Benson Gives Latest Version of Row, Raps Court

Democratic Atty. Gen. Frank L. Benson gave his first public explanation of a "letter tearing" incident in his office Tuesday involving William B. Padgett and also laid out at the Idaho supreme court and state daily newspaper the Times-News Tuesday night, Benson, in Twin Falls briefly while en route to Malad for a "business meeting," defended himself against the latest legal battle launched Tuesday in Boise when Padgett filed an affidavit with the state supreme court demanding documents in appeal of a Blingham county highway condemnation case.

Benson Gives Version of Incident

In the affidavit Padgett claimed he asked Benson for the documents early and in writing Tuesday. He also said he had written Benson in his office in pursuit of Padgett. Benson's version of the incident, as told to the Times-News, differed considerably from Padgett's allegations. "This morning I called and told Anton Holter (assistant attorney general for the highway department) that I had written Padgett after the documents he requested came to Benson's office and demanded them. "Benson said he considered him an assistant attorney general, I would not turn them over to him," Benson said after the documents were returned. "I would turn them over to Holter." "Benson, who visibly showed anger, said he did not read the contents of the envelope, which was a letter demanding the documents. "The attorney general asserted he had to take the envelope back to Padgett after taking them, but Padgett would not accept the envelope. "I just tore it in a couple of places and threw it in the waste basket. He said he had walked out of the office and came back later and the envelope was there. "He (Padgett) must have picked it up," Benson added. "I do not know if Benson denied running from his office in pursuit of Padgett. "I was pursuing him and I would not pursue him under any circumstances," he said. "I did not take the envelope out of the waste basket after he had picked it up." (Continued on Page 2, Column 1)

Cuba Attache Quits Due to Fidel Castro

BOGOTA, Colombia, March 9 (AP)—Philip Vidal de Escobar, who today is presumed a Cuban naval attache in Venezuela because he is brother-in-law of Fidel Castro, the communist dictator who betrayed the men and women who shed their blood to put him in power. Vidal dismissed as "ridiculous" Castro's charge that the United States was to blame for the explosion of the French munitions ship La Coubre in Havana last week. He said the blast was almost certainly caused by overheated water in the tank where the ship was unloading.

The cooling system of the Havana electric plant explodes last week, according to the Tallapiedra pier to which the La Coubre was moored," the 34-year-old naval officer said.

"When I was chief of maritime police in Havana, I would allow no ship carrying munitions to unload at the Tallapiedra pier."

Vidal said he believes the present maritime law is one of Castro's tricks who has no technical qualifications for the job and who accordingly has not been re-certified the danger.

The former naval attache said he left in his resignation Sunday from Cucuta, Colombia, where he has been spending a few days' leave, after hearing that his mother and brothers had been arrested by Castro's police.

4 Americans Are Killed in Earthquakes

RABAT, Morocco, March 9 (AP)—The number of known American deaths in the Azores earthquake rose to four today with the death of Marine Lance Cpl. Michael J. Calif. The total death toll has been estimated as high as 12,000. She was with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Werner Bauer, on the top floor of the Hotel Bristol opposite where the quake struck, demolishing the building.

Bauer and the girl were pulled alive from the wreckage, and the body of Mrs. Bauer was found March 2.

The father and daughter were flown to the U. S. naval hospital at Port Lyautey where the first-aid hospital authorities said. Death was caused by a cerebral blood clot.

Bauer is an executive of Logis International corporation, San Francisco, which operated fruit juice concentrate and industrial plants in Azores.

Black Market in Babies Located

JERSEY CITY, March 9 (AP)—Authorities say a 40-year-old woman may have sold as many as 15 unwanted new-born babies for \$200 each in the past four years.

The black market baby operation was uncovered yesterday with the arrest of Mrs. Free Wasserman, police said. A Newark couple seeking to adopt a baby helped spring a trap that was baited last fall, according to Judge Charles E. Johnson, Prosecutor Lawrence A. Whipple.

Mrs. Wasserman was charged with placing or offering to place a child for adoption without proper authority. She was freed in \$100 bail by Municipal Judge Wall. Two other women were booked as material witnesses.

Police said they picked up Mrs. Wasserman's trail last September when an unidentified Newark couple who had been unsuccessful in adopting a child through a state agency, informed the prosecutor's office that they had been contacted by Mrs. Wasserman.

Speaking of increasing the quota he said "this means an increase in the sugar beet acreage and production in Idaho."

"I believe it's our farmers that should be helped more than an unfriendly country."

Youth Turns Junk to Big School Prize

WASHINGTON, March 9 (AP)—A modest Minnesota 16-year-old boy has turned \$5 worth of junk, including a float from a pig watering trough and a Christmas ornament, into a \$7,500 college scholarship.

The scholarship, the nation's highest science prize for high school students, was awarded yesterday by the Westinghouse Educational foundation at a banquet here marking the end of the 1959 science talent search.

