French Offer To Talk With Rebel Group

PARIS, Oct. 12 (UPI)—France's offer to discuss an end to the Algerian cease-fire with the FLN rebels has been rejected today for an indefinite period.

In a taped statement broadcast today, the United States State Department said that "we are prepared to discuss a cease-fire with those who are fighting, and not those who are plotting."

The Algerian refusal is the latest in a series of moves made up of leaders of the FLN, who have repeatedly said they are not willing to discuss any political issues as long as the purely military question remains open.

Richard Good and De Gaulle remain in the condition.

Recent press reports from Tunis said that the Algerian government is not ready to discuss the issue at any time.

There are talks with the FLN in Algeria over the possibility of a 5-year-old truce.

The bombing of a ship in the Mediterranean, French troops backed down and killed two members of a shogun gang, which was a 5-year-old truce.

Latin America Given Loans

PAULO ALTO, Calif., Oct. 12 (UPI)—Forty per cent of the loans granted in the past 26 years by the Export-Import bank, Washington, D. C., have gone to Latin America, according to a bank official.

First Vice President Lynn Blanton spoke yesterday at the concluding banquet of the Stanford conference on Latin America. The three-day meeting was attended by 100 educators, journalists, business and "other" leaders from 15 of the western hemisphere.

Blanton told the delegates that total loans to Mexico, Central and South America in the fiscal year of the bank's existence amounted to \$3,800,000,000.

Most of the money, he said, went for development purposes, such as to finance machinery and equipment, utilities and transportation facilities.

Marshall, Prof. Jordan M. Young, Pacific college, said that the United States was in danger of losing Brazil in the cold war. He called for a discussion group on Brazil, which he said has a "strong, a sense of manifest destiny."

Huge U.S. Space Plan Limps Along on Just 40-Hour Week

EVANSVILLE, Ala., Oct. 12 (AP)—Project Saturn, key to the United States' big leap into space, has been limping along on a 40-hour week, keep-down-the-overhead drive.

Officials' progress at Redstone Arsenal here is any less than the United States space program seems to be making little headway in the space race.

A decision is expected this week whether the Saturn project will be transferred to the national aeronautics and space administration. Details for the transfer of the Saturn program would be turned over to the air force.

Whether the Saturn program is transferred is expected to be announced in Washington next week. But the pace so far hardly has been breakneck.

Maj. Gen. John D. Medaris, commander of the army ordnance missile command here, says, "At present, plans based on the present pace plus what appears to be the probable budget for next year do not support the Saturn program at the speed at which it could be developed. We are not talking in terms of dollars, either. We are talking in terms of time."

Chinese Reds Admit Russia Is "Big" Boss

Moscow, says the red Chinese loudly and clearly, is the big boss. Peking's Communist party has gone out of its way to emphasize that the Soviet Union is the undisputed leader of the world communist movement.

Herter's remark justified more than justifies the expressed conviction of Secretary of State Christian A. Herter that the Kremlin is responsible for the actions of China and the whole red bloc. Its theme also was broadcast in foreign languages.

It was not a long editorial. But no less than eight times it stated unequivocally that in matters of the world revolution and the strategy of the revolution, the Soviet leaders were the bosses.

VATICAN CITY, Oct. 12 (UPI)—Pope John XXIII delisted American visitors yesterday when he addressed them for the first time in English—and used the occasion to indicate Mother Elizabeth Anne Berni may become the first American-born person to be beatified.

A few hours earlier he had Spanish and surprised Spanish-speaking persons the world over by speaking Spanish for the first time in a radio speech closing the Argentine National Eucharistic congress at Cordoba, Argentina.

The pontiff's use of English came during a visit to the North American college, Rome, now celebrating its centennial. Today he was receiving scores of American pilgrims.

Deer and elk hunting will be general throughout most of Idaho Saturday when 36 more management units are opened to buckskin harvesting and 22 other areas are opened to wapiti nimrod, the fish and game department said today. All counties, including the four northern counties, are open to black bear hunting throughout the state, including the state's only brunt protection is lifted through Nov. 30. Grizzly bears, however, are protected on a year-round basis in all counties.

Webb's hunt, the moose in that particular hunt (No. 302) ranged high in the mountains and were not seen around the marshes. He found his animal far up on the mountains early Wednesday morning and downed it with one shot from a 300 magnum. But it took a second shot to dispatch the moose.

Levi Stoller, chief of big game management, said that deer hunting this year appears ahead of what it was at this point last season, and that the elk kill is somewhat behind the 1958 figure for this date, probably because of stormy weather the first week-end of the season. He issued his estimates on about 2,400 hunter-returned cards which had been returned by the middle of last week.

Hunter cards report that 600 deer and 457 elk have been harvested. About one-fourth of the deer were taken on middle fork. Other figures showed 46 moose, 100 sheep and 44 big game sheep were killed. Mohler also has reported 10 north Idaho moose kills, and nine others taken in western counties.

Mohler stressed that game biologists at the various checking stations throughout the state estimate that animals, and that all species appear to be in good flesh.
