Ellis Stops Khrushchev's Trip Into France; Visit Set for Later in Month

PARIS, March 14 (UPI)—Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev, recovering from the flu which forced him to postpone the French visit scheduled for tomorrow, will visit France from March 23 until April 3, it was announced today. The Soviet news agency Tass reported the new date for the visit shortly after Soviet Ambassador Sergei Vinogradov gave the French government reassuring word from the Kremlin on the illness of the Soviet leader.

Benson as Candidate Asked to Resign Post

BOISE, March 14 (AP)—Attorney General Frank L. Benson called today for resignation of the attorney general to a campaign to be elected United States senator. Benson declined comment. He refused to say whether he had any plans to resign or to resign. The demand for Benson's resignation was made by Compton A. White, Clark Fork, who, like Benson, is a candidate for the Democratic nomination for the senate seat now held by Republican Henry Dworshak, who is expected to seek reelection. "I feel," White said, "that the attorney general, being a duly elected official of the state of Idaho, and having accepted and taken the oath of office for that position, should continue to serve the people of the state of Idaho."

Another Snowstorm Heads for Midwest

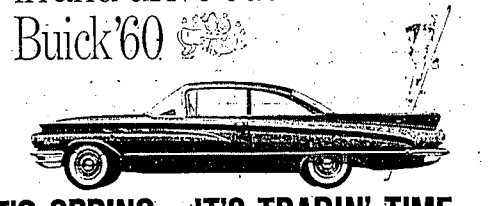

West Hurries Summit Plan; Russia Rests

By JAMES MALLOW
WASHINGTON, March 14 (AP)—Soviet preparations for the summit conference are like a rest cure, compared with what the allies have to see them or a portion of them when he stands up, why let him know those indoor fits known as calisthenics as often as he wants to.

Latest example is the visit here by West Germany's chancellor, the 64-year-old Konrad Adenauer who visits President Eisenhower tomorrow.
Talks Are Numerous
This past week-end British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan visited French President Charles de Gaulle to talk about the summit. Later De Gaulle visits Berlin and then comes to see Eisenhower. The summit meeting starts in Paris, May 16.
More than 15 months ago Premier Nikita Khrushchev began pushing the allies toward this summit conference by demanding they get their troops out of West Berlin which, although 100 miles inside communist East Germany, is linked with the West.

How Know Goal
The Soviets know what they want! They want West Berlin pushed into the communist world, they want to stop West Germany from rearming, and they want the permanent division of West and East Germany.
Adenauer and his West German don't want their western allies to agree to any of those things. Adenauer doesn't want the West to make any soft concessions, either.
Only one thing about the summit seems clear at this moment. Between now and May 16 both talk and tension will increase as the allies wrestle with one another and Khrushchev throws some broken glass into the ring.

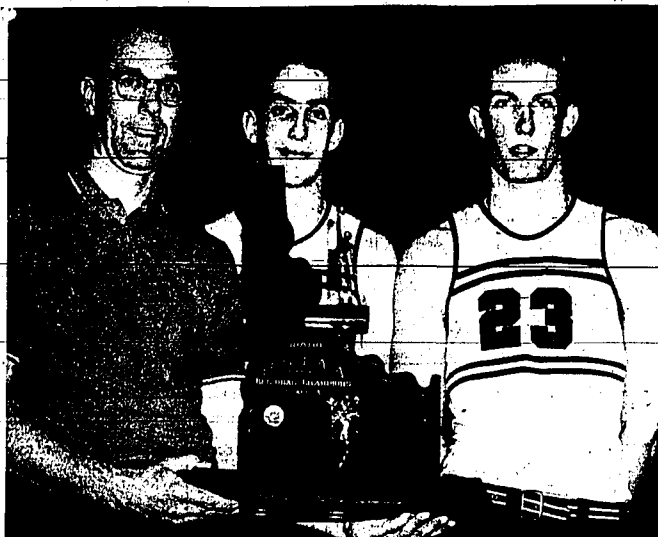