Four other scholarships, ranging from \$5,000 to \$3,000, were awarded to other high school seniors, the creators of a crop of finalists who spent five days in Washington while judges chose the top winners.

First-place winner Jerome G. Spitzer, 17-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Spitzer, St. James, Minn., took top honors with a spherical rotor accelerator, an elaborate device used in atomic research.

"I tried as far as possible to keep costs down," Spitzer said, besides the first and second prizes he used parts of old cars and other junk he found on his father's 20-acre farm in southern Minnesota.

The ion accelerator is only one in a series of projects for which blond has built, including rockets, a serial camera with a parachute release triggered from a remote, and a digital computer he is constructing in a discarded dresser.

New Budget to Up U.S. Payroll

WASHINGTON, March 9 (AP)—Sen. Harry F. Byrd, D., Va., said today President Eisenhower's new budget would boost federal employment by 30,041 and increase the government payroll by two million dollars.

Byrd, chairman of the Senate committee on reduction of non-essential federal expenditures, said the budget for the fiscal year starting July 1 called for an average of 2,682,259 federal workers to be paid \$12,800,000,000.

He said in a statement that this meant an increase over the current fiscal year of 45,840 workers and three million dollars in salaries for civilian agencies.

This boost, he said, would more than offset a drop of 15,296 workers and one million dollars in pay for civilian employees of the defense department.

Wide Margin Is Noted in Ballot

BOISE, March 9 (AP)—Sen. Frank Church, D., Id., said yesterday that his pollsters have "propagated Sawtooth national park study and the Salmon river preservation bill" by a wide margin.

Church said 77.7 per cent of the more than 8,000 most-card replies to his questionnaire favored the Sawtooth study. He said 88.06 per cent "approve my Salmon river bill."

Blaine Guard Using Gun to Prevent Slide

MONTPELIER, March 9 (AP)—Idaho national guardsmen from Halley fired 16 rounds of 65 millimeter shells into a snow drift yesterday and prevented a possible snow slide from routing down on a fertilizer plant in Georgetown canyon near this southeastern Idaho community.

The employees of the plant had come home. It was about 3 o'clock. The shooting could either have caused a slide or prevented it by pounding the loose snow into a more compact mass.

The personnel manager of the Central Farmers Fertilizer company plant, Robert Johnson, said, "What we did was compact the snow, by hitting it."

"We had to take the chance of its coming down on the buildings while the people were there, or take this preventive measure where you either start the slide, while nobody is in the plant—or you compact it."

The firing by the 105 millimeter was done by a national guard group from Halley, the same group which does similar slide preventive work at Sun Valley. The U.S. forest service supervised.

The loose snow was atop the west wall of the canyon, half a mile above the plant buildings. A snow slide from there would have caused a slide or prevented it, while nobody is in the plant—or you compact it.

Feud Between Oregon's Two Solons Noted

WASHINGTON, March 9 (AP)—Oregon's two congressional representatives, Wayne Morse and the late Richard L. Neuberger, feuded bitterly over the years.

Their differences first came to light in the summer of 1957 when the Portland Oregonian published a report that the senators were "feuding privately."

Report said Neuberger Morse branded the report "a lot of nonsense." Neuberger said "political opportunists" were responsible for the story. He criticized the "hypocritical innuendoes" of "certain partisan politicians" who expected him and Morse to be "carbon copies of each other."

But it was not long before the two members of the senate's liberal bloc were exchanging barbed accusations.

Charges fly

Morse said Neuberger was "sucked in" to support the 1957 civil rights bill. Neuberger retorted that Morse had "sucked in" Neuberger in what he termed five of seven "key" roll call votes.

The two senators' feud over Neuberger's support of higher postal rates, Morse said the support amounted to the "most absurd non sequitur I have ever listened to in my 13 years in the senate."

Neuberger said he regretted such "extreme" criticism but sought no apology. Morse said he saw no reason to apologize. "I have never engaged in that language in debate and never will," he declared.

Feud started again

Neuberger said "the price is too high" if he had to "suppress" his convictions in order to get along with Morse.

The feud flared up again last year in an exclusive interview. The correspondence was leaked to reporters and published.

One time Morse promised to campaign against Neuberger's reelection this year. Morse said he would use his case as what he termed Neuberger's "sorry record . . . on issue after issue."

New Hampshire Vote Boosts Nixon, Kennedy in '60 Race

WASHINGTON, March 9 (AP)—New Hampshire's presidential primary returns strengthened Vice President Richard M. Nixon's grip on the GOP nomination today and gave an expected lift to Sen. John F. Kennedy in the Democratic race.

An unimpressive write-in vote for Gov. John Rankin, New York, gave little encouragement to his admirers who had hoped he might stir a deeper candidate to challenge Nixon at the Republican national convention.

Incomplete returns from the nation's lead-off presidential primary in New Hampshire yesterday showed that Nixon and Kennedy were runaway victors. Anything else would have been an upset.

