Ike's Brother Gets Top Post In New Unit

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (UPI)—President Eisenhower's brother, Edgar, who once criticized the big federal budget, has been named to top post in a new organization dedicated to opposing "reactionary" government and politics.

The President's older brother, a Wash., lawyer, was appointed one of 10 trustees of the "Constitutional Americans for Admin. Defense" (C.A.D.) (Nov. 11).

Conservation backed Morelli said the organization—aimed at eliminating "existing political virus of our body politic"—is a return to the "constitutional conservatism" of the founding fathers.

Morelli said the organization would work to elect politicians of "constitutional governments."

In 1957, Edgar Eisenhower criticized the President for the then record practice budget of \$71,000,000,000. This year the President's budget called for spending \$75 billion dollars.

Morelli said the trustees were selected from Republicans, Democrats and would serve without pay.

Other members named: Philip M. McCanna, Latoro, Omaha, Neb., banker; Allan B. Olson, Western Springs, Ill., former president of the American Farm Bureaus; Bureau federation, Dr. Bob Cox, Raleigh, N. C., a member of the board of directors of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce.

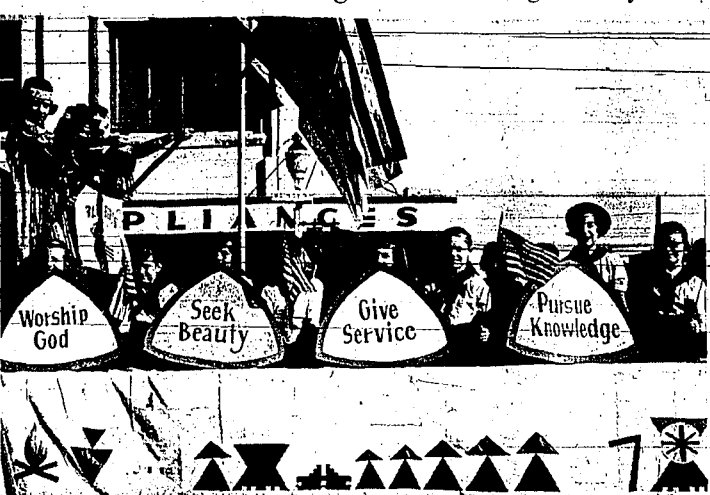

Omission of Cairo on Ike's Long Trip More Noticeable

The omission of Cairo from President Eisenhower's goodwill itinerary was noticeable with the addition of Spain and Australia.

The President's stops now include France, Spain, Morocco, Tunisia, Lebanon, Italy, Greece, Turkey, Iran, Pakistan, India and Afghanistan.

The skipping of Cairo comes just at a time when the Soviet Union is making new advances to President Gamal Abdel Nasser and the United Arab Republic.

Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev is denying support for Syrian and Egyptian communists against whom the UAR has been taking steps, and there have been reports that the Kremlin actually intervened against communist activity in Iraq some months ago.

Khrushchev is now quoted as saying that the time is not yet for the emergence of communism in the Arab countries.

It is proposed to continue military aid to Nasser as long as there is no international disarmament agreement, and to step up economic aid. Although they are committed only to the first stages of construction of the Aswan dam, Khrushchev now says the Soviets are prepared to go right ahead on the project.

All this comes after a period when Nasser suspected Khrushchev might pull the rug out from under him through communist political activity and reductions in economic aid. Fear of a communist coup in Iraq had been revived after the attempt to assassinate President Abdul Karim Qassem. Khrushchev is working delicately to ally all these fears.

Whether it would have been wise for President Eisenhower to visit for President Nasser to ally all these fears.

Boyle Says Americans Have Blues in Chasing Pleasures

BY HAL BOYLE
NEW YORK, Nov. 12 (AP)—Side-walk scrawls of a pavement painter today isn't the common cold. It's "the blues"—the 20th century blues.

There are certain periods of history more given to melancholy than others, and this is one of them.

How often do you hear people complain, "I've lost my nerve."

"I'm down in the dumps?" The only ones who don't are hermits. Hermits often are the happiest people in civilization because they are out of it. They escape the spiritual malady.

Why should this generation be particularly cursed with that periodical darkness of the spirit, that aching mental void, that heart-tearing emptiness of the soul we know colloquially as "the blues"?

Is it merely the reflective shadow of the threat of atomic annihilation that hangs over us all?

This could be the answer except for one fact—man is usually least melancholy when his days are most perilous. Ironically, he is in danger than when he is at his ease.

Man has never been more comfortable, more free of pain, than in the present generation of Americans. We aren't worn out with work. We're worn out from

the pursuit of pleasure and trying too hard to enjoy ourselves.

"Chasing for its own sake" was our leading industry. As a child, when it has played too hard, suddenly breaks out in tears, so are grownups overcome by the melancholy that comes from seeking too ardently the false rainbow of cheap delights and self-indulgence.

Wise old Samuel Johnson gave one description nearly two centuries ago: "Employment, air, and hardships, prevent melancholy."

