Miss Ward and Bayerle left San Francisco for Reno Wednesday afternoon for Reno where they were to meet her brother-in-law, Tyler, and his wife, Mrs. Paul Barker, Sausalito, Calif. The group planned to drive to Twin Falls together, Tyler said.

Mr. and Mrs. Ward left Twin Falls early Thursday morning for Reno. Tyler said no funeral plans have been made.

Miss Ward was graduated from Twin Falls high school and attended the University of Utah, Salt Lake City. She was employed as a secretary in San Francisco and had worked for about four years, according to Tyler.

America's Most Powerful Rocket Fails to Launch Satellite to Orbit Moon

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., Nov. 26 (AP)—The most powerful rocket ever developed by this nation failed on its maiden flight today and ruined a U. S. bid to put the first satellite into orbit around the moon. The Atlas-Able rocket thundered aloft exactly on schedule at 2:26 a.m. Perched atop it was a 372-pound payload designed for the lunar orbit. An hour after launch, the national aeronautics and space administration reported that second-stage signals were lost 70 seconds after launching. There is no record of the second stage having fired and its must have been the third stage that did not fire, the NASA said.

Juvenile Delinquency Is Nothing New; Pilgrim Fathers Had Similar Problem

 When the kids get "bickering" and screaming and fighting, this is the old Pilgrim fathers. They came to the new world to get away from it all. Only when they got here, they found they had brought it all with them. At Plymouth harbor for their permanent base. Hands Mayflower included, set to work erecting the 20-foot-square common house. Francis went, exploring. Three miles inland a hill caught his attention. He summited up the tallest tree and had a look around. Such reckless disregard for his own and the colony's safety at a time when Indians were "advising" might have drawn the wrath of Capt. Miles Standish, the Douglas defense chief, had Francis returned with valuable information. He reported seeing "a great sea" and the incredible John Clark, first mate of the Mayflower, to the spot next day. "Cut down to size from a boy's vivid imagination, the sea turned out to be only two fat-sized lakes. The discovery helped save the colony from starvation. They are fine fresh water," Governor Bradford described them in his personal history of the colony. "A full of fish and fowle. A brooke issues from it. It will be an excellent help in time."

Instead of a Heking, Francis got a reward. The larger of the lakes was named "Billington Sea" in his honor and is so known to this day. Next, his brother John kicked over the traces.

About the latter end of this month April 1621, Bradford wrote: "One John Billington lost himself in the woods and wandered up and down some five days, living on berries and what he could find."

Meanwhile, back at the fort, Miles Standish was in his usual lowering rage, which was lowering indeed for one who stood only five feet high. The redoubtable "Captain Shrimpe," as the irascible called him behind his back, was known to be a "little chin-ny."

2 Protestants Deplore Birth Control View

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26 (UPI)—Two noted Protestant leaders today deplored a U. S. state department Catholic bishop opposing any use of foreign aid funds to promote "artificial" birth prevention, claiming that such a move would encourage countries suffering from population pressures.

Bishop James A. Pike of San Francisco, said the stand taken by the Catholic hierarchy would condemn tens of millions of people in less fortunate parts of the world to starvation, misery and despair.

Policy Questioned

He doubted whether the policy enunciated by the bishop is "binding on Roman Catholic candidates for public office."

Dr. John C. Bennett, dean of the theological school at New York, said it was ironic to see Catholic leaders pressing "a point of view on birth control which has no sound moral or religious basis, and which has been rejected by most Christian groups."

The Catholic statement, issued here last night on behalf of more than 100 bishops, charged that "pestilential population predictions" are used by the state department to force United States into an "immoral policy" of promoting birth control in underdeveloped countries.

Position Restated

The bishop stated that American Catholics would not support any use of public funds to help establish programs of artificial birth prevention at home or abroad.

He reiterated the long-standing Catholic position that the only "natural" and therefore "morally permissible" means of limiting births was through periodic abstinence from sexual relations.

The bishop did not say, however, what stand his church would take on use of U. S. funds to promote this kind of birth control in areas threatened by overpopulation.

X-15 Project Gets Delayed By Accident

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 26 (UPI)—An engine explosion and a broken fuselage have delayed by about three weeks a program to put the first manned aircraft 100 miles above the earth.

A North American Aviation corporation spokesman has disclosed that the X-15-15 of three seventh-level flights was grounded for six days and the national aeronautics and space administration (NASA) will be unable to complete the first space-age project by Dec. 1.