Nixon was unopposed in the presidential preference vote and Kennedy had only nominal competition. In the separate election for the GOP nomination, there were candidates who favored other presidential aspirants but they trailed the pro-Kennedy and pro-Nixon states.

From the national standpoint, Republicans were particularly interested in the write-in vote for Rockefeller as evidence of the strength of GOP opposition to Nixon. Rockefeller tried in December against trying for the nomination.

Results from more than two-thirds of the precincts gave Rockefeller about 2,000 write-in votes against 40,000 for Nixon, who came in on the ballot. In 1952, when Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, Sen. Robert A. Taft and Harold E. Stassen were on the GOP ballot, Gen. Douglas MacArthur received 3,271 write-in votes and cast fourth.

Kennedy partisans cheered the New Hampshire results because their candidate ran stronger than any previous Democrat in a contested or uncontested presidential primary in the normally Republican state. In 1952 and 1956, the Republican vote exceeded that cast by the Democrat by more than 2 to 1.

Trailing Nixon by a margin of less than 2 to 1, Kennedy could be showing greater appeal to the voters in his neighboring state or he could be demonstrating that he had a stronger organization than either candidate.

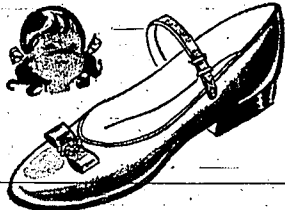

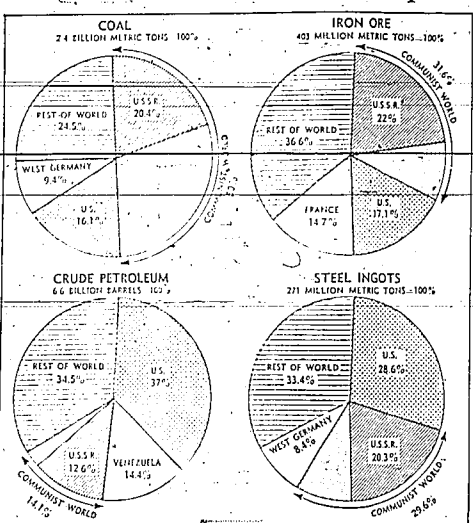

Princess Margaret's Wedding Scheduled for Friday, May 6

LONDON, March 9 (AP)—Princess Margaret and Antony Armstrong-Jones will be married in Westminster Abbey May 6, it was announced officially today.

Prince Philip will give the princess away and the archbishop of Canterbury will conduct the service.

Announcement was issued from Clarence House, Margaret's residence.

"The marriage of her royal highness the Princess Margaret with Mr. Antony Armstrong-Jones will be solemnized at Westminster Abbey on the morning of Friday, 6th May, at 11.30 a.m. local time."

There was no immediate indication who else would be in the bridal party.

The announcement meant a short engagement. The betrothal was announced in 1955.

Plans already are being made for the greatest influx of visitors to Britain for a royal event since Queen Elizabeth II, Margaret's sister, was crowned in the Abbey in 1953.

Sources close to the palace said it seems a certainty the wedding would be a magnificent, colorful event with royal carriage processions to and from the ancient Abbey on the morning of Friday, 6th May, at 11.30 a.m. local time.

It was learned that Queen Elizabeth disclosed the wedding date last night to Prime Minister Harold Macmillan at Buckingham Palace.

Her coronation of Macmillan was her first official engagement since the birth of her third child nearly three weeks ago.

Now that the date has been set, plans for the wedding have moved forward with great speed at Buckingham Palace, Clarence House and the office of the Lord Chamberlain, who is responsible to the queen for royal ceremonies.

Armstrong-Jones is living in a private suite of rooms at the palace. He moved in at the invitation of the queen and Prince Philip so he could be near Margaret's residence at Clarence House.

One London newspaper, the Daily Mirror, reported Armstrong-Jones is designing Margaret's wedding dress. He once designed women's clothes as a sideline to his commercial photography but they did not sell.

Associates of Norman Hartnell, one of the queen's dressmakers, visited Clarence House yesterday but the purpose of the visit was not revealed and they refused to comment on the report.

DOISE, March 9 (AP)—Thirty-seven separate changes on various federal and state highway speed and load restrictions to take effect this week were announced by the department of highways today.

The changes were generally due to weather conditions in the state and are put in force annually on the last winter.

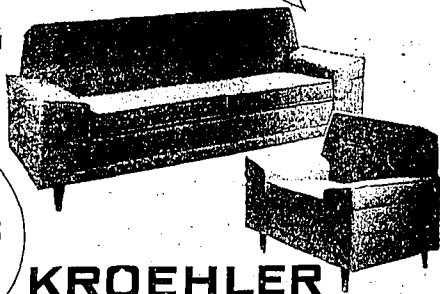
