

U. S. Will Pull Army Unit Off Duty In Iceland

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (UPI)—The United States announced it will withdraw all of its 1,200 army troops from Iceland where they were stationed for some time. The defense department said the withdrawal was to be carried out during the first six months of 1960, was part of a "normal redeployment" and had nothing to do with recent incidents. Approximately 4,000 air force and navy personnel will remain in Iceland. The department said it had decided to pull out the army troops stationed there by the United States alone, and that the Icelandic government was later "made aware" of the decision.

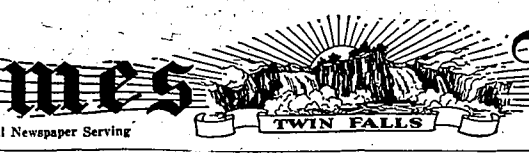

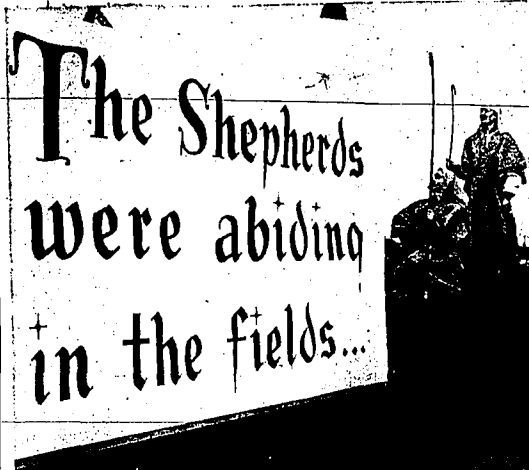

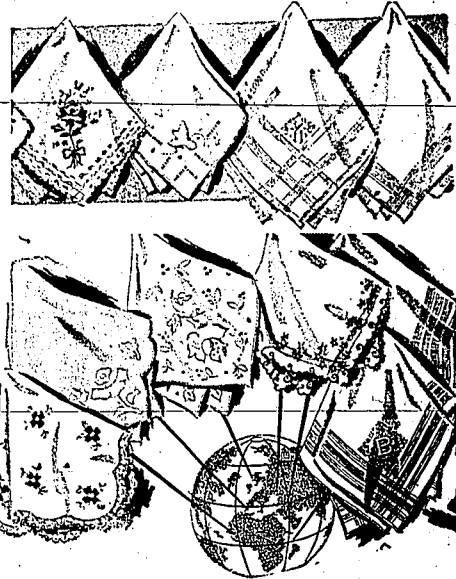

Soviet Press Tells Facts of Ike's Travels

MOSCOW, Dec. 10 (UPI)—The Soviet press and radio have been giving detailed, minimum coverage of the bare facts of the Eisenhower trip and comment has been brief and only mildly critical.

In comparison to the freemove photographs and headlines the brief text agency reports on the back page of Soviet papers with no accompanying comment.

Comment on the communiqué issued at the end of Eisenhower's trip in Moscow was limited to a five-paragraph straight news story on page five of both Pravda and Izvestia.

Comment on the communiqué had been cut out of the news reports but the full text story, including some comment, was heard on Moscow radio.

The only other Soviet comment in English in familiar jargon to the communiqué had no mention of Eisenhower but the meaning of the word "Khrushchev's disarmament plan" has been the subject of growing comment and reports in the Soviet press and on radio ever since he submitted it to the United Nations.

The only other Soviet comment on Eisenhower's tour followed the news which he delivered just before leaving Washington.

Only Special Law Can Get Back 'Rights'

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (UPI)—The director of the federal bureau of land management says that he did his best to help Idaho get back her mineral rights lost in land trades with the government.

Edward Woolsey, former Idaho land commissioner, said there only special congressional legislation can regain the lost mineral rights, particularly those involving phosphate.

Big Loss Cited
The Orem state land commissioner, John Walters, said recently the state stands to lose up to 50 million dollars for its schools because the mineral rights were withheld.

He said the bill got lost in committee. Both Woolsey and Walters agreed that only special legislation would regain the rights.



Ike's Welcome Overwhelms Reporter; Scares Him, too

By HERBERT M. SMITH
NEW DELHI, India, Dec. 10 (UPI)—The local police say that President Eisenhower was welcomed yesterday by more than one million people. They had said two million I would not have quarreled with the figure.

As a UPI reporter who has watched the crowds for president from Franklin D. Roosevelt through Harry S. Truman and now Eisenhower, I have never seen anything even remotely matching the scene in New Delhi.

Frankly, I was scared stiff a good bit of the time during the ride from an airport through midtown New Delhi. People seemed to be coming out of the ground.

Big crowds sometimes have a fault of becoming bad-tempered when they are pushed around by police, but the people of India did not react this way. They cheered under the swirling clubs of the police officers and smiling continued to press toward the automobile in which Eisenhower was riding with Indian President Ra-

junder Prasad and Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru.

Not in the most dramatic days of the late President Roosevelt was there ever such a crowd as this in the United States.