Of course, melancholy isn't altogether an unhealthy thing. An old English proverb says, "He is a fool that is not melancholy once a day."

Victor Hugo observed: "Melancholy is the pleasure of being sad."

Melancholy also separates the men from the women.

For there is hell upon Earth it is to be found in a melancholy man's heart," wrote Robert Burton.

You will note he said nothing about a woman's heart. A woman is too intelligent to be too overcome by melancholy. She is too much of a fighter. She sheds a few tears, takes a nap, trips to the nearest store, buys herself a new hat or giraffe, and comes home feeling fine again.

Women have a wonderful ability to lift their own spirits in small ways, and to charge themselves from Cassandra to Cinderella in three hours.

Men don't. They lack this internal lever of the spirit to pry their soul from black despair. They mope longer because, unlike women, they don't have "that common sense to do something about it immediately. They sit in a pool of melancholy and refuse to move."

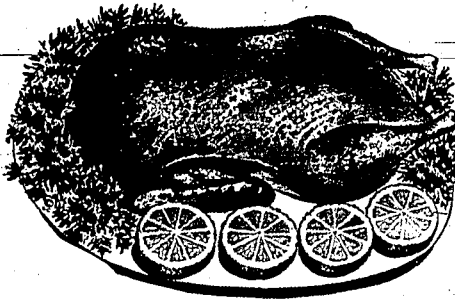

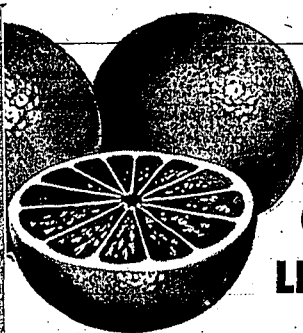

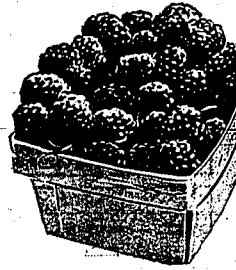

Plain Ordinary Light Might Work Agricultural Miracles

WASHINGTON (NEA)—Light—just plain ordinary light—may turn out to be the friend of the farmer and the milk raiser. Scientists at department of agriculture research stations are finding new uses for light that may work miracles on the farm, in forestry, in vegetable and flower growing—and in fur farming. Take a tree as an example. Most trees grow in the summer, the dormant in winter. This, of course, is unprofitable. Trees do this in the north because it is cold. But the tree is such a creature of custom that in the south trees likewise shed their leaves and stop growing in winter. Research men at the agriculture department's plant physiology research station in Beltsville, Md., have discovered that if the shorter days and longer nights that trigger trees into winter doldrums, they've discovered that if you use a light, you can fool the trees into thinking the days are still long and the nights still short, you can get a tree growing all winter, to the profit of everyone concerned. Of course, it's too expensive to keep the southern forests lighted. But in nurseries, where the shoals are close together, it may be possible in a few years to make young trees grow two years in 12 months. A milk raiser has the same time-equals-money problem. His milk must be brought to a cold weather prime before going to the fur market. Milk men have discovered that an innocent unsuspecting milk can be hurried to its prime in a shorter time by the judicious wiring and taking away of light. This shortens raising time and saves money. Department of agriculture scientists working with Dr. Harry A. Borwick think this same method may be workable on those other animals that produce furs for the lady of the house. Chicken farm operators are already using light to entice hens into laying more eggs. But there are other possibilities. Changing the amount of light while they're growing may lead to better-looking chickens and turkeys, or aid the fowls to fatten in a shorter time. There's the possibility that apple, pear and other fruit trees might be made to bear fruit in off seasons by the judicious use of light and darkness. Already—some "nurseries" are producing chrysanthemum in orchid blooms at any season of the year customers want them—by using light and darkness. With chrysanthemum, blooming is delayed by turning on the lights a few minutes to several hours in the middle of the night. 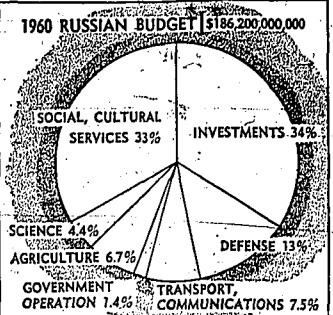

Miss Peru Edgard Corine edged Miss Peru, Maria Huel, 17, to take the crown which ranks with Long Beach's "Miss Universe" and Atlantic City's "Miss America" in the upper bracket of beauty contests.

Both Loretta Powell, Bridgeport, Conn., representing the United States and Miss Canada—Ilana J. Demerutis, representing the United States, were responsible for the 37-inch bust that topped the winner's 5'10 1/2 height. Miss Powell's measurements were taken, however, and she charged dropped.

They also claimed that Corine is engaged to one of the judges—Frenchman Claude Behr, a beauty contest promoter who sponsored Corine in last year's Miss Universe competition.

Charge Denied

"I've heard this talk but believe me there's nothing to it," Behr declared. "Some of the girls apparently believe Corine is my fiancée but that's impossible—I'm already married."

