CHICKEN OR EGG?

If it is true that America's pinched and angered taxpayers don't expect any relief...

But it is not necessarily true that the only choices we have are today's grandiose tax rates or insupportable government debt.

The reason this is possible is that federal taxes are not levied on what we have at any given moment, but on what we pass through the hands of business and the people.

In recent years, the tax rates have been so high that investment has not been up to snuff. This has happened for two reasons.

Pending before the ways and means committee is the Helweg-Baker bill, which enjoys widespread bi-partisan support.

How can you collect more taxes with a smaller rate? The key word is "growth." When the tax rates impede economic growth...

Now that a firm date for a Big Four summit meeting seems to be strapping up...

Secondly, to halt a series of sessions would tend to eliminate the feeling that many people think clings to a single-summit conference...