For eight miles and more than two hours, there was a solid wall of humanity on either side of the motorcade and there were long periods when all possible police concentration could not keep the motorcade moving.

What was frightening to some of us riding four cars behind the President and Nehru was that the people were so enthusiastic they tried constantly to get in the car with us, shake hands or engage in conversation while they were being moved down by motorcycle officers.

One excited Indian reached inside the press association car, grabbed me by the arm and nearly wrenched it off while he asked how I was enjoying the trip.

Speakers repeatedly disregarded police clubs to cling to the side of our car long enough to inquire whether we knew this was a much better carnival than Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev received here three years ago.

There were frightening moments when Indians, in what seemed to be exultation, beat against the side of our car like a bass drum and shouted in what I took to be a dozen different tongues.

For its mammoth size, however, the crowd was good-natured and well-behaved. The people just wanted to see Eisenhower and apparently did not care about the dangers involved.

The Indians threw in large handfuls of bouquets of flowers together and double handfuls of loose bouquets.

Eisenhower and Nehru were riding in an open car and had no protection from the flowers, with the result that their car was knee-deep in flowers when it finally reached the palace where the President set up the temporary White House.

My Indian colleagues say it will be this way every time Eisenhower shows himself during his five-day visit here and, if this is true, we certainly could use some wood blocking backs from one of the good U. S. professional football fans.

Trip Home Nears For One of Twins

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 10 (UPI)—One of the Stubbfield Siamese twins, parted in delicate surgery Oct. 4, may be able to go home next week, a medical spokesman says.

The condition of Conett Stubbfield is good and her weight now is up to 13 pounds, said the spokesman for the University of Oregon Medical School hospital.

Doctors probably will decide by Monday the specific date of Conett's departure.

No Protest

COEUR D'ALENE, Dec. 10 (UPI)—An Idaho public utilities commission hearing into a rate increase requested by the Washington Water Power company in Idaho and Washington was recessed here yesterday after a call for protests was made but none were heard.

The Spokane utility seeks a 10 percent increase in its electrical rates in the two states. Company spokesmen have said the proposed increase would up annual gross revenue about three million dollars.

"Do you think we were fools to travel from 10 to 100 miles to see a man but Vishnu ka avatar," said Kanthi, a 70-year-old woman from Meerthi village 10 miles south of Delhi. Like many Hindus, Kanthi has only one name.

Hearing that this avatar—reincarnation—was coming she summoned her daughter and grandchildren from Kamalia village 100 miles away.

Kanthi gave two reasons for considering Eisenhower the avatar of Vishnu.

First, Eisenhower had the might of Vishnu—to destroy the world by a mere wish but like Vishnu never used it and instead kept it as a final trump card against evil.

Secondly, like Vishnu, he was a great benefactor.

"Did he not send us wheat when we needed it and build us dams?" she asked.

Her family clustering around her in a bullock cart nodded assent, and her daughter Shantnu added, "Does not this avatar also smile like Vishnu—a divine, radiant smile?"

The 45-year-old Ramchandani said,

Views Differ At Hearings On Tax Plan

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (UPI)—Should the federal government raise income taxes on dividends and interest at the source to plug up estimated revenue loss of close to one billion a year?

The house ways and means committee exploring proposals for raising tax revenue has heard conflicting views on this issue from a panel of tax experts.

The panel is leading a government study on a lot of revenue because a lot of people don't report on their tax returns. Interest on savings, including savings bonds, but they disagree on whether the tax withholding which applies now to wages and salaries should be broadened to cover interest and dividends.

Former Internal Revenue Commissioner Russell C. Harrison warned that such a move would impose a burden on taxpayers who live on the fixed income and whose livelihood depends on interest and dividends.

He said the morale of these taxpayers might be hurt.

What about the morale of wage earners subject to withholding, asked Chairman Wilbur D. Mills, D. Ark.

Harrison replied that withholding on wage earners did create a morale problem when it was first introduced, but he added that employees are used to it now.

Harrison's remark brought a sort of disbelief from Joseph A. Buchanan, former treasury official who is now an economist with the committee for economic development.

Buchanan, arguing vigorously for withholding of taxes on interest and dividends, said he had not heard a single complaint from any of the 30 million persons who annually get tax refunds because the amount withheld from their earnings exceeded the tax they owed. He said it "always is a delight to get a refund."

Buchanan argued that an efficient system could be adopted under which persons who had refunds coming could collect them within a matter of days.

Animals Rid of Strontium Ash

BALTIMORE, Md., Dec. 10.—Three Baltimore doctors have found a way to flush radioactive strontium from the bodies of animals.

Injections of harmless sulfates, common salts of sulfuric acid, do the trick, according to the three researchers at Johns Hopkins medical school.

If the sulfates work the same way in humans, the discovery could help save persons exposed to strontium radioactivity in laboratories, bomb tests or nuclear warfare.

The doctors say the infectious bomb excretion of strontium by the '49 atomic bomb test, before the strontium enters the bones. Strontium is one of the radioactive ashes in nuclear fallout.