Blast Took X-15

The X-15 was jolted by an explosion in flight Nov. 6. Test Pilot Scott Crossfield said the aircraft "went down" on Rosamond dry lake at Edwards air force base in the Mojave desert. The fuselage was damaged in the landing.

"Possibly we've been delayed about three weeks," the spokesman admitted.

Crossfield said the time was being "utilized" to do the repairs on the X-15 that has no bearing on an accident.

United Press International learned that an investigation has begun to see answers to what happened although a board of inquiry's examination is still incomplete.

Ship Landed Heavily

The X-15 landed about 3,000 pounds heavier than on previous flights because Crossfield was able to jettison only a portion of his fuel on the engine which complicated the landing procedure.

The force of impact of the landing, which is made on skids, and the fact that the pilot could not go around for another landing caused the damage.

The two other experimental ships are being kept on the ground pending completion of a full study of the accident.

Cash Receipts For Farms in Region Lower

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (UP)—Cash receipts dropped for farmers of Utah and Idaho during the first three quarters of 1936.

However, farmers in five intermountain states pocketed more money from sales of their produce in the same period, farmers in Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, Nevada and New Mexico received more money.

The increases were offset by higher production expenses.

Nationally farmers' net income for the nine months was down 15 per cent from 1935. Production expenses rose three per cent.

Utah farmers received \$108,482,000 this year, compared with \$117,487,000 last year. Receipts from livestock and related products dropped from \$40,898,000 to \$27,085,000 and those from crops dropped from \$21,789,000 to \$20,820,000.

Cash farm receipts dropped from \$259,325,000 in the 1935 period to \$238,443,000 this year. Receipts from livestock and related marketing increased from \$128,223,000 to \$140,880,000, but crop income was down from \$121,092,000 to \$117,563,000.

Increases in gross cash receipts in the five states were: Montana, \$28,270,000 in 1935 to \$26,055,000 in 1936; Wyoming, \$27,116,000 to \$27,560,000; Colorado, \$21,515,000 to \$21,759,000; Nevada, \$14,896,000 to \$13,280,000, and New Mexico, \$27,580,000 to \$105,729,000.

U. S. Officials Seek Accord On Talk Date

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (UP)—State department officials said they hope the Western powers can agree on a date in middle or late April for a summit conference.

Informants reported they were aware of reports from Paris that President Charles de Gaulle's government feels that April 25 would be a satisfactory date, but officials said to this effect had not been received.

Diplomats of the United States, Britain, France and the Netherlands agreed last week that they would pass on to their governments the word that the period April 15-25 seemed to be a convenient time for the leaders of East and West to get together since there are no other commitments in that period.

Secretary of State Christian A. Herter told a news conference Tuesday that no Western declaration on an East-West summit date would be made until the heads of the Western powers met in Paris Dec. 19.

Seasonal Slump Listed for Work

R. E. Cutler, manager of the local employment security agency office, reports Twin Falls is experiencing a seasonal slowdown in employment, according to the weekly unemployment report.

Jerome reported 67 new unemployment insurance claims, a total of 207 active claims. Gooding, 10 unemployment claims, with a total of 41; Burley, 13, for a total of 25; and Twin Falls, 72, to make a total of 228.

In Idaho, 1,730 initial new unemployment claims were received during the week, making a total of 87,000 active claims.

Cutler said there is some pickup in Twin Falls during the pre-Christmas rush. Job openings have opened so far this month were considerably less than this time last year because of the seasonal slump in the labor market.

Drivers of Firm Hear Safety Talk

Grant Searcy, Salt Lake City, Utah, Interstate Motor Lines safety director, spoke to company drivers at a safety meeting Wednesday morning at the Rogerson coffee shop.

Searcy explained the necessity of increased safety effort on the part of all drivers. In 1932 he said, Now it has 24. They drive a total of \$3,400 miles per day.

Surplus Food Use Is Urged In Aid Policy

IDAHO FALLS, Nov. 28 (U.S.)—Use of food as this nation's major weapon in its foreign policy program was advocated Wednesday night by U.S. Sen. Frank Church, D. Ida.

Public Law 480, under which food surpluses are donated or sold in non-commercial channels for foreign currencies, should be expanded into a genuine 'food for peace' program, Church said.

"In this way we can use food, in place of tax dollars, to fight communism and at the same time help the farmer get the fair reward for producing abundantly."

