Featherbedding Charge Isn't Limited to Railroad Industry

By ROGER GREEN
 Grand chief of the Brotherhood of Railroad Employees, J. J. Willet, said today that the charge of featherbedding is not limited to the railroad industry. He said that the charge is also applicable to the trucking industry, where drivers are often paid for time not worked.

The nation's railroads, pressed by stiff competition from autos, trucks and airlines, say this "not-my-job" attitude is a key factor in forestalling new, crippling railroad practices and adding the industry with ruinous costs. They call it "featherbedding."

The unions reply, in effect: "Supposing you had just finished a hard day's work at a steel job and the boss told you to mop up the office because the chairman hadn't showed up. Would you do it?"

The railroad and other industries have long bitterly argued the explosive issue of jurisdictional work rules. As a result, a fantastic catalogue of regulations has grown up across the years.

Industry spokesmen say many of the work rules are so strict that nobody remembers who they originated. Down the years, the rules have been interpreted and reinterpreted countless times by arbitrators and umpires. Today they fill volumes.

But the unions say the rules developed as labor's answer to a long history of management abuses such as the speedup.

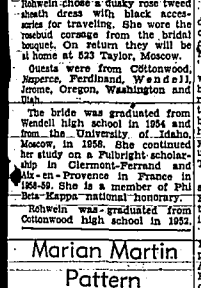
