### Smylie, State Board Feuds To Continue

BOISE, Jan. 21 (AP)—Gov. Robert E. Smylie said yesterday differences will continue between him and Democratic state officials "because there is no other way to secure continuing public interest in the public questions which arise. Smylie, Republican minority of one on the state board of examiners and state land board, said in his weekly news report he often has been asked "Why I have been making a point of voting 'no' on matters which come before the two agencies.

**Disputation Questioned**  
"They have asked," the governor said, "what is gained by continuing disputation."  
"The answer is really quite simple. I am persuaded that the people should not be governed to do my very best for all of the people of the state. In fact my oath requires this."  
"For that reason I think I am required by good conscience to vote against proposals made by my associates on these boards when I think they are wrong or unwise. There is no other way in which I can be faithful to the people who placed their trust in me as governor."

**More Differences Predicted**  
Smylie reviewed instances in which he was outvoted by the Democratic majority on the boards of which he is a member and added, "There will be more of these differences of opinion. I will always vote in these board meetings according to the dictates of my conscience and in favor of what I feel best for the people of the state. I am certain that the people of Idaho would not want me to remain silent when I think a mistake is being made."

**Reasons Cited**  
"I do not mean this report to be considered as an attack on any of my Democratic associates in the government. They doubtless are persuaded of the wisdom and soundness of their votes. In fact I think that the tragedy of the situation is that they are sincere. All I can do is to stand firm for what is right as I see it."  
Smylie said that in disputed cases where a legal question is involved he has asked Attorney General Frank L. Benson, a Democrat, to undertake litigation.

"To date," Smylie said, "he has filed no lawsuit which I have asked him to file, although he has filed many others."

### Checking of Some Publishers Asked

### Russia Offers Debt Payment For U.S. Trade

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 — The Soviet Union is asking the United States to ease restrictions on U.S. goods to ease trade as part of a year-old lend-lease debt to the country.

The United States has opposed the trade proposition on the ground that any move to put trade with the Soviet Union on an equal basis with that of other countries requires congressional action and the negotiations began a week ago, two meetings have been held between Soviet Ambassador Mikhail Gromyko and Secretary of State Christian A. Anderson, who is a specialist on Soviet affairs.

The heart of the negotiation is the settlement of the \$2.5 billion figures proposed by the Soviet Union and the United States during the last year of lend-lease, which ended in 1952.

At that time the United States offered to settle the debt in \$100 million bills which had been totaled at more than \$2.5 billion. The Soviet government offered a \$200-million-dollar settlement.

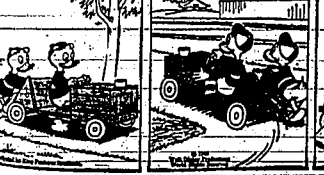

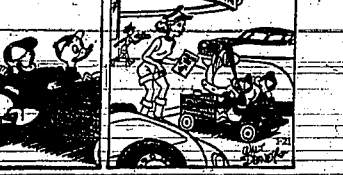
