# Pakistan, Turkey Greet Given to Foreign Visitor

KARACHI, Pakistan, Dec. 7 (AP)—A million cheering Pakistanis by official estimate—gave President Eisenhower today the most thunderous reception ever accorded a foreign visitor. Shouting, waving people packed the streets and the road from the airport as Eisenhower arrived from Turkey in the third stop of his 42,000-mile mission of peace.

The President was deeply moved by the outpouring of affection and the "thunderous" reception," said James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary.

President Mohammed Ayub Khan made the award. He read an accompanying letter praising Eisenhower for "inspiring leadership in enabling the free nations to develop collective security against aggression."

The President earlier had opened the Snake River corridor with Ayub Khan at the presidential residence.
