

## Huge U.S. Aid Plans Prepared

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29 (UPI)—A four-billion-dollar program with increased military assistance is being prepared for Congress. Administration officials said President Eisenhower has decided to ask Congress for \$4.5 billion in military aid starting next July 1. About half of it would be for military aid, and the other half for economic loans.

The two-billion-dollar figure included for military assistance is an amount recommended last year by a White House study group headed by William H. Draper, investment banker. Eisenhower asked \$1,000,000,000 for military aid, but Congress has approved \$1,200,000,000.

It also included about 700 million dollars for the \$1,500 million Eisenhower asked last year for military aid.

The President's decision to go to even higher amount would represent a victory within administration for an aid program over treasury and budget men officials who have been holding down military aid appropriations to a balanced budget.

Broken down in more than 200 items this year, the projected year's cost is less than that of the same period last year. The fiscal year—July through June—ended last June 30, the commerce department report last week yesterday at \$1,200,000,000 and said it included \$200,000,000 in military aid.

Most of the spending comes from appropriations made in earlier years.

## Senate Discloses Secret Payroll; Report Shows 17 Solons Hire Relatives

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30 (UPI)—The senate bared its long-secret payroll today and disclosed that at least 17 senators employ relatives. The complete payroll for the July 1-Sept. 30 period was made public by Senate Secretary Felton M. Johnston in a 110-page printed booklet.

Senate officials estimated the payroll totaled 2,800 to 3,000 persons. Senators shown to have relatives—however distant—on the payroll included (Col.); Dennis Chavez, D., N. The senate made public a senate resolution adopted last session.

It was the first time in history that the payroll information had been published in its present form and the first time since 1949 that senators' office payrolls had been disclosed at all. For the past 11 years, salaries of committee staffs and employees working in jobs other than in senators' offices were disclosed quarterly.

Prior to 1948 the total payroll was published annually but not broken down in the detail included in the new booklet.

Besides the payroll lists for members of the Idaho State Wheat Growers association, the names of other senate employees, custodial workers, committee staffs and committee staff members. Much of a senator's patronage is in jobs other than those in his immediate office.

None received more than the three-month period of \$1,000, which would figure out to a rate of \$16,200.96 a year.

Because the lists covered the summer period, they contain a large number of employees who worked for other times of the year. Many lists give part-time or temporary summer jobs to students and others from their home states.

The lists also do not show how much of the quarterly payroll was worked. Some were part-time or very temporary workers.

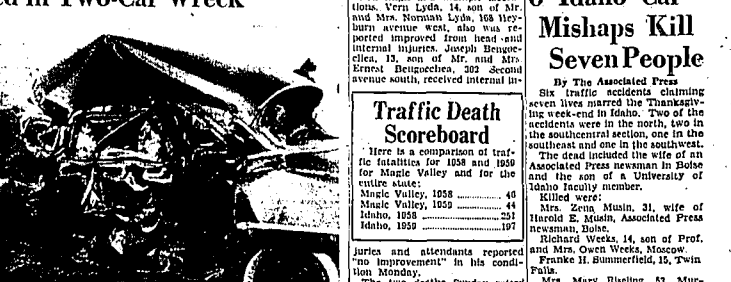

CONCORD, N. H., Nov. 30 (AP)—Rockefeller's supporters in New Hampshire today asked that the state's first presidential election be held on the state's main street in the heart of downtown Concord. Their plan is to turn it into the nation's "Rocky for President" headquarters.

### New School Is Built on Site of Fire

CHICAGO, Nov. 30.—If there were a fireproof building, this is it.

A workman made that comment to a reporter as they stood near a construction site at the northeast corner of Avers avenue and Iowa street.

They looked at a sturdy steel and concrete skeleton that is rising from the ashes and charred bricks of the Our Lady of the Angels school.

Little Wood Used

The only wood in the new million-dollar, three-story building will be in the doors.

A new fire alarm box already stands like a sentry on the sidewalk on the Iowa street side. It symbolizes the determination that there shall be no repetition of the disaster that swept up an open street well of the old school Dec. 1, 1958.

That fire cost the lives of 92 children and 3 nuns.

Our Lady of the Angels pupils attend classes elsewhere while workmen labor on the new structure.

A spokesman who revisited the scene recalled the eerie silence that shrouded the area that short, dark, cold day almost a year ago.

Spectators had gathered behind fire lines to stare at the ruined building. Firefighters trickled in to the nearby church to offer silent prayers.

That was an silence of mass shock. It has been replaced by a mum reluctance to talk about the tragedy.

Mother Reluctant to Talk

"I'd rather not talk about it," Mrs. Joseph Modica told a reporter who called at her home.

Her son, Joseph, Jr., 9, had started work last fall on a Christmas gift for her. He took letters of the alphabet that were made of cereal and glued them on cards to spell out a vow: "I, Joseph, promise to do my best to do my duty to God and my country, to be square and to..."

He never finished his project. He died in the fire.