Church, a member of the senate foreign relations committee, spoke at a public meeting here sponsored by the Upper Snake River Kiwanis club.

In his address he suggested several changes in American foreign policy, some of which would be effective immediately and others which would be handled as long-range policy objectives.

He proposed immediate termination of military aid to the communist, Chinese, and other areas remote from Russia and China, the people don't need planes and tanks defended themselves against communism," Church said.

"When we place those weapons in the hands of the local rulers, we run the risk they may be turned against the people we are trying to help. This is what Batista did in Cuba. It is no accident that the communists and their foreign slogans to rally the people behind his faltering regime."

He also urged continued efforts to bring agreement with Russia on suspension of further nuclear tests, backed by a control system which will give absolute assurance that the Russians are keeping their word, even as we intend to keep ours.

"As long-range objectives, Church listed:

"The creation of a multi-national agency—through either NATO or the United Nations—through which the prosperous, industrial nations might contribute their fair share in a concerted effort to foster economic growth in the underdeveloped regions of the world.

"The stimulation of population explosion" in Asia and the Middle East which threatens to swamp the efforts of those countries to lift themselves from their primitive level of economic development.

"Steady attention to proposals which will permit realistic progress toward enforceable disarmament."

The Idaho Democrat charged the United States "maintains an illegal posture when it holds great hoards of food while others are starving."

He urged changes in the present agriculture program to make it work. Senator Church explained that congress and the President are at "loggerheads" over the farm program.

Church also mentioned the large surplus of wheat in storage which he said was enough to make 68 loaves of bread for everyone on Earth.

Jury's Decision Reversed in T.F.

A verdict returned Monday by a Twin Falls district court jury in a debt suit was reversed Wednesday by the Twin Falls District Court Judge Theron Ward.

The case involved a suit filed by Edward Stricker to collect about \$600 on a note Stricker claimed for Dale Henry, who claims was counter claimed by Henry who said Stricker owed him approximately \$600 in wages. Henry is owner of the Wooden Spur cafe and tavern, Ketchum, and Henry was employed by him at one time.

The jury ruled in favor of Stricker and Henry appealed the verdict.

Judge Ward said Wednesday he based his ruling on the supreme court. He ruled that the verdict be in favor of Henry and that he awarded only court costs.

Layoffs Due for Chrysler Plants

DETROIT, Nov. 28 (U.S.)—Chrysler corporation said Wednesday that 10,000 workers would be laid off for one week starting Dec. 2 because of a lack of steel.

All but three plants will be closed Thursday. Chrysler said two of those three—Plymouth assembly at Detroit and the St. Louis assembly plant—will close at the end of the regular shift on Dec. 1. The Jefferson plant in Detroit will close at the end of work Dec. 2.

Chrysler now has about 23,000 of its 75,000 hourly rated workers idle. This rise to 35,000 during the week shutdown.

The remaining workers are engaged in manufacturing and tooling operations not directly connected with car assembly.

Morocco Victims Are Getting Pools

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Nov. 28 (U.S.)—Cargo of American-made swimming pools was reported on route to Morocco for a health-care program for some 10,000 people who died recently through the use of bubbling oil for cooking.

Doughboy Industries, Inc., with offices here, said 18 of the above-ground pools were ordered by an agent representing the Moroccan ministry of health and were being flown there by air.

Cranberries? Stains Called True Hazard

BY ARTHUR EDSON
WASHINGTON, Nov. 26 (AP)—The nation's cleaners are out with their own Thanksgiving word of caution of cranberries.

Beware of cranberry stains, said the National Institute of Dry Cleaning. They can be difficult to get out.

Or in the timely words of Gordon Leonhardt, an instructor in spot removal at the Institute's school: "The Thanksgiving you're more likely to stain your clothes by spilling cranberries than you are to get cancer by eating them."

Cranberries now on sale have been cleared of contamination by the way. Dr. Leonhardt plans to eat some with his turkey?

"I do," he said.

And suppose he spilled some. What then?

Well, it seems that in times of gustatory crises we instinctively do the wrong thing. We try to rub the cursed spot off.

"What are you can do," Leonhardt said.

If he drops a blob of cranberries on his pants, he will take a knife and lift—but not scrape—it off. Occasionally when he spills, Leonhardt may sponge the spot, but the ladies may be denied even this.

"If the cranberries happen to fall out on a satin, silk or taffeta dress, beware," he says. "Even a tiny drop of water can hurt the finish of these fabrics—so you should use only a dry cloth."

