Red Budget ups Science Funds, Citizen Benefits

MOSCOW, Oct. 27 (UPI)—The Soviet government presented a 186-billion-ruble (744,800,000 U.S. dollars) budget today which boasts spending for science and for benefits to the average Russian and promises a surplus without cutting defense funds. Deputy Finance Minister Vasily Garbuzov, presenting the budget at the second annual meeting of the supreme soviet—Russia's congress—promised a 10 percent increase in pensions, housing, education and culture, and health and physical well-being.

The proposed spending for military purposes in the budget totaled the 1,770-member parliament today was for 24 billion rubles, or 100 million U.S. dollars. But the percentage was slightly higher because of the increased size of the military budget.

The proposed budget would have a surplus for the coming year of 27,000,000 rubles (107,000,000 U.S. dollars).

The official exchange rate for the dollar is four to the dollar. The 10 to the dollar business exchange rate is 20 to the dollar. The dollar given here is based on four to one official rate.

Garbuzov told the congress that the government would depend on direct taxation of the people for 50 percent of the 1960 budget, a cut from the 7.8 percent of direct taxation revenue in the 1959 budget.

Russians Show Second Steel Firm Signs And Name Sites

MOSCOW, Oct. 27 (AP)—The hidden side of the moon is largely draped with far fewer landmarks than we see on its face, Soviet scientists tonight. They presented this analysis of photographs ascribed to picture-taking apparatus aboard Lunik III—used Oct. 7 as the Soviet rocket station passed beyond the moon. Russian names are being given eight landmarks. As presented last night on Moscow TV the pictures meant little to ordinary observers. A host of an announcer pointed to certain areas and said, "This is a sea. This is a crater."

But Prof. Alexander Mikhailov in a broadcast report listed findings: "The uneven part of the moon is considerably more irregular than the side turned toward the earth. It contains fewer seas and fewer craters."

He said the general monotony of the landscape is "beyond doubt associated with the question of the origin of the configuration of the moon."

About 30 percent of Lunik's exposures showed the craters characterized face of the moon. "The dark patches of the so-called seas are clearly visible," Mikhailov said. "Some of them are located on the other side of the moon."

The Russians say the pictures were transmitted to Earth on Tuesday in 29 minutes at distances up to 200,000 miles—just the distance of the moon.

"The Russian pictures named 'The Sea of Moscow,'" said Mikhailov. "This is a 150-mile-wide depression north of the lunar equator."

It was described as situated between the 20th and 30th meridians and the 10th and 16th meridians.

A bay in the southern part of this sea has been called "The Bay of Astoria."

The name "Tokolovsky" was given to a crater "more than 60 miles in diameter with a ring around it clearly discernible in the southern hemisphere."

Second Steel Firm Signs Pact With Steelworkers; Taft-Hartley Ruling Due

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 27 (AP)—Detroit Steel company, one of the nation's non-union steel producers, today followed the lead of Kaiser Steel corporation and signed a similar agreement with the United Steelworkers union. David J. McDonald, union president, called the settlement another wedge in the industry's solid front. The signing followed some 16 hours of agreement in Washington between the USW and Kaiser, one of 96 companies shut in the now 106-day steel strike. The U. S. third circuit court of appeals was scheduled to announce at 4 p.m. (EST) whether the 600,000 striking steelworkers must return to work for 30 days under a Taft-Hartley injunction or may continue their strike.

The ruling, however, was not to be released until about 4:45 p.m. (EST) because appellate courts here usually wait until after the country's stock markets close to hand down decisions which affect stock prices.

Detroit Steel employing 4300, is the industry's 16th largest producer with an annual input capacity of 16 million tons. It has been operating under a contract extension with the union since the nationwide steel strike July 15.

McDonald said the Detroit Steel pact includes the same provisions as the Kaiser settlement.

Both are 30-month agreements, effective Nov. 1 and expiring June 30, 1961.
