Ban on Cigarettes Said Not Possible

DOUGLAS, 29 (UPI)—The department of health, education and welfare can't ban cigarettes, says U. S. Secretary Arthur Flemming today.

Flemming made the statement here just before he left for Washington yesterday after attending a luncheon to Eisenhower dinner Wednesday.

Flemming alleged a public health service study has shown "conclusive" connection between

smoking and the incidence of lung cancer. "You and I as individuals," he told newsmen here, "analyze the evidence presented by the public health department and make up our minds as to whether we want to smoke or not."

But Flemming said efforts are being made in congress to amend present laws to lessen the effect of a ban on certain brands of cigarettes used in hospitals.

He said his department "has no alternative" but to ban such cigarettes.

Idaho's General Fishing Regulations for 1960 Are Released at Boise Session

BOISE, Jan. 29 (AP)—The Idaho fish and game commission Thursday set June 4 as the opening date for Idaho's general fishing season, with most regulations unchanged from last year. The general season will close Oct. 31. Exceptions include the Snake river in five counties on the north Idaho Panhandle. The general season on those lakes will run from May 1 through Nov. 30. Ross Leonard, state fish and game director, emphasized that the new regulations become effective April 1 and until that time the 1959 regulations remain in effect.

Fishing throughout the year is permitted in about 100 lakes, reservoirs and streams over the state, Leonard said. Year-around fishing is permitted in all northern lakes and in the Clearwater, Snake and Kootenai.

The commission outlined the use of "double, treble or multiple hooks" larger than an inch in the south fork of the Salmon river and its tributaries. In those waters only one hook ranging in size from five-sixteenths to one-half inch from its point to shank may be used.

Leonard explained that water in the South fork of the Salmon and its tributaries is extremely vulnerable to foot-hooking or snagging on multiple hooks larger than those specified in the regulations, Leonard said.

"The commission was supported in its regulation of double and multiple hooks by the Trout and Salmon Conservation Convention at Coeur d'Alene passed a resolution that effective regulation should be made on the Salmon regulations is that salmon have less than 15 inches in length and covered by log and possession limits for trout. The minimum length for steelhead is 18 inches, and for rainbow trout is 16 inches."

"This proves that they are definitely out to continue the present monopoly in professional football by placing a team in 1960 in a one-team market—Dallas—which already has a team," said Joe Pos, AFL's commissioner.

Pos declared: "You have anti-trust laws to take care of this situation."

Lamar Hunt, owner of the Dallas franchise and organizer of the AFL, which starts operations next fall said:

"The anti-trust laws are designed to foster competition — not kill off competition, and the National Football league has the monopoly."

Hunt said he organized the American Football league when he was denied a franchise in the National Football league and was told that expansion of the NFL was several years distant.