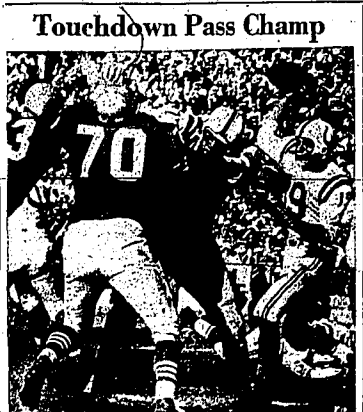

Yale Coaches Get Lifetime Appointments.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Dec. 10 (AP)—Yale's athletic director disclosed Wednesday that all full-time head coaches at the university now have what amounts to lifetime appointments. Dr. Van Kipphut calls the arrangement, the result of a two-year experiment, "appointment-for-life." In disclosing the arrangement to the Associated Press, Kipphut said he knows of no other educational institution with this type of security for its head coaches. Most colleges sign their coaches for periods ranging from one to five years. At its minimum, the Kipphut agreement protects a coach for at least three years, including one year of no other employment elsewhere. At its maximum, the coach can serve until the mandatory retirement age of 68. The agreement is subject to review annually in July for all coaches except football, when December is the date. 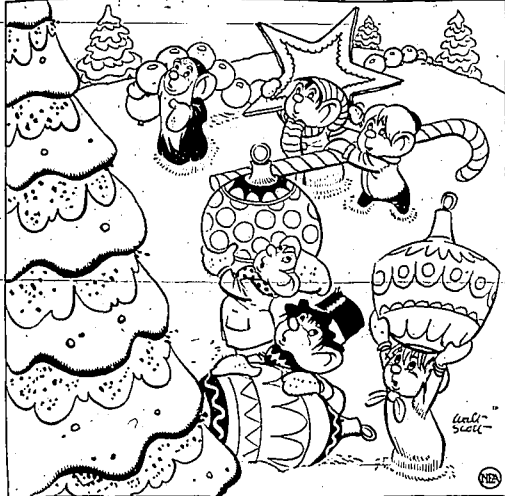

Economy Bid Termed Free World Threat

NEW YORK, Dec. 10 (UPI)—Adlai E. Stevenson has said that the survival of free society itself is threatened by false American fears that government expenditure will cause ruinous inflation. "Unless we are prepared to spend, not what we can afford but what we need in such areas as defense, economic aid, education and basic research—to name the four chief areas of communist challenge—it is not just our free enterprise system that we are putting in jeopardy. It is the survival of free society itself," Stevenson said in a speech to the annual meeting of the Institute of Life Insurance. "We are reading this issue," he said. "I think we have underestimated the Soviet challenge. . . . I tremble for our future—and for the world's future. . . . The silent herald 'round the world has been sounded by the shot around the noon. . . . Stevenson also called for greater responsibility by labor and management in the steel strike. He outlined a proposal to revise the nation's labor law to give the public a restricted seat at the bargaining table in such national disputes. Stevenson said the steel strike dramatizes the national failure to meet the need for public responsibility by private owners, both management and labor. . . . With the development of industry-wide bargaining, there must be greater responsibility on the part of the few men whose decisions affect the entire economy, he said.

GM, Chrysler Recall 70,000 Men to Work

DETROIT, Dec. 10 (UPI)—General Motors and Chrysler have completed the recall of 70,000 employees as they resumed production of five lines of passenger cars and one truck line. The return to work of employees in plants assembling Pontiacs, Oldsmobiles, Buicks, Volkswagens, Imperials and Dodge trucks left only about 32,000 auto workers idled because of steel shortages. At one point, GM alone had more than 215,000 of its 320,000 employees idled because of steel shortages. The figure for GM now is 21,000 while Chrysler has about 28,000 unemployed.

GM recalled workers at plants assembling Cadillac and Corvairs and three plants assembling Chevrolet on Monday. The remainder of the Chevrolet workers will be recalled Monday, making it the first time GM has had its full work force on the job since September. Chrysler was expected to recall most of its unemployed workers on Monday but a few may be returned until the following week. Alpine Switzerland, with an area of only 15,000 square miles, has 125 winter resorts, 800 licensed ski instructors and about 7,000 hotels.

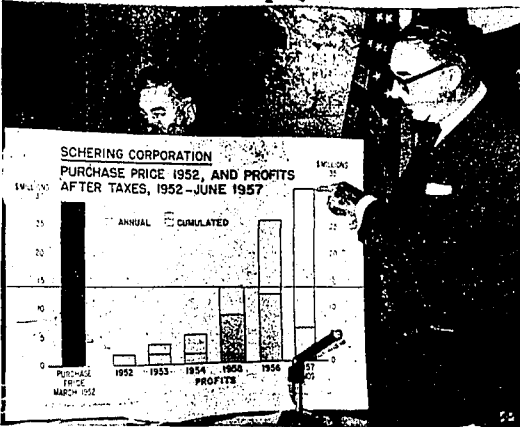
