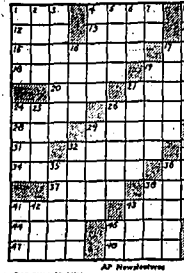

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 23 (U.S.)—An association accused of conspiring with steel firms to corner West coast trade in steel reinforcing bars claims that it is actually a "non-profit" company to compete more effectively and efficiently.

In an affidavit filed Monday, the U. S. government asked disbandment of the Western Reinforcing Steel Fabricators Association. It accused the association of conspiring with steel fabricators and 12 fabricators to cut down foreign imports, impede small fabricating firms and make non-competitive bids.

P. F. Clough, manager of the association, said at his Oakland headquarters.

"Contrary to the government's allegations, this association has actually served as a source for the preservation of free competition in this industry. It has allowed the small firm to pool their resources and secure economic stability for the future. What otherwise would be available to the larger fabricator."

"Having this information available through the association has enabled these small companies to compete more effectively and efficiently."

The government charge involved trade in bars which are used to reinforce concrete. The trading activity embraced in the suit was in the states of Arizona, California, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Utah and Washington. The six steel firms named included U. S. Steel and Bethlehem.