Corine denied the padding charge, stating she had no support, no wires, no padding.

Third prize went to Miss Ghent, 18, of 17 Belgium. Her measurements were taken, however, and she was followed by Anne Thweil, England, 22, and Kirsten Olsen, 20, Denmark.

Clubs Behind Johnson Are On Increase

AUSTIN, Tex., Nov. 12 (AP)—Formation of Johnson-for-President clubs is spreading like a prairie fire across Texas, Associated Press survey shows.

The spark that touched it off came less than a month ago, Oct. 17, from House Speaker Sam Rayburn, D., Tex.

The most remarkable feature of the statewide survey is not so much the number of clubs—now more than 10 and growing every day—but the variety of backing and the hefty local and state political muscle added.

The senior senator from Texas on the record in running for reelection only, he says it is long time until the 1960 convention and it's too early for him to take the plunge as an open candidate for the Democratic nomination.

But Rayburn and other backers such as Texas Democratic National Committeeman Byron Skelton, Temple; Gov. Price Daniel and state Democratic Party executive committee chairman, Ed Connally, Abilene, shrug off Johnson's disavowal and step up the work. Johnson's renomination for a new six-year term is regarded by his backers as the best bet. Texas has been no sign of an opponent.

State Forest Fund Total Is \$1,280,000

BOISE, Nov. 12 (UPI)—U. S. Sen. Frank Church, D., Idaho, reported that more than one million dollars was received by Idaho today for the state forest fund from its national forest receipts for the past fiscal year.

The \$1,280,000 received by Idaho, Church said, represented 25 percent of \$5,120,000 paid into the national treasury from the sale of timber and through other forest receipts.

The senator said the forest service has estimated it will spend a total of \$13,800,000 in Idaho during the present fiscal year, including \$4,157,000 for stepped-up construction of forest roads and trails.

His 1959-60 budgeting fires on Idaho forests during the fiscal year was \$70,000, insect and disease control was \$1,000,000, and the largest item was forest protection and management, set at \$4,120,000.

PUG-Will Study Depot's Closing

FERDINAND, Nov. 12 (AP)—A petition seeking closure of the Camasa Prairie railroad depot here has been taken under advisement by the Idaho public utilities commission after two hours of testimony on the proposal.

PUG Commissioner P. E. Meek and Ralph H. Wickburg, both Boise, did not indicate when they would announce a decision.

The Utah Pacific and Northern Pacific railroads, joint owners of the Camasa Prairie line which runs from Liver Junction in southeastern Washington to Grandview and Headquarters, 10 1/2 miles north of the depot, cited economy reasons.

The petition asked that account of the fact that the depot is transferred to other points, such as Cottonwood, Cottonwood is nine miles from the depot.

Canada to Store Atom Warheads

OTTAWA, Nov. 12 (UPI)—Minister of Defense Pearson reports that he expects facilities will be available to Canada for storing nuclear warheads by the time Bomarc launching bases are ready for use.

As he ended a cabinet meeting at which a report will be made on joint U.S.-Canada defense talks Sunday and Monday, Pearson said the nuclear warheads will be under joint control of U.S. and Canadian officers.

Under U.S. law they cannot be used except in event of attack and Canadian government participation also will be required, he said.

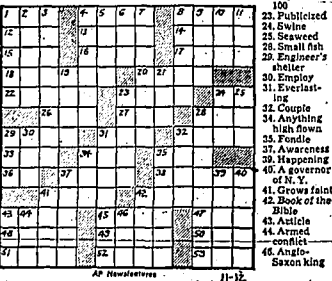

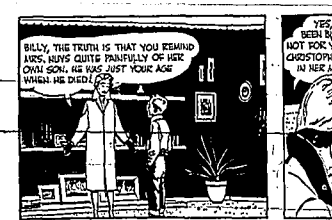

Police Might Some Time Use Tranquilizer Gun as Weapon

New Weapon

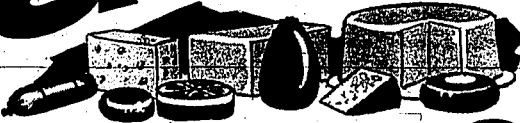

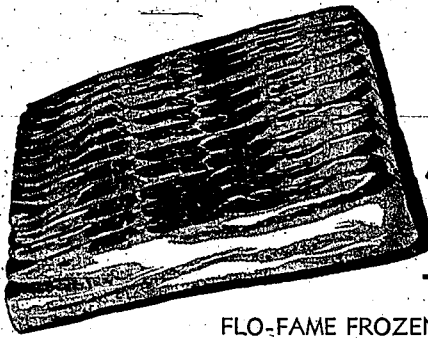

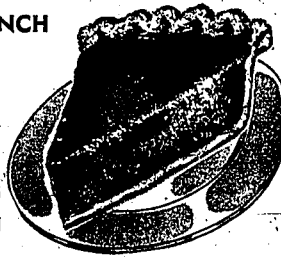
