vehicle as provided under section 31-11, Idaho code.

"Applicants for trailer house license shall be required to exhibit the general property tax receipt for the year of registration, before license may be issued. It shall be noted on any highway in Idaho without first being licensed, and any person moving an unlicensed trailer house shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

In the past, Thompson has scattered the license plates throughout the office for distribution to persons asking special numbers, but this year, he says, "there just isn't room to open the doors if you do it."

The county assessor will have six employees working in the license office starting Dec. 1 for the purpose of selling license plates for buying 1000 plates is due for 1960.

Thompson reminded persons that the registration papers or title must be brought before license is purchased. He said all persons with a lien must bring a slip from the loan company.

Thompson estimates he saved over 1000 to 1200 plates for persons last year. He said the discontinuation of the practice might carry over another year until the registration program is completed.

He added persons are expected to show up in front of the license office the morning of Dec. 1 for the first 50 numbers and explains numbers 1 through 50 have never been saved but have gone to the first persons to come to the office.

"Some of them will open the door the night camped in front of the door for one of those low numbers," Thompson added.

Thompson, now serving his sixth two-year term in the position, said, "I've liked to save plates for people who have asked." He added that the practice was never advertised or publicized and that word has been passed from one person to another.

"Steel is not a perishable commodity and there were stockpiles to serve the necessary demand."

"But in the dock strike literally thousands of tons of perishable commodities were piling up. This was true in New York and other seaboard cities which depend on these commodities for survival."

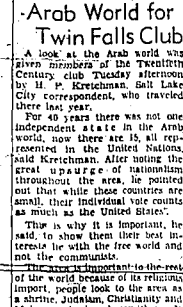
