Truman Urges Election for 'Real Liberal'

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Dec. 4 (AP)—Former President Harry S. Truman said last night the nation must elect a "real liberal" in the White House and "not a man to do my very best to help find him."

The former chief executive, in a speech at a testimonial dinner in support of the National Democratic Party, said, "We need a man who has a sense of the world today and of our role in it, a man who is not afraid to act to meet changing conditions."

Truman, attended by about 500 democrats who paid \$50 a ticket, was set up to take pains to Nelson's campaign for re-election in 1960. Nelson is the state's first democratic governor in more than 20 years.

Truman at a news conference said that proceeded and that there were at least seven "able and distinguished men" of his party who were available for president, but he said that he would be at the national Democratic convention in Chicago and give advice to the party.

Truman said he would like to see a man in the White House who gives priority to human needs. Truman said he would like to see a vigorous, fighting, genuine liberal, not a hot-house liberal, who will, for one, have no doubts for the Johnny-come-lately, well-fed, disproportionate victory in the party. I think you know who they are."

General Says Airplane Was Up too Long

BOISE, Dec. 4 (AP)—The Texas plane crash to last February which killed an Idaho air national guardman happened because the crew of the commercially chartered craft had been in the air too long, Brig. Gen. James M. Trail said Thursday.

Trail said he agreed with official aeronautics board findings that the pilot was to blame. The pilot was killed in the crash.

Trail, who is chief of staff of the Idaho Air Guard, said criticism of the flight "must be leveled at the framers of the national transportation policy."

"No one in the state of Idaho had any responsibility or power to determine who would transport these guardmen to San Antonio for their military training," he said. "For the same reasons, there was no investigation ever conducted in Idaho."

This particular flight was contracted to General Airways by the U. S. department of defense," he said.

The CAB report had said that the probable reason why Capt. Woodrow O. Epps, pilot of the craft, got into a difficult situation was pilot fatigue along with severe economic compulsion. The report said that at the time of the crash the crew had been airborne 32 hours of a 41-hour period.

Epps was one of two crew members killed when the plane belly landed under adverse conditions of ice and terrain.

1959 Is Seen as Bad Strike Year

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4 (AP)—This year is going down in the books as the worst strike year in modern times except for 1947.

The labor department reported yesterday that the total strike loss for 1959 is \$1 billion. A man-day represents one day's work done by one man.

The October figures hike the total man-days lost because of strikes during the first 10 months of this year to 64 million.

With the exception of 1949, this exceeds the total for any entire year since the government began keeping strike statistics over 30 years ago.

The 1946 strike record saw 116 million man-days lost.

Dave Beck Asks Court Reversal

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 4 (U.P.)—Dave Beck, former head of the Teamsters union, yesterday asked the U.S. court of appeals to reverse his income tax conviction and dismiss the case.

Beck's attorneys filed a 94-page brief, blaming a "massive campaign of hostile publicity" stemming from a U.S. senate committee hearing as the cause of his conviction. They listed 22 errors they contend the Seattle trial court committed last February when Beck was given a five-year prison sentence and a \$50,000 fine.

The jury convicted the 68-year-old former Teamsters president of evading \$240,000 in federal income taxes for 1930-35.