### Crimes Still On Increase

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30 (AP)—Violent crimes continued to show a substantial increase across the nation in the first nine months of 1959, FBI director J. Edgar Hoover reported today.

Hoover said there was an "almost insignificant" drop of about 500 per cent in the over-all crime rate for the period.

His report was based on preliminary crime data received from police departments in 554 cities of more than 25,000 population.

For the January-September, 1959, period, the reports reflected a four per cent increase in murder, five per cent increase in forcible rapes, a seven per cent hike in aggravated assaults and a one per cent jump in narcotics involving more than 550.

### Guard Needs New Recruits

BOISE, Nov. 30 (AP)—Commanders of Idaho national guard units were told today they must take immediate steps to reverse a "rightward trend" in guard strength.

George B. Bennett, chief of staff, said there must be "contingent plans made by all commanders and sections to make significant gains this fiscal year."

"Our strength standing on June 30, 1959," he said, "will determine to a large degree our future in the national guard."

Bennett spoke at a conference of guard commanders, called to discuss recruiting methods.

He said the goal will be to increase the Idaho guard's strength by 100 men, to 4,200, by next June 30.

### Smylie Can't Comprehend Demo Action

BOISE, Nov. 30 (UPI) — Gov. Robert E. Smylie can't understand why the Democratic members of the state land board want to delay the rental increase on cottage site leases.

Smylie agrees that it should be delayed, he said, "and I can't understand why they're wanting to delay it. The Democratic board members reported Saturday that Smylie should have done something about raising the rentals before now."

Smylie said the governor was being "derelict in his duty" for promoting efforts for a boost during the past eight years if he felt that there now was a need for a raise.

"I think they are protesting overmuch," Smylie said. "The rental stands that they didn't want to increase the rentals this year."

He said he could see no point in waiting if they plan to do it later.

No Hurry Felt  
Board members indicated that they felt that there was no hurry in raising the rentals on state cottage site leases when the governor had eight years to do something about it and had not done so.

Smylie proposed to the board that the rentals be raised to \$200, a 50 per cent increase. However, the Democratic-controlled board passed down his proposal at its meeting here last Friday, saying that no change should be made until a study by state land department was completed.

The governor on the other hand had informed the board that \$2000 a year to the state school fund would be lost by failing to approve his proposal.

### GOP Blasted In Handling Berry Scare

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30 (UPI) — Sen. Les McClellan, D., Mont., accused Eisenhower administration officials today of doubletalk in connection with the recent cherry poison scare.

McClellan said that, at one and the same time:

1. Some administration officials are urging alarm over reports chemical weed killers contaminated cherries, and

2. Others are clamping a lid on news to finance research into the problem of how to use poison sprays to kill bugs and disease without harming people, wildlife and fish.

McClellan's Authors Bill  
McClellan is cosponsor of a bill under which such research has been authorized by the federal government.

McClellan said the bill would "assist the fish and wildlife service that the administration would not approve any increase in research money."

"It is strange," McClellan said in an interview, "that an administration which is so upset about one chemical weed killer's effect on cherries has refused to ask for increased funds authorized by Congress for research on the whole range of poisons used to kill fungi, weeds and bugs."

Example Cited  
"This is an example," he declared, "of administration doubletalk. Last year, administration agencies, with the concurrence of the bureau of the budget, approved an increase in the authorization for pesticide research."

"But when it comes down to doing the job the administration refuses to follow through."

The bill, cosponsored by McClellan and Sen. Warren G. Magnuson, D., Wash., originally authorized appropriation of \$280,000 annually. This authorization was increased this year to \$2,565,000.

\$280,000 Appropriated  
However, only \$280,000 was actually appropriated for the project.

McClellan said he understood the fish and wildlife service had recommended higher appropriations for the present and next fiscal years, but the budget bureau disapproved although the authorization had been increased about tenfold.

One aim of the research bill is to find out the amounts and mixtures of pesticides and insecticides which could be used effectively to control bugs, weeds and plant diseases while minimizing loss of fish and wildlife.

### Astronauts Think They Can Return From Trip in Space

LANGLEY FIELD, Va., Nov. 30 (UPI)—America's seven astronauts are convinced that if they were launched in a space capsule now they could bring it back safely from an orbit around the Earth.

"They are not worried about failure of efforts to recover capsules from orbit but feel assurance will be obtained when a man is shot into space in such a vehicle.

"These space pioneers involved in Project Mercury" say you can't rely on automatic devices alone to do the job and that man himself will provide the reliability that is being lacking.

Every one of the astronauts is confident that even if all the automatic devices should fail he could operate manual controls to slow down the orbiting vehicle and bring it back.

"It's a misconception that you have to build a system that is perfect automatically before you can put a man in space," air force Capt. Donald K. Slayton told United Press International. "Actually, it's the man aboard that gives you reliability."

Slayton pointed out that automatic instruments are available to pilot planes but that no commercial airlines would think of relying on the instruments to the exclusion of human pilots.

It is no secret that each of the astronauts, who have been training at this base for six months, hopes he will be the first man rocketed into orbit.