"Use it like a blotter; blot, don't rub."

Leonhardt claims the next error is to hang the garment up and forget to send it to the cleaners. The longer the spot is there, the harder it is to get out.

His advice is take it to the cleaners as quickly as possible, explain what happened, let a trained eye survey the spot, the material, the dye used, the ornamentation, the size of the affected area.

In short, what works on one garment may be a disaster on another. And all the synthetic in various combinations aren't helping matters much either.

Let the cranberries fall where they may. You've done your best to be prepared.

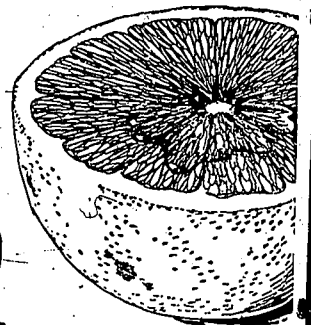

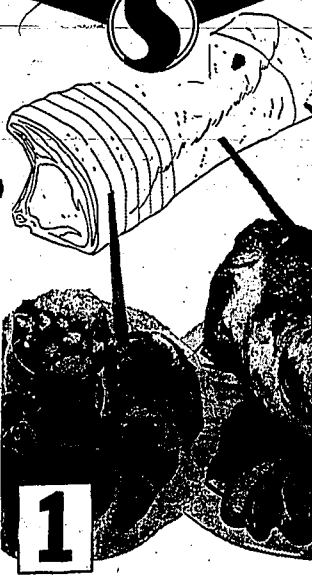

NEW YORK, Nov. 25 (UP)—The last Thanksgiving in a decade dined the fat-calfers, and the nation will more be thankful for that to worry about. But there will be plenty to worry about after the turkey is digested. Property is fairly widespread today in the United States. The international situation is about as quiet as anyone can ever expect it to be.

Toxic Paints Said Hazard In Submarine

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—"If it moves, you salute it; if it doesn't—yon paint it!"

This creed of American sailors has been modified because of potential health hazards from fresh paint aboard long-submerged nuclear submarines, a navy doctor reports.

The word came from Lieut. Cmdr. John H. Ebersole, former medical officer on America's first two atomic subs—the Nautilus and the Seawolf.

Toxic Benzene Appears

He told the scientific assembly of the District of Columbia Medical Society that in the early dives of the Nautilus there was a mysterious appearance of the potentially toxic chemical benzene.

It was present in up to four parts per million of air the men breathed.

While this would have been tolerable in nonnuclear subs which can remain submerged an average of only 12 hours, it loomed as a distinct hazard for the up-to-100-hour dives then on tap for the Nautilus, he said.

Paint Tried

Medical detectives finally traced the source of the benzene to "very tough" paint the navy had used at that time, Ebersole related.

The doctor said that since that time, the navy has experimented with water-based paints for submarines but he indicated that even those might present hazards under long submergence. Therefore, he said, the navy has chosen to cut down on paint jobs to the very minimum aboard its nuclear subs.

Expert Talks Of Headaches From Tension

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 (AP)—Do you suffer from headaches when you get up in the morning? There's a new "let-down headache" which is the most likely cause of office workers' headaches, according to a study newly recognized.

The study was conducted by the U.S. Public Health Service, Washington, D.C., and is the first of its kind to be published in a leading medical journal.

Headaches are common and many people may come up with such headaches after the week's tension of the week's tension and of doing the preparing for and delivering the paper two or three times on Sunday, and confessions on Saturday, and so on.

Headaches which are common on Saturday morning when they wake up and suddenly realize they don't have to face all the things as they have all week.

In the case of the let-down headache, the stretching of the blood vessels and other tissues of the head in proper tone. When comes the let-down, with tension removed, the blood vessels stretch, blood rushes through them and headaches result. People who may have them can take heart.

Prevention Possible Headaches says that in many cases they can be prevented by:

1. Facing yourself during the week so you don't build up so much tension.
2. Learning your physiological and emotional limits—and remaining within them.
3. Sleeping with the head of your bed elevated.
4. Avoid constipation.
5. Getting up early or setting your alarm clock so you'll wake up in the night for a while. Too much sleep at a stretch may tend to catch your blood vessels.



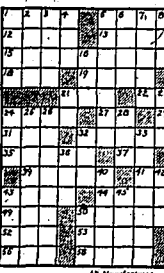
